miles N.E. of Arklow, the principal Market Town. Bounded on the N.E. by Dunganstown; N.W. by Redcross; South and S.W. by Kilbride Parishes and E. by St. Georges Channel.

Part of this Pa. is attached to the perpetual curacy of Redcross and part to the Union of Kilbride.

Contains 3214 acres 9.200 pers. of which about the one fourth is uncultivated. Formerly in the Union of Arklow and Diocese of Dublin. The ~~Tithes~~ Tithes were compounded for £110 per annum and were payable to the Revd. Lambert Bagley Rector of the Parish. The Arch Bishop of Dublin is patron of the Living. There is no place of 3 worship in this parish, no schools nor any charitable institutions.

The Shape of the Parish is irregular, its length from E. to West is three and three fourths of a mile and mean breadth from N. to S. about one and a half miles. The surface is ~~fiata~~ flat except in the S.W. where the hills of Ballymoyle and Ballynesky rise rather abruptly to the height of 900 feet above the sea, no other part of the Parish being above 80 feet above the sea. The general appearance of the Parish is unvaried. Roads conveniently numerous and in pretty good repair, the principal of which is the road leading from Arklow to Dublin, which enters the parish in the central South and passing through the central part of the Parish in ~~an~~ a N.N.E. direction for two and a quarter miles, leaves it in the central North. There are several small streams passing through the Parish, the principal of which is one which meets the Parish in the N.W. extremity and runs along the Boundary in a S.E. direction for one and a quarter miles, when it leaves the mereing entering the interior of the Parish, continuing in the same direction for four and a half chains to Scratenagh Bridge on the road leading from Arklow to Dublin; at a short distance from this Bridge it changes its direction Southward curving ~~from~~ for about one mile to Pennycomequick Bridge, thence it glides through the Sand Hills till it empties itself into the sea.

The houses are pretty numerous, generally stone and 1 4 in small clusters, the largest of which is called Ordinary Village in Ordinary Townland in the N.E. of the Parish. The only houses having any distinctive names are Kilpatrick in the N.W. and Buckronev in the central North. The antiquities are the ruin of Ennereilly Church in the South, a Raheen in the North, ^{and} another in the West. There are several mail Rts. interspersed throughout the Parish.

The Property of Mr. Carroll. Contains 478 acres 2 roods 22 pers. of which 82½ acres are uncultivated. Leases are for 21 years or one life. Rents from 30/- to 40/- per Irish Acre. Shape irregular, its greatest length from E. to W. is one and three eighths and mean breadth is about half a mile. St. Georges Channel forms the S.E. Boundary, a stream the N.E., a stream ~~xix~~ runs along the South Ry. a wall forms the S.W. and a portion of the North Ry. The Mail Coach road from Arklow to Dublin bisects this Tld. in the centre from North to South. Pennycomequick Bridge is on the Gl. R. Ry. A stream commences at a spring near the centre of this Townland, curving Eastward & running into the river, near the above mentioned Bdg. There are four ponds and a marl pit in the East and two in the central North, near the Ry.; a portion of the East part of this Tld. is uncultivated. Houses few mostly stone with roads conveniently numerous.
