These were the reasons which led to our delection of the sits we showed for the grayne,

A. We are therefore unable to recommend any modification of either plan on estimate, and of the protection of your foncolne is, as we believe it is, the first object of the scheme and if your expenditure is to be limited to £30,000 the conversion of the main poyne into a prem alongside of which ships can lie for trading purposes, must be postponed it, the last 200 feet which we proposed to make 30 feet wide, must be reduced

You inform me in your letter of the 9th February that maintenance of the works to be executed is guaranteed by the Urban Council of Wicklow, the Dublin and Wicklow, and Wexford Railway Company. I gather also from Mr. Shannon that the actual execution of any works necessary for maintenance will be carried out by the Railway Company, and it is important that they should do so, because in works of this kind time is everything, and being on the spot with the necessary men and materials at their disposal. the Railway Company can act far more rapidly and effectively, and therefore more economically than any other body. Under these circumstances a design of a less permanent and therefore less costly character than that which was pronosed by mr firm to the Wicklow Harbour Board is instifiable, the more especially as work of this nature, whatever be its design, can never be considered absolutely safe. I have therefore to advise that the design proposed by Mr. Shannon in his report to the Dublin, Wicklow, and Wexford Railway Company, dated 29th November, 1905, be sanctioned. The necessary works will, I understand from Mr. Shannon, be carried out by the Railway Company; through their own servants, i.e., without the intervention of a contractor. The representative of the third interest, the Dublin and Wicklow Manure Company, stated that his Company declined to increase their contribution by any annual payment for maintenance. The Manure Company's representative was asked by the other members of the Committee to request his directors to be good enough to reconsider that decision, which he promised to do. As to the proposed Agreement between the Commissioners of the Treasury and the Railway led I have read the draft which you send to me and can only say that I could not recommend the Treasury to accept a Cartract containing such a condition as No 2, that I should certainly decling for myself and my sum to have anything whatever to do with a contract containing such a clause, because a Contract with such a clause in it ceases to be a contract for a work, and becomes merely a contract to provide certain materials and deposit them in a particular place,

releives the Contractor of all the responsibility on which the success of a work depends and failing the good fortune that rarely attend folly leads to certain disaster physical on pecuniary or both. The clause is also underly favourable to the Contractor in respect to measurements and payments. I could not assent to be been responsible for the execution of any contract which was not drawn in the usual form in respect to the Contractors responsibility during and after construction. Had Parranged a Contract with Messrs Brand it would certainly have contained the usual clause on that point. If Messrs Brand had declined to accept it, which I have no reason to suppose they would have done, I should not have recommended you to enter into a Contract with them. It is possible that the Railway Company have no power to enter into such a contract, If so it would be imprudent to enter into any contract at all with them. Nor should I in such a case as this agree to the proposed arbitration clause H. I should require that I should be made as I usually am the Sole Arbiter in all questions or disputes arising out of the Contract. The course proposed will lead to nothing but disputes, delay, and heavy expense either in or to avoid arbitration. I return the papers you sent me as requested
