## **ITEM NO. 1**

**To consider report in accordance with Section 179 of the Planning & Development Act 2000, as amended, Part 8 of the Planning & Development Regulations 2001 – 2006 as amended: Development of 106 residential units to include 70 no. houses, 36 no. duplex apartments and crèche (200sq.m) and associated site works at a site at Burgage More, Blessington, Co. Wicklow**

Mr. T. Sexton, Coady Architects gave a presentation covering the following areas:

Issues raised at Council meetings:

- Retain the existing earth mound/trees to Burgage More
- Clash of reversing cars onto Burgage More
- Keep the new social housing as a distinct development with a single entrance
- Crèche location generating traffic
- Appropriateness of a rural field boundary/ditch for a new housing development
- Change in character of the roadway and area from rural to urban
- Wonderful aspect to south east with high quality trees from adjacent field to the east
- Good quality and consistent tree-lined boundary to the south
- Good quality tree-lined boundary with strong visual connection to the east
- Junction to Burgage More Road changed by adjacent housing development
- Burgage More Road to the south, narrows at the site, with no space for pedestrians
- Trees along the Burgage More Road are very modest, no space for a footpath
- Key planning statistics
- TPS M Moran & Associates alternative layout
- Alternative option – no access from Burgage More, retain trees & hedgerow
- Burgage More Road boundary – minimum works required
- Proposed site plan – with parking, kerb line and tree planter modifications
