In the N.W. part of Arklow Bar., Wicklow County half a mile East of Rathdrum, the principal Market Town; bounded on the N. by Kilcommon Pa. in Newcastle Bar.; E. by Dunganstown Pa.; W. by Rathdrum Par. and S. by Castle Mc Adam Pa. in Arklow Barony.

Contains 1431 acres 1 rood 39 pers. of which 44 acres are uncultivated. In the Diocese of Dublin forming part of the Union of Wicklow. The Parish is in two Baronies, viz. Newcastle & Arklow.

There is no place of worship in this Parish; no 3 schools; nor any funds for the relief of the poor. Shape oblong lying nearly E. & S.; its greatest length is two and a quarter miles, mean breadth one mile. Surface undulating being from 233 to 514 feet above the sea; it is lowest in the West along the River Avon-more. The appearance of the Parish is rather pleasing, being tolerably thickly planted all along the Western side; there are some patches of furze, marsh & reeky ground interspersed throughout it. Roads numerous and in good repair; the Mail Coach Rd. from Rathdrum to Rathnew meets the Parish in the N.W. angle and bounds it on the N. for one and a quarter miles, when it leaves the Parish. The River Avon-more meets the Pa. in the N.W. and forms its western boundary for two miles when it leaves in the S.W.; the bed of the river at half a mile from where it meets the Parish is 233 feet above the sea at low water. Houses few and poor generally built of a slaty stone (clay slate), which is raised in the Parish, of which there are a few quarries, but of a bad soft nature; the land is poor, being principally rocky & rough Pasture where not marsh. The only house having any distinctive name is Fair View Cottage in the N.E. The antiquities are Virgins Well in the South and 4 three ancient Forts in the N. centre and South.

County of Wicklow and all in the Barony of South Ballinacor. Bounded on the North by Hacketstown, Moyne & Prebawn Phases.; on the East by Kilpipe Psh.; on the South by Crosspatrick & Mullinacuff Pshes. & on the West by Mullinacuff and Co. Carlow.

This Psh. is in the County of Wicklow and Province of Leinster and contains -----; a great portion of which is uncultivated mountain land and bog. It is in the Diocese of Ferns & is a Rectory forming part of the Union and Prebend of Crosspatrick in the Cathedral of Ferns. The Church is a neat building half a mile from the town of Tinahely which is situated at the S.E. corner of the Psh. There are two R. C. Chapels in the Psh., one in Bridgeland T.Ld. and the other in the townland of Whitefield within a grave yard. A National School is in the Townland of 3 Ballycumber South. There are three corn mills in the Psh. one of which with a good flour mill adjoining are in Tinahely. The principal seats are Rockingham, the residence of the Revd. --- Barber; Ballybeg of the Revd. --- Simms; Ballyshonagh of R. Bates Esqre.; Town View of H. Norton Esqre. and Broomfield of J. Ebbs Esqre.; at Coolross are the ruins of a mansion which was commenced to be built by the Earl of Strafford before his attainder; they are vulgarly called "Black Tom's Cellars." The neat town of Tinahely is at the S.E. corner of the Psh. During the disturbances of 1798 the town was entirely destroyed but was soon afterwards rebuilt in an improved style; it is situated in a wild and mountainous district on the banks of a small stream. There is a neat market house with a clock which was erected by the late Earl Fitzwilliam.

Kilcommon Parish (contd.)

In a room over the market house is held a manorial court in April and petty sessions on alternate Wednesdays; Quarter Sessions are held in it. The Primitive Wesleyan Methodists hold their meetings also in this room. The town is a chief station for Police.
