The N.E. corner of the parish, part is the property of the Earl of Meath and part of the Hon. Sydney Herbert; the rents are very high, ten and twelve pounds per sere. A large portion on the E. side is held by Mr. Quin of the Hotel; part by Mr. Putland of Newcourt. Most of the remainder is attached in very small holdings, to residences about the Town, which frequently change tenants, namely 5 Fairy hill in H.E. side; Bay View on M. side; Eden View on S. side, Richview on S.W. side.
