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SPECIFICATION

WORK TO BE DONE IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

IMMEDIATE REPAIRS, GENERAL DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS.

1-Immediately after the ensuing Assizes the surface is to be cleaned, holes and ruts filled with good material, stagnant water drained off, dangerous holes and grips fenced, the road made safe and convenient for traffic within one month, and afterwards repaired as specified from time to time, or continuously, as may be necessary, and maintained constantly in good order during the contract, clean, hard, and even, at all seasons.

2-No notice of inspection will be given but the County Surveyor expects the road

to be in good order and repair at any time he or his assistant may visit it.

3-The Grand Jury shall have the power of cancelling the contract at any Assizes should the County Surveyor report that the road has not been kept in a satisfactory

4-The Contractor is to procure a copy of this Specification, and produce it when

required by the County Surveyor or his assistant.

5-All the work herein specified is to be executed in a judicious, effective, and workmanlike manner in every particular necessary for the repair, constant maintenance in good order, and improvement of the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this Specification, and to the entire satisfaction of the County Surveyor.

6-In addition to the provisions of this Specification the Contractor is at once to

carry into effect any instructions of the County Surveyor or his assistant.

WIDTH OF WORKING WAY.

7.—The width of the working way of the road shall be equal to the present width; but in no case less than 13 feet, except where walls, fences or grips interfere. The width to be extended or reduced as the County Surveyor may direct. In towns or villages the metalled surface is to extend to the paved channels, footpaths, fences or buildings, as the case may be, and over all open spaces.

MARGINS AND SIDES.

8-The margins to be formed of sods and clay, at least two feet wide and four inches high over the watertables. These margins to be neatly kept, edged with spade and line, and the working way defined by parallel lines, straight or regularly curved, according to the course of the road.

Where the sides are ravelled or broken, they are to be made up with stones, sods,

The sides are also to be kept clear of all bushes, brambles, weeds, rubbish, loose

The Contractor is to cut down and remove before seed time all weeds growing on the

roadsides and fences.

9-All water-tables, side cuts, pipe holes, outlets, side, back, and catch drains, water courses, &c., to be kept, at all times, clear of mud, grass, weeds, or other obstructions to the free discharge of the water, and new ones made where necessary.

FRENCH DRAINS.

10-Where springs or soft places occur in the road, French Drains shall be made to drain off the water to the nearest outfall.

11—Gullets to be opened up, cleaned out and repaired when required, and the channels through all bridges and gullets, and for such distances as may be necessary above and below the same, are to be cleared and kept clear.

12—This drainage and the edging above described in No. 8 to be thoroughly done three times a year—in February, April, and October, and at all other times as may be required.

be required.

WASTE STUFF.

13-All scrapings and other road stuff to be used for levelling hollows in the sides, filling grips, repairing fences, &c. Any surplus stuff not so required shall become the property of the contractor, and be removed by him forthwith, as well as any accumulation of mud, &c., that may be on the roadsides at the commencement of the contract. Road stuff on no account to be thrown on the margins.

MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF SURFACE.

14-The roadway and water-tables shall be scraped, swept and cleaned, so as to be

at all times free from mud and dirt, especially before spreading stones. 15-The surface of the working way is to have a rounding of one inch per yard of width; but on hills this rounding must be greater. Where the road has not at present this form it must be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and re-forming the surface. 16-The surface is to be made even by picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and ine-

All stones appearing over the surface of more than 21 inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes at once carefully filled with fine metalling.

APPLICATION OF MATERIALS.

17-Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be covered with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen

They are to be spread at short intervals alternately on each side of the centre line of

the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 3 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road. In no case will drills or small patches be allowed.

The patches to be kept raked in and blinded when necessary.

Before spreading the materials the old surface to be picked and loosened to the depth of half an inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may unite

18-Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gullets and the arch-

stones of bridges well covered with metal.

LOOSE AND OVER-SIZED STONES.

19-The surface shall at all times be kept free from loose stones which must be kept picked off by the contractor: also any stones larger than the specified size. TIME FOR SPREADING

20-One-third of the yearly supply of stones for the road to be spread before 1st December; two-thirds before 1st February, and all before Spring Assizes in each year.

QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

21-The stones to be the hardest and toughest procurable within three miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and to be free from clay, sand, or other extraneous matter.

QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.

cubic yards or more if required, a 22-The contractor is to supply annually sufficient quantity of broken stones, for the proper maintenance of the road. This quantity to be laid down in equal heaps, dressed for measurement, along the sides of the road, on carefully prepared level floors, before 1st October in each year of the contract. The heaps to be outside the working way.

EXTRA MATERIALS.

23-In addition to the annual quantity as above, such extra materials must be provided and spread as may be required to fulfil the conditions of the contract for constantly keeping the surface in good repair during the whole term of the contract.

FOOTPATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GRATINGS, ETC.

24-The footpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and

maintained as follows :-

If curbed with stone, all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled or broken to be resodded. Grass on both sides of path to be neatly edged three times a year. Clean out and repair all existing outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year-in February and October-and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from clay, dirt, and stones over 3-inch diameter.

Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of 11 inch per yard

towards the road.

25-All flagged or paved paths and channels to be repaired and kept in repair. All gratings where broken, disturbed, or removed, to be repaired, re-set or renewed. COUNTY WORKS.

26-Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the first half-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

INJURIES, OBSTRUCTIONS, ENCROACHMENTS, TREES, HEDGES, ETC.

27-All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment or trespass. The contractor shall require the owners to prune and lop all injurious or obstructive hedges and trees, and shall proceed summarily against all offenders in accordance with the provisions of the Acts relative to such offences, especially 14 & 15 Vic., cap 92, secs 9 & 10, and 19 & 20 Vic, cap 63, sec 18.

SURPLUS MATERIAL.

28-Any broken stones or gravel found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the county.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to report to your Board that I have audited the Accounts of the Grand Jury of the County of Wicklow, following last Summer Assizes, and to transmit the account duly declared and certified.

Mr Boothman, Collector for the Barony of Lower Talbotstown, received his Collection Warrant on the 19th May, but made no lodgment with the Treasurer until the 15th July, when he lodged £666. He made a second and final lodgment, amounting to £422 12s 2d, on the 27th of July, the eve of the Assizes.

The Order in Council requires Collectors "to lodge all money collected by them at intervals not longer than one fortnight or whenever the sum shall amount to £100," but from beginning to end the dates on which Mr Boothman received payment have been systematically omitted from his block receipts, so that the latter afford no means of ascertaining the length of time he has retained moneys in his hands and the amounts so retained. It is, however, evident from the number of receipts issued that the Order in Council has been utterly disregarded by this collector, who, in that respect, appears to have deliberately adopted similar practices to those for which his predecessor's services were dispensed with.

Of course the lodgment of moneys collected by a collector in a bank to his own account is no more a compliance with the Order in Council than if he retained the money in his pocket.

When the next contract for county printing is about to be taken it would be well to have it arranged that the Receipts and Blocks be numbered consecutively in type as I pointed out in a previous report.

The only Collectors who attended the audit were Mr Thomas Douglas

PUBLIC ANALYST'S REPORT.

I beg leave to report that I have made the following analyses

during the half-year ended on the 31st December, 1887 :-

August 3rd-On this date two specimens of tea were received from the guardians of Baltinglass Union; both were pure, but one of them was much superior in quality and strength to the other. On the same, two samples of milk were received from this Board; one was found to be adulterated with 16 per cent. of water, and the other with 25 per cent.

9th August-The viscera of a sheep received from Mr Newton, J.P.,

Rathdrum, were not found to contain poison.

23rd August-A specimen of milk received from the guardians of Baltinglass Union was found to be very poor, and appeared to be "fore" milk or slightly skimmed milk.

September 1st-Stomach of a horse received on this date from Mr

W Parker, Shillelagh, was not found to contain poison.

8th September-Two specimens of milk received on this day from the guardians of Baltinglass Union were found to be adulterated with 14 and 17 per cent. of water, respectively.

The total number of analyses made in 1887 was 27. Of the food

specimens analysed 7 were adulterated.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW,

Assembled at Spring Assizes, 1888.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The applications for presentments set forth in the Schedule before you are nearly all for the ordinary works of maintenance, improvement and repair. No presentments are sought for the repairs of roads not hitherto maintained by the county, and the only works to which I need direct your attention are the following:—

Rathdown, No. 8, to build a protecting wall in Greystones, £49 (half on County at Large, the proprietor to contribute half of barony moiety). This is a short length of sea wall on the Cliff-road, Greystones, to replace a wall of rough timber put there six years ago by magistrates' order to close a breach caused by an inroad of the sea. It is a necessary work if the road is to be kept open.

Rathdown, No. 9, to divert a watercourse at Ballyorney, £57. This is to divert the river course from the public road in three places where it has cut its way so close to the road as to threaten its safety. If now done future heavy expense will be avoided. A similar work in the same locality was carried out last year with the best results.

South Ballinacor, No. 14, and Lower Talbotstown, No. 4. These are applications for curbed footpaths in Tinahely and Dunlavin, respectively, which will be great improvements to these towns.

Upper Talbotstown, No. 13. Double gullet at Coan, £25. This is to replace a decayed timber structure and is necessary for the public safety.

Since last Assizes many useful works have been carried out. I may mention the following:—

A new iron, brick and stone bridge instead of a decayed timber structure at Ballymaghroe, South Ballinacor.

A new iron, brick and stone bridge instead of a dangerous timber one at Tomanieran in same barony. This work was given in charge to me to carry out by the last Grand Jury as there were no tenders for the work. I have built it for the sum allowed.

A new three-ope culvert over a former ford at Newtown, barony of Upper Talbotstown.

The repair of Aughrim bridge on which the sum of £50, given into my charge, has been expended to the best advantage.

The work at Wicklow bridge has progressed but slowly; however the whole of the piling, part of the filling, part of the rough apron and the paving of three arches out of the six to be done have been completed.

Several important retaining walls, bridge repairs, &c., have also been carried out in a substantial manner in various localities.

The heating apparatus of Mr. Grundy, which necessitated a new flue from basement to roof of Court House, has been supplied for warming the Crown Court. The cost of the whole was under the amount of the presentment of £60 made for the purpose.

The Corporation of Dublin, having for a number of years maintained the roads in the neighbourhood of the water works altered by them in the construction of these works, made applications at the last Road Sessions for Newcastle and North Ballinacor to free them from this charge.

Both Sessions rejected the applications as the liability of the county to maintain these roads was not proved. From a recent interview with the Dublin Borough Surveyor, I am led to understand that the applications will not be renewed.

I have frequent applications from Sanitary Authorities to make new sewers and to repair and cleanse existing ones. These are not county duties as the repair and maintenance of all existing sewers and the construction of new ones are vested in the Sanitary Authorities by the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878. I can only account for these applications by a perhaps natural desire to place the expense on a whole barony instead of an Electoral Division or Sanitary District.

I think it worthy of note that since last Assizes I am not aware of a single sudden damage order having been made, whereas they were formerly very frequent in this county. This would seem to prove that the county bridges, culverts, walls, &c., are gradually being brought into good repair by the more satisfactory process of application and regular contract made at Road Sessions.

It also goes to prove that many matters for which formerly these orders were granted are now done by the contractors as part of their specified work.

I may here note that very useful work is now being done, particularly in Lower Talbotstown, by the removal of boulders projecting from the road surface. Special presentments were formally granted for such work; but it is now included in the conditions of the ordinary maintenance contract.

The measurement last October of the annual supplies of materials for the metalling of the roads gave by far the best results yet obtained, and I have the satisfaction of reporting that your roads continue to improve and that with few exceptions they are rapidly approaching their proper cross section and condition.

It is only fair to state that this desirable condition of affairs is largely due to the able support I am receiving from my assistants.

I have to report that Mr Edge, who for many years was one of the assistant surveyors, died suddenly in September last. A vacancy having thus arisen I appointed Mr J. J. O. Ramsay, who is well qualified, to fill it. Mr Ramsay is stationed in Rathdrum in charge of the district previously surveyed by Mr Edge and since his appointment has discharged his duties to my entire satisfaction.

I have in conclusion to ask you to sanction the further appointment of Mr Ramsay, either permanently or, if you object to this, for at all events another year. My reasons for this request have been given in several previous reports and from the great improvement in the condition of your county roads and works, the result of proper supervision, I venture to think that this Grand Jury will hesitate before they reduce the number of assistants that the county has now had for four years and so deprive it of the means of maintaining and increasing this improve-

ment which can only be secured by adequate supervision.

I beg to submit a separate report on an application, intended to be made to you, for a presentment to extend the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway to Poulaphuca, also a report on the authorized line of steam tramway now in course of construction to Blessington.

DUBLIN AND BLESSINGTON STEAM TRAMWAY. COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW,

Assembled at Spring Assizes, 1888.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

In compliance with the 35th clause of the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway Order, 1887, I beg to submit the following report upon this undertaking as far as this county is concerned, my inspection for this purpose having been made on 10th inst.

The construction of this tramway commenced in this county about

the middle of October last.

It is generally speaking in accordance with my report to the Grand

Jury at Summer Assizes, 1884, and is as follows-

The west side of the road or that opposite the footpath, which chiefly consisted of a waste strip or grass margin, has been levelled and formed for a width of about 11 feet. A minimum breadth of 18 feet of carriage way has or will be left between the tramway and the opposite footpath. Upon

this formation are laid the ballast, sleepers and rails.

The gauge is about 5 feet 21 inches. The permanent way consists of steel Vignoles' or flat footed rails weighing 50 lbs. per lineal yard, laid on cross sleepers of creosoted Baltic timber, grooved to take the rails, spaced 3 feet 1 inch apart, centre to centre, except at the joints where they are only 2 feet 3 inches apart, centre to centre. The rails are rolled in 30 feet lengths, so that there are 10 sleepers under each rail. The joint sleepers are rectangular in section 9 feet long by 8 inches by 4 inches. The intermediate sleepers are half round 9 feet long by 9 inches by 41 inches. The rails bear on sole plates over the joint sleepers and are secured to the sleepers by six 5-inch fang bolts, two at each joint sleeper and two at intermediate sleepers, and to each of the remaining sleepers by two 1/2 inch square dog spikes. The rails are fished together by flanged fish plates secured by four 5-inch bolts and nuts. My recommendation to increase the weight of the rail has been adopted, that laid down being 5 lbs. per yard heavier than that contemplated; but the sleeper distance has been increased from 2 feet 9½

inches, as proposed, to 3 feet 1 inch which practically neutralizes the

advantages of the heavier rail.

The rails and sleepers of the tramway are laid throughout, and their fastenings nearly completed, from the county bounds at Brittas to its termination, with the exception of about 24 chains through Blessington street where the rails are to be laid flush with the road surface so that the ordinary traffic can pass over them. This portion should be laid as recommended in my preliminary report on the tramway—that is, a guard rail should be placed alongside the ordinary rail and the space between the rails and for 18 inches outside them should be paved over a bed of concrete. If this portion be laid in same way as similar places in the county Dublin I do not think the result will be satisfactory.

At road junctions, entrances to farms, houses, etc., a piece of oak or elm bolted to the sleepers on each side of each rail will probably suffice. At these crossings, of which there are 35 in all, the average height of the rails over the adjoining road surface is at present 5 inches, varying from 14 inches over it to being flush with it. At several places the rail is 12 inches

over the road, at others 9 inches, at others 6 inches and so on.

This inconvenience has naturally given rise to complaints from occupiers and is most injurious to the county road, owing to the crossings, being raised to rail level with gravel, tailing out too far on the road and unduly encroaching on it. The remedy for this is to lower the tramway so that at all these crossings the rails shall be level with the road surface or nearly so. In most cases this would considerably improve the gradients of the tramway at these places. Generally speaking the formation for the tramway should have been obtained by sinking instead of merely levelling the road side as has been done. By this means the necessary depth of 9 inches of ballast under the sleepers could have been obtained without unduly raising the level of the rails over the road.

As it is most desirable to have the carriage way as wide as possible, I think it would be a great improvement to move the tramway nearer to the road fence in several places, notably for a distance of about 35 chains south

from Tinode entrance gate.

At Tinode and Holyvalley two very sharp curves could be avoided by taking advantage of the powers of deviation from the road at these places.

I consider it essential that the tramway should be curbed throughout, and that the curbing should be of much better description than that in county Dublin which is of very inferior quality and of insufficient dimensions No curbing has as yet been delivered or set in this county.

The tramway has been carried across the places hitherto used as storage room for road materials; but in direct breach of the 30th Clause of the Order in Council equivalent depots have not yet been constructed. This is a most serious matter as there are now no proper places in which to store the annual supply of materials.

The Company has also directly violated clauses 14 and 15 of their Order in Council by the following proceeding. For three miles in length of the road the grass margin has been stripped from between the carriage way and the footpath on the east side of the road, leaving the soft unmetalled surface in a rough, unsightly and dangerous condition. This was done in October last; but although I have called on them to properly form and metal this part of the road, I have hitherto had nothing but promises that it will be done.

Two tramway engines and four open goods wagons have been de-

livered on the county Dublin portion of the line, from the Falcon Engine

and Car Works, Loughborougb.

I have examined one of these engines which is on the line at Brittas. It is on two pairs of coupled wheels 2 feet 6 inches in diameter, with a wheel base of 5 feet. It has a locomotive boiler. The cylinders, which are inside the frames, are 9 inches diameter and 14 inches stroke. It is fitted with powerful brakes. All the mechanism is shut in from below and so kept free from dust and dirt. The sides and ends are also covered in and there is an air condenser on top. It is stated that its weight in working order with coal and water is 9% tons, that the working pressure is 175 lbs. per square inch and that it is capable of taking a load of 32 tons (in addition to itself) up an incline of 1 inch 30 at a speed of 10 miles per hour.

The engine on the whole appears rather complicated; but much of this complication is due to the Board of Trade rules which are very stringent.

I hope it will not be found too light.

I beg to call your attention to Clause 34 of the Order in Council by which it becomes your duty at these Assizes to appoint an Auditor for the purpose of auditing once in each year the accounts of the undertaking.

In accordance with the Order in Council of 5th July, 1884, I obtained the Lord Lieutenant's sanction to appoint an assistant to aid me in the supervision of the construction of this tramway and accordingly appointed Mr. Francis Irwin, the county Assistant in that district. His remuneration the same authority has informed me is to be paid by the county, so that I have to request that you will be good enough to cause a presentment to be made for the amount which is £13 13s 0d to this date.

In conclusion I would ask, as the county interests are so largely involved in the matter of this tramway, that you should authorize me, if occasion require, to seek the aid of your solicitor.

The action of the Newcastle and North Ballinacor Road Sessions, with regard to the Dublin Corporation, appears to have been attended with most satisfactory results.

The paragraph concerning applications for sanitary improvements

being so self evident requires no remarks from us.

The fact of their being no sudden damage orders since last assizes

is most satisfactory.

The removal of boulders being included in the conditions of the ordinary maintenance contracts is attended with the best results. Owing to the death of Mr Edge, we recommend that the appointment of Mr Ramsay as a temporary assistant surveyor, be approved of for one year, at the usual remuneration.

The report on the tramway is so exhaustive and clear as to call for no particular remarks from us, and we strongly recommend that the suggestions therein contained receive the strongest support from the Grand Jury, and we particularly direct attention to the remarks as to road junctions, entrances to farm-houses, &c., the curbing, stone depots, and the metalling of the space where grass margin was. And we further call your attention to the presentment which must be passed for the amount of remuneration to be paid to the assistant surveyor for his services in the supervision of the construction of the tramway as directed by letter of the Lord Lieutenant of 20th October, 1887.

We further recommend a standing committee of the Grand Jury be appointed, to whom the County Surveyor may refer in case he requires

legal assistance.

The amount required for the existing contracts are correct.

No 33, Barony of Newcastle, is struck out, a new contract having

been entered into.

We, the Committee appointed to examine the accounts of the High Constables, beg to report to the Grand Jury that we have carefully gone through the statements of arrears sworn by High Constables to be irrecover. able, and are of opinion as follows-The names of the High Constables examined and statement sworn to as irrecoverable arrears are as follows: William Boothman, 9s. 6d.; Edward Storey, £10 3s. 5d.; Thos. Douglas. £16 2s 2d.; Richard Appleby, £2 9s. 8d.; Richard Fenton, no arrears.

We thought it necessary to ask the opinion of the Solicitor to the Grand Jury as to whether certain items were justly entered in the accounts as "irrecoverable," and his opinion is that they are. The items alluded to are vacant houses.

THE CORONERS' ACCOUNTS .- We beg to report that we found the accounts of Mr Jones' correct, £22 16s.

We also found the correct balance due to Mr Newton as stated-£13 12s 6d add £1 1s=£14 13s 6d. We deducted from his charges the sum of £1 1s paid to Dr Bleakley for attending to give evidence at an intended inquest at Ballyknockan, on the body of Mrs Julia Loughlin, as no inquest was held for the reasons given by the Coroner. We thought that we could not legally, as a committee, pass that item; but, as Coroner Newton has paid the amount, we recommend the Grand Jury to allow it to him if it can legally be done.

SUB-SHERIFF'S ACCOUNTS .- With regard to the Sub-Sheriff's account for printing, &c., we find the correct sum to be paid to him to be £11 16s. It is satisfactory to find by his letter that the sum of £4 3s of his account has been paid from another source, which has reduced the account to that above stated.

Report of Committee on Industrial Schools, Infirmary and Fever Hospitals.

The Committee on Reformatory and Industrial Schools have checked the accounts and committals, suggest that the presentments for these be divided and entered in the abstract under their respective headings.

The presentments are for the maintenance of 7 children in Reformatories and 67 in Industrial Schools. They amount to £205 17s 11d.

If the Managers of the Schools would use the new form (see Artane No 75) wherein the date of committal, the place whence committed by whom, and the period of detention are all entered, and add age at time of committal, it would be much more satisfactory.

We suggest that No 77 be paid at the rate of 2s instead of 2s 6d. according to the former resolutions of the Grand Jury, and that the Secretary be requested to communicate with the Managers of Nos. 77 and 78, in order that the committee may enter into an agreement with them as required by the statute; and that a list of all the schools who have entered into an agreement with the Grand Jury be sent to the Clerks of Petty Sessions with a memorandum that the Grand Jury will not in future allow any presentment for the maintenance of a child in any school not on that list.

No. 36 .- Wicklow Fever Hospital.

Owing to errors in previous balances having been overlooked for the last three presentment sessions, the accounts as lately presented were wrong, and were properly not passed, but the error is really a mere clerical one, and we cannot recommend, accordingly, this presentment to be reinstated this assizes, but we would allow it to be brought up again at the next presentment sessions, and that, if passed, the presentment to be marked "to be paid now," as otherwise there will be no funds.

We examined the Infirmary and Fever Hospital accounts and found them correct; the surgeon's salary is also correct.
