Proposed by Mr. Marrin Gawler, Vice Chairman, seconded by

RESOLVED,-That we, the Gundians of the Castlebar Poor-Law Union, desire to direct the attention of the Right Honourable the Chief Secretary for Ireland, to the fact, that in a considerable number of Unions in this country, the duty of the preparation of the Parliamentary Voters and Jurors' Lists has been transferred by the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, to Secretaries of County Councils.

That duty can be satisfactorily done only by the Clerks of Unions, who have all the requisite local knowledge at their disposal to enable them to properly perform the work. That the section of Clerks most particularly affected by the operation of the Act in this respect, are Officers upon whom has devolved an amount of work and responsibility condition every way to that borne by the more fortunate Clerks who were "existing Officers" at the passing of the Act. That as the cost of the preparation of the Parliamentary Voters and Jurors Lists, though paid by the County Councils, is eventually levied off the Unions concerned, we think it would be only just and equitable that this work should be re-transferred to the Clerks of the said Unions. That such re-transference would be a merited addition to the ramuneration of the Officers who have been so injuriously affected by the operation of the Act, without the Guardians having wimpose any extra burthen on the rates.

That we cannot but view as unwise and unfair, from the standpoint of efficient and careful work, the centralization in the COUNTY Councils' Offices of the preparation of the Farliamentary Voters and Jurors' Lists, for the whole of this large County of Mayo, as well as for the Counties in Ireland. That the result of this centralization will be to enormously increase the yearly salaries of the already well paid County Secretaries (an increase of over £600 per year in May cone), and to greatly lessen those of the Clerks of

Unions—very capable and hard-working officials—who have been appointed since the passing of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, and who may in future be approinted.

We, therefore trust, that the theory of vastly increasing the emoluments of one Office in a County, to the impoverishment of all the other Offices under the Local Government Board in the same County, may be reconsidered and reversed. County, may be reconsidered and reversed.

That, therefore, considering the justice of our request, we respectfully call upon the Chief Secretary to take steps to have the law amended, so that this duty shall be re-transferred to all

Clerks of Unions irrespectively.

That copies of this Resolution be sent to the Right Honourable the Chief Secretary, and our County Members; and also to each Board of Guardians in Ireland, with the request that the said Boards may baged enough to adopt it in justice to their Office
