The Report of the Visiting Committee was read, and Orders were made thereon, as follows:-

Read reports of the acting Medical Officer of the Workhouse, Dr E. C. MacDermot, as follows :-

I beg to report that since your last meeting Mrs Dunne and her two children were admitted to the Fever Hospital. Mrs Dunne suffered from typhoid fever and died in the Fever Hospital. The two children were suspicious cases, but did not suffer from typhoid and are now in the House. Joseph and Mary Byrne were also admitted to the Fever Hospital suffering from a peculiarly mild form of scarlet fever, almost devoid of the principal symptoms. Patrick Neill was also admitted to the Fever Hospital suffering from typhoid fever. All the patients in the Fever Hospital are doing well.

I beg to recommend that George Malone be provided with an artificial leg. His right leg has been amputated and he suffers from gangrene of left foot.

I beg to recommend that Mary Murphy, of Greenane, be sent to a Maternity Hospital for operation. She suffers from prolapse of the womb. I would have sent her long since but that she was pregnant. Her confinement was an extremely dangerous one, and I took her into Hospital for safety. She left Hospital just before Christmas, having been there since early in November. Both her future comfort and her life depend on an operation being done.

ORDER :- Estimate for artificial limb for George Malone to be procured. The patient, Mary Murphy, to be sent for operation if Local Government Board, when informed of the circumstances of the case, approve. - J.B.

The Master reports that owing to the admission of a number of patients to the Fever Hospital, the Medical Officer considered it necessary to requisition the services of Nurse Neary, who took up duty on 29th December.

major Tottenham, of Woodstock, forwarded £1 for the purpose of giving the Workhouse children a Christmas treat; same was much appreciated.

The Master finds it impossible to procure sufficient quantities of either butter or margarine from the contractor or from other sources.

The Master has secured a vacancy in the Mater Hospital for a patient named Thomas Hennessy, whom the Guardians decided to send for special treatment at their last meeting. Hennessy is in the Infirmary here since Dec. 4th, and in my opinion is destitute.

The Ambulance driver being ill to-day, the Master had to requisition the services of Thomas Cullen as substitute.

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland, and others, were read by the Clerk, and directions given to answer them respectively, to the following effect (or Orders made on them respectively, as follows):—

Read letter No. 51,403/1917, dated loth December, 1917, from the Local Government Board, referring to the inquiry on the subject in the minutes of the meeting of the Guardians on 8th October last, and stating that they were prepared to abolish the office of Workhouse Schoolmistress on the condition that the Guardians grant the present holder a fair annual allowance by way of compensation for loss of office.

Read letter No. 82,937/1917, dated 18th December, 1917, from same, acknowledging receipt of letter of the Clerk of the Union of 13th idem relative to the proposal of the Board of Guardians to grant a superannuation allowance to the Workhouse Schoolmistress and to send the children to the local National School. In reply the Local Government Board stated that the Guardians could deal with the question of fixing a retiring allowance in this case after the statutory notice, and that the teacher's salary should be paid until the date when the office was formally abolished. With reference to further inquiry the Local Government Board pointed out that the children might be sent to the outside schools at once, provided that the Managers had nomobjection to receive them.

ORDER :- Children not to be sent out until the question of the abolition of the office is disposed of.

I hereby give notice that at the meeting to be held on the 25th day of February, 1918, I will move :- That Mrs Kelly, who up to this has held the position of Schoolmistress in the Workhouse, be granted a superannuation allowance according to scale to which she is entitled, and that for this purpose seven years be added to her period of service. The following Orders and Letters of the Local Government Board for Ireland, under the Medical Charities Act. were laid before the Board, and directions given thereon, as follows:-

Read letter No. 60,073/1917, dated 24th December, 1917, from the Local Government Board, stating that they had had under consideration the resolution of the Guardians of 26th ultimo proposing to grant a war bonus of £8 a year each to Doctors Hamilton, O'Keeffe, Garland, and McCormack, Dispensary Medical Officers. With reference thereto the Local Government Board desired to point out that the Guardians in voting the bonuses admittted the claims of the Medical Officers to improved payments out of the rates during the continuance of the war. In view of the status of Medical Officers and the fact that they are only part time officials, the Local Government Board had felt unable in other Unions to sanction war bonuses in their cases. The Board had, however, intimated their willingness to sanction improvements in the Medical Officers' graded scale of salaries, and they were happy to say that Guardians had acted on that intimation and submitted proposals. If the Guardians after due notice proposed to adopt new scales with improved initial and maximum salaries and to apply them to the salaries of stheir medical staff and in that way confer benefits on them equivalent to the proposal of the 26th November, the Local Government Board would then give the matter their favourable consideration.

I hereby give notice that at the meeting to be held on the 21st day of January, 1918, I will move :- That the scale of salaries in force in this Union for Medical Officers be varied, and that increased initial salaries be fixed and increased rate of increment be granted.

The following Orders and Letters of the Local Government Board for Ireland, under the Medical Charities Act. were laid before the Board, and directions given thereon, as follows:—

Read letter No. 4378/1918, dated February 20th, 1918, from the Local Government Board, stating that they had received the minutes of the specially summoned meeting held on the 21st ultimo to consider the following notice of motion :- "That the scale of salaries in force in this Union for Medical Officers be varied, and that increased initial salaries be fixed and increased rate of increment be granted! It would appear from the minutes that the only resolution adopted thereon was : "That the salaries of the following Medical Officers of the Union, Drs Hamilton, O'Keeffe, Garland and McCormack be increased by a triennial increment of £8 instead of £5 as at present." The Local Government Board pointed out that this proposal would not confer any immediate improvement in salary such as was required to meet the exigiencies of present day financial circumstances. Purthermore, the fact that the Medical Officers who were now serving temporarily in the Royal Army Medical Corps had not been placed within its scope on their return to their posts under the Guardians was also a fatal objection. The Local Government Board asked the Guardians to reconsider their decision and deal in a more liberal generous spirit with the claims of their medical staff for an immediate increase of salary.

Read letter No. 354/1918, dated 16th February, 1918, from the Local Government Board, adverting to previous correspondence and tomthe letter of the Clerk of the Union of 2nd ultimo relative to the proposal of the Board of Guardians to employ Dr E. C. MacDermot, acting Medical Officer of the Rathdrum Workhouse and Dispensary District, to discharge in addition the duties of the Medical Officer of the Augnrim Dispensary District during the continued absence of that officer on military service. The Local Government Board informed the Guardians that they recently instructed their Medical Inspector, Dr Browne, to ascertain and report whether Dr MacDermot was discharging efficiently all his Poor Law duties, including the duties in the Aughrim Dispensary District. The Inspector in a report, dated 1th 12th instant, wrote as follows:

I find that Dr MacDermot has attended regularly at the Workhouse and several Dispensaries, but the attendances have not been punctual, especially in the case of the Workhouse where the attendance has on many occasions been late in the day.

The Dispensary records are not posted up in accordance with the Regulations. The Medical Relief Register for Rathdrum District is entered up to end of year, 1917, with the exception of Col. 9; no entries since that date; 228 tickets registered for the year which is a very small number for the district. The attendance and report book has not been entered up since the 1st May last. No medicines ordered since July last, the stock of drugs is exhausted. The Vaccination Register has not been posted and Form P. returns have not been submitted by Dr MacDermot. In the Aughfim District the Medical Relief Register has been entered up to date with the exception of Col. 9. There is no record of attendances at dispensary, No vaccinations have been performed and Form P. has not been submitted by Dr MacDermot. The instruments are in bas order and the stock of some drugs exhausted, no medicines having been procured since April last.

The facts set out in the Inspector's Report, the Local Government Board stated, confirmed the opinion expressed in the Local Government Board's letter of 2nd October last to the effect that Dr MacDermot could not, owing to the volume of duty that devolved on him in connection with the other posts he held, viz: acting Medical Officer of the Workhouse and of the Rathdrum Dispensary District, devote sufficient attention to the medical duties in Aughrim Dispensary District. Read letter dated 24th February, 1918, from Dr Wm. Deely, acting Medical Officer, Anamoe Dispensary District, as follows:-

In reference to the case of Mrs Dunne, Fiddler's Row, Seven Churches, about whom your Board received a letter at last meeting, I wish to bring before the Guardians the following facts in explanation :- On December 26th, at the time I received ticket from P. Dunne, I was about to attend a case at Ballinastoe and having asked P. Dunne the nature of his wife's illness, he replied that he believed it was a heavy cold she had, for which I gave him medicine, promising at the same time to attend the case as early as possible. On my return from the case at Ballinastoe a ticket awaited me from Glanmore, at the bottom of Ballymachroe Hill and the extreme end of my district on that side. This I attended immediately, as I was told the case was urgent, and myself and Dr McCormack were obliged to remain there until the early hours of the following morning owing to the gravity of the case. The letter states "He then ordered the woman to Hospital". This I deny, for having examined Mrs Dunne on the occasion of my visit and given directions to the woman in charge as to the management of the case, Mrs Dunne stated she would like to go to the Union Hospital, as she said she had no care where she was. I then worded a telegram for her husband to send as soon as possible, and in addition gave him a written note to the Master of the Union, in case he failed to send the telegram, urging on him the necessity of having his wife removed to Hospital without delay, as she had decided on going there. I have learned that she did not enter the Hospital until the following evening.

Read report of Mr Cyril E. Browne, Local Government Auditor, as follows :-

I have the honour to report that I have audited the accounts of the Board of Guardians of Rathdrum Union for the half year ended 30th September, 1917, and beg to forward herewith certified copies of the abstract. Outdoor Relief. - The "reports" of the Relieving officers are mere lists of names, without information of any kind which would enable me to detide as to the legality and propriety of the relief granted. In a number of cases no medical certificates were available to prove the infirmity of young or middle aged persons. In one case in Relieving Officer Butler's list, and in four cases in Relieving Officer Byrne's list, I found erasures in the figures of the authorised grants. Relieving Officer Byrne appears to know very little about his district. In every case which I was able to verify I found that the ages of children were incorrect. Children of tender years for whose support widows were granted relief by the Guardians proved to be 18, 17 and 18 years of age. In one such case I surcharged the Relieving Officer with a sum of £7-18s. This officer, although paying the foster parents of boarded out children only quarterly, takes credit for monthly payments. The following Orders and Letters of the Local Government Board for Ireland, under the Medical Charities Act, were laid before the Board, and directions given thereon, as follows:—

Read letter No. 13446/1918, dated 26th March, 1918, from
the Local Government Board, forwarding for the consideration
of the Board of Guardians, a copy of a letter received from
Mr Edward O'Brien, Secretary of the County Wicklow General
Labourers Association, Aughrim Branch, in which he urged the
desirability of the appointment of a resident temporary Medical
Officer for the Aughrim Dispensary District of the Union.

Read letter addressed the Local Government Board by Mr Brien, stating that at the meeting of the Guardians on 11th March, 1918, they refused to appoint a temporary resident Medical Officer for the Aughrim Distract out of six applicants for the position, notwithstanding the refusal of the Local Government Board to sanction Dr MacDermot for the position. The Board of quardians pretended to be very concerned about the poor, but it appeared to them they were more concerned about themselves, and never gave a thought as to how a poor man, perhaps over ten miles away, was to get to the Medical Officer's residence in Rathdrum if a sudden and urgent case of illness occurred in the night. They aid not wish to cast any reflection on Dr MacDermot, who was a very kind gentleman, and always very attentive to his duties as far as lay in his power, but they thought it impossible for one doctor to perform the duties stisfactorily of two large districts like Aughrim and Rathdrum. The writer forwarded copy of a resolution adopted by the Association condemning the Guardians for not appointing a resident temporary Medical Officer for the District and requesting the Local Government Board to refuse to sanction Dr MacDermot unless he resides in the District.

ORDER :- That the question of appointing a resident Doctor in Aughrim for Aughrim Dispensary District be considered at the next meeting, and that in the meantime the former applicants for the position be written to. - J.B.

I am unable to attend the meeting of the Guardians on Monday. To doubt some resolution condemning the British Government Conscription Act will be adopted by the Guardians present. I would suggest that the Board take definite action to safeguard as far as they can the lives and honour of these living in the Rathdrum Union. Past history has taught us that when an Pholish army invades our country it practises upon the unfortunate inhalitants every atrocity known to the age. Should the Conscription Act be enforced the opportunity to exterminate the Irish race will be too good for the English to lose, and with the scum of the English towns loosed upon the countryside no woman's honour and no man's life will be safe, whether the country adopts the Policy of passive or of active resistance. I would suggest that pending the announcement of a more definite National programme (1) All Medical Officers of the Union be instructed to provide large quantities of 1st aid materials, and all nurses and M. O's. be instructed to hold themselves in readiness to proceed to any destination within the Union where atrocities may be committed by the English soldiery. (2) The Engineer be instructed to consider means of rendering the roads impassable to enemy convoys. (3) The Workhouse Master be instructed to order in advance such quantities of supplies as will enable him to provide for the Wants of the immates for several weeks. (4) The Unionis
