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In the W. part of Arklow, By., Wicklow County, two miles S. of Rathdrum; the principal market Town; bounded on the N. by Kilcommon & Dunganstown; E. by Redcross & Kilbride; S. by Arklow & Ballintemple and West by Ballykine & Rathdrum Parishes.

Contains 10,801 acres 3 roods 22 pers. It is a Rectory in the Dioces of Dublin; Amount of composition as settled by the Commissioners &c. to be paid yearly in lieu of Tithes, is £266. 8s. 2d. of which sum £250, subject to an endowment of £12. 18s. 6d. a year to the perp. Curacy of Redcross, is due to ~~the~~ the Revd. sir Thos. Foster Bart. as Rector of the Parish, and his successors and £16. 18s. 2d. is due to Charles Cooper as Lessee from the Impropriator of the half corn Tithe of Ballyarthur & Kilmagig T.Lands.

The A. Bishop of Dublin is the Patron of the living. 2 there is a Glebe House and 30 Irish acres of Glebe land but the House is uninhabitable from being in bad repair & and bad situation; there is a rent of £11. 10s. 9d. per acre for the Glebe land to Thos. Gunn Cunningham Esqr.

The Revd. J. Webber is the present Rector. The Church, which is in the Townland of Castlemacadam, was built about 1820 and is in good repair; there are sittings for about 250 persons, the average congregations in Summer being about 220 and in winter about 150. The R. C. Chapel is in the Village of Newbridge and is in good repair, it was built in 1790 and is capable of holding about 1800 persons, but is too small for the congregation which generally amounts to about 2500. There are three Schools in the Parish, viz. in Castlemacadam, Tigrony and Newbridge Townlands. The first two are scriptural Schools, once supported by the old societies, now by the National Board and are under the minister; the third is supported by the National Board, under the Priest. For the relief of the poor, there is a legacy of £100 in the management of the Board of Charitable Bequests. The interest is distributed in clothing; no alms houses or other buildings for the aged or infirm.

The shape of the Parish is pretty regular and compact, greatest length being from N. to South, six miles, and breadth in the centre from E. to W., \times four and a half miles. Surface hilly and in the North a great portion of it is uncultivated and marshy; the Southern portion of it is much better land and capable of growing all kinds of grain & vegetables. The sides of the hills bounding the Anghrim and Avonmore and also along both sides of the Oveca Rivers, which pass through this Parish are thickly covered with Wood; ~~xxxxxx~~ there are also pretty large patches of Plantation interspersed throughout the Central parts; it lies from about 800 to 300 feet above the level of the sea at Low Water, except in the immediate vicinity of the rivers which is considerably lower.

The Roads are conveniently numerous and in good repair, the principal of which is the Mail Coach road from Dublin to Wexford by Arklow, and enters the Parish in the N.W. contiguous to the Meeting of the Waters; it passes through the central part of the Parish from N. to South, keeping pretty close to and along the West side of the Oveca river till it leaves the Parish in the central South at "The 4 Wooden Bridge" about 770 yards N.W. of the meeting of the Anghrim and Oveca Rivers, being a distance of about four and a half miles in its course through the Parish. The Parish is well watered by streams and rivers. The Avonmore river meets this Parish in the N.W. and continues its course Southward along the boundary of the Parish bearing S. by W. for about two and one fourth miles when it is met by the Avonbeg forming the "Meeting of the Waters;" from this point the two rivers commingling assume the name

of the Cvooca which continues its course in a S.S.E. direction through the central part of the Parish for one mile when it takes an almost due South direction and continues so curving to the Southern extremity of the Parish a distance of four miles (measured in a straight line) where it is joined by the Aughrim river, which river meets the Parish in the S.W. extremity and running along the Southern boundary in a S.E. direction for 2½ miles to its junction with the Cvooca, where it leaves the Parish; at the Meeting of the Waters the bed of the river is about ---- feet above the sea and where the Cvooca leaves the Parish it is about 20 feet above the sea giving a fall of ---- feet in five miles; The appearance of the Parish in general is much varied and pleasing; the N.E. extremity of it being hilly and uncultivated; towards the centre and in the S.W. along the rivers Cvooca, Avonmore and Aughrim being thickly wooded, the other parts which are greatly undulated are under cultivation; Copper Mines. At Ballymurtagh Copper Mines which are in the N.W. of the Parish, there are two steam Engines employed in drawing and crushing ores, and one in draining the mines; they are all condensing Cornish Engines, there is a powder store but no copper pits, the water having got too weak to be profitably used in precepitating Copper from it. The produce of this mine is about 400 tons per month. Lessees the Wicklow mine Company. Land Lord Hib. Mine Co. & Mr. Ryan. 5

At Ballygahan Mines, which are in the Central North of the Parish there are two water wheels employed in pumping, stamping and drawing ores; and another erecting for the latter purpose, there is a Powder store and Copper pits, but the latter are not now profitable from the same cause as at Ballymurtagh, the produce of these mines is about 150 tons per month. Lessee, Mr. Hodgson. Land Lord, Lord Powerscourt.

Mr. Sockwell is proprietor of Connery Copper mines which are in the North of the Parish, he is under a penalty of £100 per month if he does not give the mining Company a lease with the signature of his two next heirs to it. The Mining Company gave to Mr. Kimpston the former occupant £1000 for the utensils & apparatus belonging to the Mines. Five men can raise about 15 tons of ore per month, for which they are paid £2 per ton; the ore of this Mine is sold in Swansea at the rate of £4. 10s. & £5. per ton. Mr. Williams & Co. have a lease of Tygroney and Cronaban mines for 21 years, in these mines 5 men can raise about 10 tons per month and are paid at the rate of from £2. 17s. 6d. to £3. 5s. per ton; this ore is sold in the Swansea Markets for £6. 10s. per ton. The copper 6

formerly obtained by precipitation sold for £15. & £18. per ton.

The Antiquities are the ruin of a church and a grave yard in the central part of the Parish. Three Raheens and a Fort in the N.E. and a Raheen in the Central West. Gentlemen's Houses are, Ballyarthur House in the West the residence of Mr. Bailey; Nine View in the North the residence of Mr. Kilbee; Cherrymount in the South the residence of Mr. Olliver; Millmount in the N. the residence of Mr. Johnson; Kingstown in the central part, the residence of Mr. King; Castle Howard, the residence of Lady Howard.
