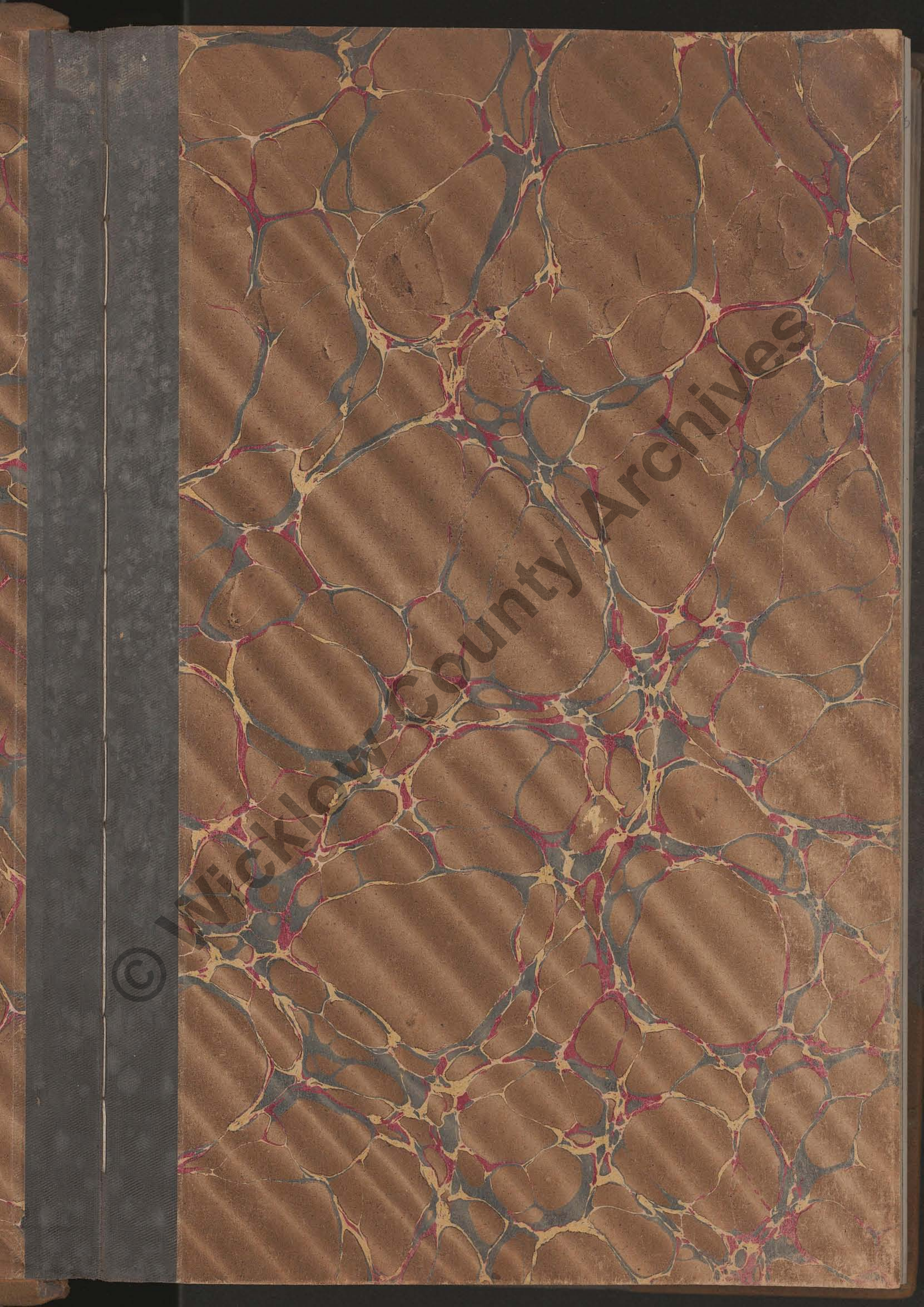

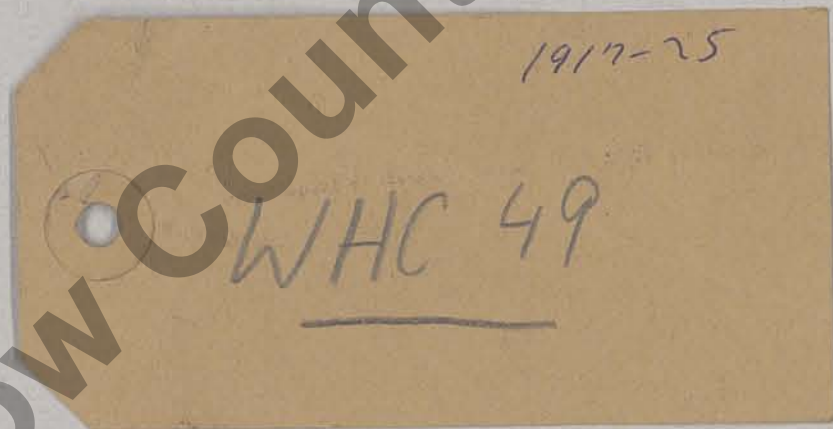

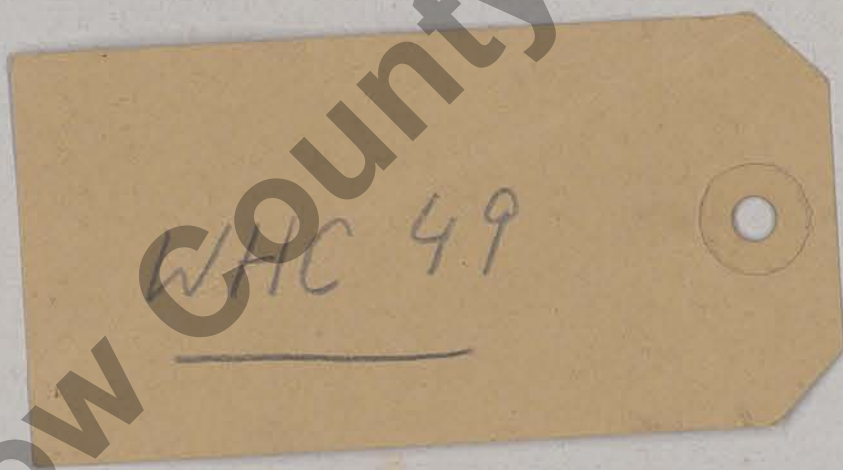

I sincerely hope that in the event of the work going on that a local Wicklow Contractor will secure the Contract.

It is absolutely no business of mine and I am certainly not going to dictate to your Council and I am only really interested as far as the Quay frontage to our stores and offices but I would venture to remark that in no part of the United Kingdom would quays be permitted to be used as a dumping ground for merchants goods for permanent storage like Wicklow - Here in Dublin after twenty four hours the Harbour Police would be at us to remove the goods or threaten legal proceedings.

14 July 1920

Your Committee consisting of Messrs J Nichols, Edward Byrne met this evening and inspected East Pier & South Quay

We recommend that a Main Pile of Oak be put down at North West Corner of East Pier 20 inches wide and that 2 whaling pieces of Oak 18 inches be also provided, and that the concrete and stone Coping be cut so as to let main pile lie against Corner of Pier
