W. of the Parish; they grind for the farmers and have a good supply of water 10 months of the year. There is no town or Village in the Parish; Ratherum which is the principal " merket Town is about nine miles N.N.B. of the mearest part of the Parish. The only Places of Worship are the Protest. The only School is the Perochiel School which is adjacent to the Church for which see p. 17 (MS.). The only houses having names ate Tankersly in Tomcoyle Townland and Ballinglen in Ballinglen T.
