

With respect to the financial condition of the Union Dr Machabe reports

The ordinary and unavoidable expenditure from the date of inspection to the close of the current financial year carnot fall short of £ 1200. and to meet this the asset available will not execut £ 300, celt the date of inspection outstanding Selean that the Gardins will be in debt about \$1,500 on the 99th September and probably to the extent of \$2000 before the new Kates are in course of Collection and lodgment. This is not a Satisfacts condition and the attention of the Guardians has repeatedly been dress to the insufficiency of the provision they made from year to year to mut the necessary expenditure of the Union.

Headly This subject has already been under the consideration of the Fuardians on a report from the Master respecting the impossibility of finding suitable persons in the Workhouse to act as assistants or wardsmaids in the Hospital Wards. He pointed out that except women of a class that it is not desirable thus to employ he had no females available for the duty;

Dr Macbale states that on the day of his inspection there were HO patients and It lunatics in the general hospital department, and the Board have to refer the Fundians to their letter of 27th march last and to request that the subject may receive their earnest and careful consideration,

With respect to the condition of the sick and infirm inmates of the Workhouse Dr Machabe reports that the patients in the forer Hospital are exposed to much avoidable suffering owing to the absence of window blinds and the Board reguest that the defect complained of may be remedied. It appears that pounting is much required both inside and out not having been done since 18 48; and the Board request that this matter may receive the prompt consideration of the Fuardians.
