A communication from your Clerk containing an order made by your Board at the last meeting that I should tak e the Matron's place in her absence has surprised me very much. In the first instance I would like to know when did I refuse to take her place inn her absence; if such a statement has been made it is an absolute falsehood. It is, I am sure, within the memory of the Guardians that I very ably and voluntarily assisted the Matron since she came to the Institution. As friction was mentioned at your last meeting I feel called upon in justice to mysely to say that I have always avoided anything that would tend to cause friction often bearing for with petty annoyances which for the sake of harmony I overlooked. In comfirmation of this statement I beg to place a few incidents before your meeting, considering this the more honourable way of making complaints. The Matron frequently takes the attendant out of my apartments at times when I most need her services, viz. in the morning, and when she is preparing my dinner, but I note she never takes her own or any other officer's attendant at these particular times. When I remon-Strated with her she informed me"that she can do as she likes". I have no objection to any nomination she makes, but I do object to her imparting this information's prematurely to the inmates, thereby giving them a taunt which I have heard them use freely for the past month. These are a few of the different ways adopted of late by the Matron to introduce friction; other incidents of a similar naturem I was compelled to bring under the Master's notice, requesting him to ask Miss Clarke to cease such Detty ways of causing annoyance. From a report of your last meeting I learn the Matron is on duty from six in the morning until nine at night. Comment on this would be unnecessary, as she has been out of the house as early as from two or three in the afternoon. It also appeared that I have only four children to instruct, whereas I have 22 on the rolls, of whom I take entire charge, my duties not ending with them until seven p.m.. Th us I am enabled to have about two hours off duty every day. I may add that in addition to the above duties I have the Male side of the house scrubbed every week for the Matron. I have discharged the duties of both Matron and Schoolmistress on several occasions without any assistance, and I cannot say that the dual position taxed my energies to the extent of fifteen hours per day, and everything was done satisfactorily and without friction or complaint or any kind quarter. And, now, gentlemen, I don't consider it fair to me, after nearly eighteen years' efficient service, to be required to do extra duty; but I am conflident when you understand matters more clearly, knowing that my hands are already full, and in consideration of my failing health, you will not deem it just to enforce your order.

BAI O Nicklow County Archives The following Letters and other Communications were read by the Clerk, and orders were made on them respectively, as follows:—

Read letter dated June 5th, 1914, from Messrs J H McCarroll & Co., solicitors, Wicklow, replying to a letter from the Clerk of the Union on the subject of the rent of the Newtown Dispensary building. The law on the point was, the writers stated, as follows:— Where premises are held under a lease which expires and after the expiration thereof the lessee remains on in possession he is deemed after payment of rent to have become a yearly tenant. Consequently m the Guardians would be yearly tenants of Mrs Stamper, and Mr Stamper would have no right to feceive the rent direct from the Guardaians. If Mr Stamper, however, is actually the owner of the premises the proper course to adopt would be to obtain a new lease from him with the concurrence of Mrs Stamper. In their opinion the Guardians would be quite right in making the payment to Mrs Stamper.

PROFEST- Read letter from Mr H C Stamper, dated June 3rd 1914, stating that he should be glad to hear with regard to the rent of Newtown Dispensary.
