#### SPECIFICATION

OF

WORK TO BE DONE IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

perches of the Road and Footpath,

and

IMMEDIATE REPAIRS, GENERAL DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS.

1—Immediately after the ensuing Assizes the surface is to be cleaned, holes and ruts filled with good material, stagnant water drained off, dangerous holes and grips fenced, the road made safe and convenient for traffic within one month, and afterwards repaired as specified from time to time, or continuously, as may be necessary, and maintained constantly in good order during the contract, clean, hard, and even, at all seasons.

2-No notice of inspection will be given but the County Surveyor expects the road

to be in good order and repair at any time he or his assistant may visit it.

3—The Grand Jury shall have the power of cancelling the contract at any Assizes should the County Surveyor report that the road has not been kept in a satisfactory manner.

4-The Contractor is to procure a copy of this Specification, and produce it when

required by the County Surveyor or his assistant.

5—All the work herein specified is to be executed in a judicious, effective, and work-manlike manner in every particular necessary for the repair, constant maintenance in good order, and improvement of the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this Specification, and to the entire satisfaction of the County Surveyor.

6-In addition to the provisions of this Specification the Contractor is at once to

carry into effect any instructions of the County Surveyor or his assistant.

WIDTH OF WORKING WAY.

7—The width of the working way of the road shall be equal to the present width; but in no case less than 13 feet, except where walls, fences or grips interfere. The width to be extended or reduced as the County Surveyor may direct. In towns or villages the metalled surface is to extend to the paved channels, footpaths, fences or buildings, as the case may be, and over all open spaces.

MARGINS AND SIDES.

8—The margins to be formed of sods and clay, at least two feet wide and four inches high over the watertables. These margins to be neatly kept, edged with spade and line, and the working way defined by parallel lines, straight or regularly curved, according to the course of the road.

Where the sides are ravelled or broken, they are to be made up with stones, sods,

and clay.

The sides are also to be kept clear of all bushes, brambles, weeds, rubbish, loose

The Contractor is to cut down and remove before seed time all weeds growing on the roadsides and fences.

DRAINAGE.

9—All water-tables, side cuts, pipe holes, outlets, side, back, and catch drains, water courses, &c., to be kept, at all times, clear of mud, grass, weeds, or other obstructions to the free discharge of the water, and new ones made where necessary.

EPENCH DRAINS.

10—Where springs or soft places occur in the road, French Drains shall be made to drain off the water to the nearest outfall.

GULLETS, ETC.

11—Gullets to be opened up, cleaned out and repaired when required, and the channels through all bridges and gullets, and for such distances as may be necessary above and below the same, are to be cleared and kept clear.

12-This drainage and the edging above described in No. 8 to be thoroughly done three times a year-in February, April, and October, and at all other times as may

be required.

WASTE STUFF.

13—All scrapings and other road stuff to be used for levelling hollows in the sides, filling grips, repairing fences, &c. Any surplus stuff not so required shall become the

property of the contractor, and be removed by him forthwith, as well as any accumulation of mud, &c., that may be on the roadsides at the commencement of the contract. Road stuff on no account to be thrown on the margins.

MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF SURFACE.

14-The roadway and water-tables shall be scraped, swept and cleaned, so as to be

at all times free from mud and dirt, especially before spreading stones.

15-The surface of the working way is to have a rounding of one inch per yard of width; but on hills this rounding must be greater. Where the road has not at present this form it must be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and

16-The surface is to be made even by picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and ine-

qualities.

All stones appearing over the surface of more than 21 inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes at once carefully filled with fine metalling.

APPLICATION OF MATERIALS.

17-Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be covered with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen

They are to be spread at short intervals alternately on each side of the centre line o

the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 3 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road. In no case will drills or small

The patches to be kept raked in and blinded when necessary.

Before spreading the materials the old surface to be picked and loosened to the depth of half au inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may unite

18-Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gullets and the arch-

stones of bridges well covered with metal.

LOOSE AND OVER-SIZED STONES.

19.-The surface shall at all times be kept free from loose stones which must be kept picked off by the contractor; also any stones larger than the specified size. TIME FOR SPREADING

20-One-third of the yearly supply of stones for the road to be spread before 1st December; two-thirds before 1st February, and all before Spring Assizes in each year.

QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

21-The stones to be the hardest and toughest procurable within three miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and to be free from clay, sand, or other extraneous

QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.

cubic yards or more if required, a 22-The contractor is to supply annually sufficient quantity of broken stones, for the proper maintenance of the road. This quantity to be laid down in equal heaps, dressed for measurement, along the sides of the road, on carefully prepared level floors, before 1st October in each year of the contract. The heaps to be outside the working way.

EXTRA MATERIALS.

23. In addition to the annual quantity as above, such extra materials must be provided and spread as may be required to fulfil the conditions of the contract for constantly keeping the surface in good repair during the whole term of the contract.

FOOTPATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GRATINGS, ETC.

24-The footpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and

maintained as follows :-

If curbed with stone, all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled or broken to be resodded. Grass on both sides of path to be neatly edged three times a year. Clean out and repair all existing outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year-in February and October-and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from clay, dirt, and stones over 3-inch diameter.

Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of 11 inch per yard

25-All flagged or paved paths and channels to be repaired and kept in repair. All gratings where broken, disturbed, or removed, to be repaired, re-set or renewed-

#### COUNTY WORKS.

26-Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the first half-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

INJURIES, OBSTRUCTIONS, ENCROACHMENTS, TREES, HEDGES, ETC.

27-All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment or trespass. The contractor shall require the owners to prune and lop all injurious or obstructive hedges and trees, and shall proceed summarily against all offenders in accordance with the provisions of the Acts relative to such offences, especially 14 & 15 Vic., cap 92, secs 9 & 10, and 19 & 20 Vic, cap 63, sec 18.

SURPLUS MATERIAL.

28-Any broken stones or gravel found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the county.

Resolved—That in future there shall be printed in detail, at the beginning of the Schedule, a list of duties to be gone through by the Grand Jury.

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# PUBLIC ANALYST'S REPORT.

# TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report for your information that I have made the following analyses during the half-year ended on the 31st June last :-

On February 23rd, two specimens of milk were received from the Guardians of Rathdrum Union. One of them was adulterated with 26 and the other with 261 per cent. of added water. On the 2nd March, eight specimens of water were received from this Board of Guardians; two of them were found to be polluted. On the same occasion a specimen of milk received from this Board was found to be adulterated with 12 per cent, of added water.

A specimen of water used at Bray was sent on the 2nd March by

Alderman Cochrane, and was favourably reported upon.

On the 26th May, three specimens of water were received from the guardians of Baltinglass Union; one of them was found to be largely

A sample of whiskey was received on the 3rd June from the guardians of Rathdrum Union. It was rather fresh, and was seven degrees over

proof. A specimen of milk sent by the guardians of Naas Union, which is in part situated within the County of Wicklow, was found to be of poor quality.

I had nearly omitted to report that a specimen of water was received from the Rathdrum Board of Guardians on the 7th May, and was favourably reported upon.

#### COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW. Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1887.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

I do not deem it necessary to call your particular attention to any of the applications for presentments set forth in the Schedule before you, as any required information can be given as the applications are gone through.

No. 94, County at Large may, however, be referred to. This presentment was applied for by me in accordance with the instructions of the last Grand Jury. It is for £60 for the means of heating the Crown Court. Several systems having been considered, it was decided to adopt the patent warm air heating apparatus of Mr. John Grundy of London, which appears to give satisfaction wherever in use. Mr. Grundy has examined the Court and guaranteed the success of his system.

Since last Assizes proceedings were taken against Richard Murphy, barony of Arklow, and Patrick Kavanagh, barony of North Ballinacor, road contractors, and their sureties, for breach of contract. Decrees were obtained in each case.

It will be necessary now to cancel the following contracts as new presentments for them have been passed owing to the contractors and their sureties having been decreed for breach of contract: No. 34, North Ballinacor, and Nos. 12, 35, 42, 55 and 60, Lower Talbotstown, Abstract, Spring, 1887.

No. 47, Newcastle and 44 Lower Talbotstown should also be cancelled, the former in accordance with the recommendation of the last Grand Jury and the latter by recommendation of Road Sessions.

For both these roads new contracts have been made.

The work at Wicklow bridge, ordered by the last Grand Jury, was interrupted for a considerable time owing to legal proceedings taken against me by the Wicklow Harbour Commissioners with a view to restrain me from carrying out the proposed works. It is much to be regretted that considerable expenditure in law costs should thus have been incurred; but everything that was possible to be done was done on behalf of the Grand Jury to avoid litigation.

In connection with this matter I beg to refer you to the presentment for this work, No. 78, Arklow, Abstract, Spring, 1887, in order that arrangements may be made for having the necessary funds available as they may be required.

I have been requested by the Great Southern and Western Railway Co. to take off their hands those portions of the County roads which were altered by the works of their Tullow Branch Railway.

The Company has offered to pay for the maintenance of these altered portions. I am not yet quite satisfied with the state of these altered

roads, and have sent a statement of my requirements to the Company. I wish now to ascertain if it be your wish to charge the Company for the maintenance of these roads after I am satisfied to take them over.

It would facilitate the County work very much if arrangements were made by which the Abstract following Spring Assizes could be issued

before the Summer Sessions begin as in other Counties.

On the last occasion the Abstract was not issued until a week after the Sessions were over, thus causing considerable trouble and inconvenience and liability to mistakes being made.

With regard to the dates for the Road Sessions I think they should be fixed and not liable to change. The last Road Sessions were a week

earlier than usual, I know not for what reason.

I am of opinion that the Summer Sessions should always commence on the nearest Monday to 10th May, and the Winter Sessions on the nearest Monday to 1st December.

As these dates best suit the work of the County, I trust you will

not sanction any change.

At some of the last Adjourned Sessions your Secretary called attention to a clause of the specification that I deemed it advisable to insert; but as the same clause was added to the specifications for Spring Assizes, this year, it would appear that that would have been the proper time to notice it, if any special notice were necessary.

The clause referred to is as follows :-

"The contractor will be liable to a deduction of -s. for each cubic yard of road metal found deficient from above quantity at the October measurement in each year and will also be liable to a deduction from, or a total forfeiture of, as the case may require, the sum payable at any Assizes under the contract, should he fail to comply with the several provisions of this specification. Such deductions will be represented to the credit of the barony."

This condition is equitable and as there is no difference between Grand Jury contracts and those made by private individuals, I cannot see

that its omission would serve any good purpose.

My object in wishing to insert it is to insure more constant attention to their work on the part of contractors than is possible under present arrangements by which they must be paid either "all or none." It will also have the most desirable effect of keeping the number of undischarged queries within due limits.

In this connection I beg to direct your attention to pages 25 and 26 of the Abstract of Spring Assizes, 1887, on which pages is a list of sums recommended by me to be represented in aid of the rates. Five of these are only parts of the presented sums, as to have certified all would have been an injustice to the ratepayers and to have represented all would have been a greater injustice to the contractors, as the faults complained of, although debarring the contractors from full payment, were not of a very serious nature.

The Grand Jury, in accordance with my recommendation, ordered these sums to be represented, and my certificates were given for the balances; but your Secretary refused to pay the portions duly certified and has not credited the portions so represented to the several baronies.

Since I have been connected with this County I have on several occasions given certificates for part payment in cases where it was the only means of disposing of them; but until last Assizes the contractors were duly paid.

Unless the Grand Jury have some such discretionary power it will be impossible to insure that constant attention to their work on the part of contractors which is so desirable.

How for instance can we insure a road being kept constantly free from rolling stones unless the contractor knows that he is liable to forfeit say £2 of his money if such loose material be found on his road at any time.

Again if a contractor does not cut the weeds on the roadsides at the proper season; but has his road otherwise in accordance with the specification, would any Court uphold the justice of his losing an entire half year's

money?

Or if a contractor is short say 10 cubic yards of material out of 60. I do not think any fair-minded man would say either that he should be paid in full or that he should lose the whole of his half year's money; but that he should be duly brought to a sense of his duty by losing say double the value of the deficiency.

I have opinions on this matter from the Government Auditor, the Clerk of the Crown and Peace of this County and from many of the County Surveyors of Ireland, which I can submit for your consideration; but of course will cheerfully abide by whatever decision you may come to on the matter.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE GRAND JURY ON THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT, THE HIGH CON-STABLES' REPORTS, AND EXISTING CONTRACTS.

Committee-Colonel Tighe, Dr. Truell, Julius Casement, Colonel Saunders, David Mahony, Colonel Kemmis.

#### EXISTING CONTRACTS.

The amounts of those for North Ballinacor, Lower Talbotstown and Newcastle, require to be amended by the deducting from them of the presentments mentioned-paragraphs 4 and 5 of County Surveyor's report. Ordered.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

(a)—The Wicklow Bridge.—The Committee have considered the question of the Wicklow bridge with reference to the letter from the Harbour Commissioners. The works authorised by the Grand Jury at the last Assizes are now well in hand, and we understand that the County Surveyor has since so far altered his plan that an additional depth of water of at least 9 inches is being given to the arch principally used by boats. The only alternative proposal is the building of a timber bridge in lieu of the present structure, at a cost of about £500. To sanction such an arrangement would require the summoning of a special presentment sessions with the authority of the Lord Lieutenant, and there will be great difficulty in dealing with the present structure. We are left the open proposal to make any recommendation in this matter. The Committee also recommend that the Secretary be authorised to advance the necessary funds for this work up to the amount of the presentment (viz. £600) upon certificate of County Surveyor.

(b)—With respect to the roads altered by the Tullow Branch Railway, the Committee see no objection to the roads altered being taken charge of by the County Surveyor, as the Railway Company are willing to

continue payment for them.

(c)-As to the dates for Road Sessions, the Committee suggest that the following dates be fixed and adhered to for future, viz.:-To commence in summer on the second Monday in May, and in winter on first Monday in December. An objection has been raised as to the above date for winter sessions by the Secretary to Grand Jury, viz.—That it would interfere with his attendance at winter assizes, such attendance, however, appears to be unnecessary, as the Secretary can act by agent, and the county work is of the first importance. Under this arrangement the next presentment sessions will take place at Newtown-Mt.-Kennedy on Monday, the 5th December next, and we recommend the following dates for the other sessions, viz. :--

December 13th at Blessington, for Lower Talbotstown. 14th ,, Baltinglass ,, Upper Talbotstown. " South Ballinacor. 15th , Tinahely " Shillelagh loth , Shillelagh 16th , Rathdrum ,, North Ballinacor. 17th ,, Enniskerry ,, Rathdrum

,, Arklow and County at Large. 20th , Wicklow

(d)-The clause proposed to be inserted in the specification the Committee think should be adhered to, as it is very desirable that the County Surveyor should be able to give certificates for part payments in certain cases, such action being in accordance with 42 Section, 6 & 7 Wm. IV., c. 116. In any case in which the County Surveyor thinks it desirable that a part payment only should be made it is merely necessary, on the whole sum being laid before the Grand Jury for approval, for him to state by what sum and why he wishes the presentment altered, when if his suggestion be approved the sum can be deducted from the existing contracts of the barony concerned, and at once represented to it.

- (e)—The Committee observe with satisfaction the action and result of taking proceedings against defaulting contractors.
- (f)—The Committee think it very desirable that the Abstract should be issued as early as possible.

#### HIGH CONSTABLES' RETURNS.

With regard to the High Constables, the Committee recommend that they be required to attend the Grand Jury until their accounts shall have been disposed of, and that they should produce before the chairman of the respective presentment sessions the list of such debts as they may have returned as irrecoverable.

We have examined the accounts of the Fever Hospital and find them correct, except that their is an error of twopence in the credit side of the account.

#### CORONERS' ACCOUNT.

We have examined the accounts and find them correct; but your Committee wish to point out that they have no means of verifying the mileage charged.

COURT-HOUSE KEEPERS' ACCOUNT.

We have examined the accounts and find them correct, except that the Court-house Keeper of Wicklow Court-house has no vouchers for two items, viz.—Cleaning and glazing windows and for sweeping chimneys. We recommend that the amount allowed for cleaning court-houses should in future include all charges for cleaning windows, and that no separate charge be made for that item.
