Like most the sporting clubs in Greystones we don't currently have the capacity to take new members unfortunately as we don't have enough courts. With the growth in population in Greystones Kilcoole Delgany and surrounding areas, there is a demand for sporting facilities and for clubs to provide and manage them. We would like to propose that this Local Area Plan consider


1. Providing sufficient active open space to allow sporting facilities and clubs the space to expand their services to the community

2. There is Council owned land beside the tennis club (see map below) which is zoned as open space. We would like the Council to consider rezoning tis to active open space and to note that should the Council want to sell this land, the Tennis Club would be very interested in talking with the Council on this. We do note Cllr Orla Finn and Marc Deveraux have been very facilitating in talking to us and explained that the land is open space at the moment but we feel there is opportunity to address the needs of the community for sporting and active open space, by rezoning to Active Open Space.

3. We are like other clubs are trying to encourage active travel to and from our club and would like to see other areas like Tesco and Donnybrook fair provide modern bicycle stands on the public footpaths near them and on their own property, to expand on the excellent work done throughout Greystones. As some of our members are living in Kilcoole, Delgany Kilquade we would like to see more safe active travel routes from these locations and bicycle stands at these locations like the Garden Village Kilquade, Kilcoole main street , Kilquade Church and Garden centre locations.
