In the S.E. of Ballinacor South Barony, Wicklow County about nine ~~xx~~ S.W. of Rathdrum, the principal market town; bounded on the N., S. & E. by Kilpipe Parish and West by Moyne and Kilcommon Parishes.

Prebawn Parish (contd.)

Contains 4261 acres 3 rods 08 pers. of which about 834 acres are uncultivated. In Impropriate Curacy, Diocese of Ferns, Province of Dublin.

The shape of the Parish is regular and compact, inclining to circular, greatest length from N. to S. is three and one fourth of a mile and from E. to W. three miles; Surface gently undulating, being from 230 to 1160 feet above the sea at low water, the fall being from the N.W. towards the East and South; the North part of the Parish is unvaried in its appearance being nearly all uncultivated and having very few houses, roads or streams; the South is more pleasing and diversified there being some wooded patches and the houses and roads much more numerous than in the North; the Houses throughout the Parish are principally stone and in small clusters; there are two Corn Mills in the Parish, one in Prebawn T.Ld. in the centre of the Pa. the other in Ballinglen in the S.W. of the Parish; they grind for the farmers and have a good supply of water 10 months of the year. There is no town or Village in the Parish; Rathdrum which is the principal market Town is about nine miles N.N.E. of the nearest part of the Parish. The only Places of Worship are the Protestant Church which is in the centre of the Parish & a R.C. Chapel in the N.E. for description of which see pages 16 & 17. The only School is the Parochial School which is adjacent to the Church for which see p. 17 (MS.). The only houses having names are Tankersly in Tomcoyle Townland and Ballinglen in Ballinglen T.Land. There are no Antiquities.

Leases are for 21 years or one life; Rents 8/- to 10/- per Irish acre; shape triangular, greatest length from North to South is one and three-fourths of a mile & mean breadth three-fourths of a mile; a stream forms the West end and also runs along the North By.; a road enters this Tld. in the South running North, where it leaves the Tld. in the N.W. corner; a large portion of this Tld. is uncultivated; there are also several patches of planting in the Cd. West; Houses pretty numerous & all stone, with roads convenient.

South; near the By. on which, & in the vicinity of the mill is Ballinglen Bdg.; Ballinglen Ho. is also in the Central Sh.; the North part of this Townland is uncultivated; there are some planting also in the S.W. corner; Houses numerous, all stone; Prebawn Corn Mill near the By. of Prebawn Tld. is in the Cl. East side of this Tld.

By. and a road the North Do.; a stream also runs along the East & West By.; Tankersley House is in the East side with gardens & pleasure grounds & plantations, & variegated with walks &c. Prebawn Church is in the North part of this Tld. near the By.; there is also a large marsh in the South side; Houses few, all stone.

Ballinglen Corn Mills -- Called after the Townland 13

In the S.W. corner of Ballinglen Townland. There are two mills, one of which was burned in 1838 & has been repaired; each of them has two pair of stones, the diameter of the wheels are 14 feet, and the depth of the buckets one foot eight inches.

Ballinglen Bridge -- called after the Townland

In the S.W. corner of Ballinglen Townland in the vicinity of the mill. It is a Bridge of three arches with parapet walls, in good repair; on the By. between Drummin & Ballinglen Townlands.

Ballinglen House -- called after the Townland 14

In the South end of Ballinglen Townland. It is a two story slated House, in good repair.

Prebawn Bdg. -- called after the Townland

In the S.W. corner of Prebawn Townland. It is a small Bridge of one arch, on a coach road.

Prebawn Corn Mill -- called after the Tld. of Pre- 15
bawn adjoining it.

In the Cl. E. part of Ballinglen Townland near the East By.

It is the property of Mr. Blake, it is two story, slated & in good repair; the overshot wheel is 13 ft. 6 ins. in height, & 2 feet 2 ins. in breadth & depth of buckets 8 ins.; it has one pair of stones, 4½ feet in breadth, average quantity ground for farmers is 3,000 barrels per year; it has a good supply of water for ten months in the year.

Prebawn Church -- called after the Parish 16

In the North side of Tomcoyle Townland. Built in 1827 in good repair, would hold 150 persons, usual congregation 90 persons.

Prebawn School House -- called after the Parish

In the Ch. South part of Prebawn Townland, near the road, which forms the South By. It is a Parochial School, average attendants 31 males & 25 females, all protestants, it was built in the year 1813.

Kilballyowen R.C. Chapel -- called after the Townland 17

In the East extremity of Kilballyowen Townland. Built in 1862, will hold 700 persons, usual congregation 1,000.
