Inedical offices of the Morkhause vag:—

I beg to report that I consider the moursing staff consisting of one day murse and one night nurse quite sufficient for the Infirmary.

The day-nurses hours from 8 & M. to 8 P.M. The hours of the might-nurse from 8 P.M. to 8 A.M. For some time just with my approval the day-nurse remains on duty till a considerably later hour than 8 P.M. to permit the night-nurse to get a sufficient amount of sleep during the more quiet hours of the evening, the might-nurse in return assisting the day-nurse in

the morning mursing duties There are no special infant words, the number of infants being small, Delicate infants always and children whose mothers are not in house weually being kept in the Infirmary. Other infants in body of house if strong being left in their mothers charge if mother is in the workhouse otherwise being placed in definite charge of a suitable inmate. These arrangements seem to work well. There are no paid Wards maids or Attendants but seven paupers (6 females & 1 male) act as pauper attendants & Wardsmaids in the Infirmary. These do the meniel work of the wards, viz: - washing, scrubbing wards & passages, making beds, porterage of food, cooking, under the murses supervision and render physical assistance with the sick. One of the above pauper assistants as woman sleeps in the female limatic and epileptic wards, and one a male sleeps in the corresponding male department.

The pauper attendants do not as a rule perform, any mursing duties any exception would be in case of temporary

absence of nurse in other wards and in affording assistance to an epileptic during a suddenly occurring fit and in Fever Hospital during nurse's slepping hours.

Fever Hospital. Not many cases usually. The mursing is carried out by one nurse who is responsible for both day and might duties. One male and one female pauper attendant do the meniel work of the Hospital and supply any ordinary wants of patients during the few hours the nurse requires for sleep. In grave cases requiring the special attention at night a special qualified nurse is procured for night duty and also if the duty becomes too heavy for a sing murse. I comider this arrangement on the whole adequate. During present year aqualified murse was promised to take charge of fever Hospital for one week of paid wards man was engaged for about a fortnight to take charge, under nurse, of a male epileptic who became veolent. If female wards- mais was employed and paid in Fever Hospital for 6 weeks during fearletina out break.

No 53477. 26 Leptember, 1901.

The Local Government Board wrote to inform the Board of Guardians that they had received the half-yearly report of their Inspector, M. A. Bourke, on the Union, consequent on the recent inspection of the Workhouse; which was of a satisfactory character as regards the financial condition of the Union, and the discharge of their duties by the several officers of the establishment.

Mr. Bourke considered that the water closets in the Workhouse were not flushed often enough; and the Board requested that the Guardians would be so good as to consult their Medical Officer on this subject.

The Imperetor recommended that the Guardians should grandually discontinue the use of the old wooden beds in the Infirmary Wards and he stated if the Guardians provided one dozen iron bedsteads with wire-woven matresses this year and another dozen next year they would not probably require any more.

It appeared that the roof of the Gener Hospital required repairs to the slating and ridge covering and that the gutters, eave-shoots and down-pipes required attention. M. Bourke of served that a mumber of new eave-shoots had been procured but had not yet been put upe. The chimney shaft of the Fever Hospital Kitchen seemed to be in bad repair. The Inspector stated that the chimney smoked badly, but that, probably, if the shaft were raised, this defect might be remedied. All the Fever Hospital chimneys appeared to require attention. The Inspector again printed out that the Workhouse was much in need of internal painting. With reference to this matter the Board desired to draw attention to their letter of the 25 January last and they trusted that the Guardians would not allow any further delay to take place in earrying out this work.

Mr. Bourke reported that the ceiling of the Fever Hospital Litchen might, with advantage; be either an parmelled or rendered as it now consisted of fore slates causing the kitchen to be very cold and draughty. The new range which was about to be put in the Main Workhouse Kitchen should be erected without delay. The ventilating shaft for the drain at the Fever Hospital had been procured but had mot yet been erected. The Guardians should be proceed with this work at once. The Inspector understoods that there was a contractor for keeping the roofs chimness, etc in repair; + the Guardians should take steps to have the necessary repairs carried out for this ith. The Inspector stated that the visiting committee had met and reported on only five occasions during the Half-year ; 4, with reference to this matter, the Board desired to draw attention to the terms of Article 59 in the Workhouse Rules and they requested that the requirements of that article might be more earefully complied with in future. Mr. Bowke also stated that no committee of Ladies had yet been appointed for the purpose of inspecting the children at hurse in the Union and the Board also requested that the Guardians would be so good asto give this matter their attention. No. 59, 630: 1901.

The Rocal Government Board for Ireland, desire to inform the Board of Guardians of Shillelagh Union that they have received a special report from their Medical Inspector, Dr. Joseph Smyth, relative to ghis inspection of the Workhouse Infirmary and Fever Hospital, which he visited and inspected on the 8th graph of the Williams

With regard to the Infirmary Wards,

Dr. Smyth reports that the walls of the wards are
white and the plaster in some places is broken and e
uneven. It would be a great improvement if the
surface of the walls were smooth finished. The
lower half could then be oil painted in some light
colour and kept constantly clean with a wet cloth,
while the upper half could be lime-washed periodic
cally and tinted in a different shale. The expense of
this, Dr. Smyth states, would be very slight.

The windows throughout the Infirmary do not open in the lower st sashes, and in some of the wards the windows of one side are blinded up. It is necessary that there should be a thorough circulation of air, and, therefore, both sashes of each window should open, and windows should be provided on both sides of the wards.

The grates are very wasteful, and in some of the wards the fireplaces and grates are in a neglected condition. The Guardians would find it to be a saving if they substituted modern grates of an approved pattern. These grates would give out more heat and consume less coal, and they would also brighten

up the wards and make them cheerful and comfortable for the sick.

The pillows are either chaff or straw. Both ought to be abolished and replaced by feather pillows. There are still a few straw beds which should be no longer retained.

In the female middle ward the floor is bad in patches and requires repair. There is one bed too many in the female long ward. If this ward there is a passage which connects it with a new ward which has been recently opened. This new ward is objectionable for several reasons and is not required.

There is no strecker or bearer-chair for removing patients from one word to another for operations, &c.,

As regards the lunatic wards, Dr lmyth states that the place provided for the female lunatices is partitioned by walls into cells. I mly one of these has a fire-place, but it is not occupied. There is a store outside some of the others and its flue comes through the wall at the top and passes along mear the ceiling into an adjacent chamber. Beyond, there is a large brich-paved day room.

It would be well if these cells were removed and the imbeciles were allowed to sleep in a dormitory that could be properly ventilated by cross windows and sufficiently heated by afire. They would also be under better observation.

The pillows here are filled with either straw or half.

The male bunatic wards consist of an attendants small bed-room, which is a sort of passage like the one on the female side. It has no fireplace. This room leads to a flagged passage having a fire at one end,

and an outside door at the other. This represents the day-room. If one side of it is a cell with two beds & which are occupied by a same epileptic and an inmate who looks after him. It has no fireplace, but there is a stove outside the cell as in the female ward.

Fever Hospital. This is in very good order and, in striking comparison contrast to the Infirmary looks

very well both inside and outside.

The pillows are filled with either straw or chaff, and the Board trust that the Guardians will not besitate to replace these by feather pillows. The straw beds should be & all abolished. Some of them are very old.

The windows should be made to open in the lower sashes as well as in the upper. The ventilators in the ceiling are not in working order. The grates are very wasteful.

There are no easy chairs for convalescent patients. There are me bed rests, bed cards, window blinds

or screens,

On the top of the clothes press upstairs is a quantity of mens trousers, which, The Nurse informed Dr. Smyth were worn by Hyphus Fever patients in the epidemic of 18 9 5. It appears that these clothes were fumigated by sulphur, but that gives no security, and, where there is no steam disippecting apparatus, Dr. Smyth, strongly recom recommends that clothing worn by patients suffering from infectious diseases should be laurned unless it can be carefully disinfected by boiling. On the floor at the side of the press referred to is an assortment of condemned clothes. These should be put in a proper place. It

A press for to bed-clothes is badly wanted in the Fever Hospital. At present these are kept in a cot in

the

the men's convalescent ward.

There is no water cushion provided.

The Nurse's room requires a new grate, which, Dr.

Smyth understands, the I wardians are about to provide.

All waste paper and rubbish in the Fever Hospital should be burned, and such things should not be allowed to accumulate, especially in an infectious

A few yards from the Fever Hospital there is a heap of rubbish and asker, &c., which should be removed to a more suitable place.

The privies are dark, but, if there were another opening in the wall they would be better lighted and less liable to be fould.

In the Infirmary the turrets on each landing should have the wentilators put in proper order

There is only one washing basin for each ward and proper towels are not provided.

There are no bed resto, footstools, bed-cards, bed-

tables, or proper screens in the Infirmary

These are all desirable articles in the equipment of even the poorest I nfirmary. There are no bed weaps for the patients when sitting up. The Nurse could easily make these if she were supplied with suitable material. It would be advisable to have a distinctive dress for the Informary instead of making the patients wear the Workhouse pattern.

In the Infirmary the milk is kept in a small closet under thex stairs called the "Dairy". This is a very unsuitable place for milk or any other food. A small larder for milk and one for meat ought to be provided for the Infibernary. They ought to be fixed in some cool and shaded place on the open air and made mainly of fly proof perforated material.

Underneath

Underneath the other stairs there is a a sort of lie-by which serves only as a receptacle for rubbish and should be removed.

The milk given to the Infants is not sterilized, and that given to the adult immates is practically always consumed uncooked. This matter should be brought under the notice of the Medical Officer.

Milk is supplied by the contractor only once a day except in the months June, July and Angust, when it is delivered twice daily. It should be supplied fresh morning and evening all the year round.

For the main state stock of provisions proper store room is necessary badly needed. Milk is at at present kept with meat in a place that is suitable for meither.

The Medical Officer should systematically inspect all supplies of food every day. This is the only way to secure proper protection.

Ambulances. A new ambulance has been recently obtained for the Infirmary. It is a two-wheeled vehicle, and and the driver's seat is about seven feet high from the ground. The ambulance for the Fever Hospital is rather old. It also is a two wheeled wehicle, is not properly lighted or ventilated. It has no stretcher, is only five feet long, and the patient, Dr Swyth was told, complain that it is too short. They complain also that it "skakes the life out of them." De Suigth understands that the Guardians intend

to replace it by the ambulance that hitherto had been used for Informary patients. But if an ambulance be unfit for Infirmary pattents, it must be unfit, too, for fever patients. It also is ill-lighted and ill-ventilated. It has no stretcher, and has no place for a nurse. It is a twowheeled vehicle, and the driver's seat is nearly seven fat

high from the ground. Dr Smith is of opinion that the hursing Staff

is insufficient, and the Board request that the Guardians will consult their medical Officer on this subject, and furnish the Board with their observations thereon.

The number of inmates employed in the Infirmary at present as attendants is excessive, and ought to be

reduced from 7 to 3, or at most to four.

Consumption Hards. The rooms which at present are occupied by the nurses would, Ir Smyth thinks, make suitable wards for male and female consumptives. They might each afford accommodation for two patients. The hurses should be provided for in another place.

It would be well if the quardians took into consideration the feasibility of removing the lunatio wards from their present situation. They are a great injury to the Infirmary. The exercise grounds of the lunatics communicate with the exercise grounds of the sick On the female side one of the lunatics is so noisy all the day and her language is so foul that no patient should be subjected to the annoyance. One the male side there is a sane epileptic. Both he and the inmate who stays with him could be more suitably employed than they are at present.

The present female lunatic wards night be easily converted into suitable apartments for three kurses.

The exercise grounds belonging to the infirmary require alteration and extension. The steps should be entirely removed and the ground sloped gradually back. This could be done cheaply by inmate labour. Provision should be made for allowing patients to have the benefit of walking in the paddock beyond the Infirmary walls at the rere these walls are so high that they shut out all view of anything but the sky and the tops only of some trees, while the scenery outside is exceedingly beautiful. They also seriously interfere with the free circul-- ation of air about the Infermary. On the female side the

ground is all taken up as a drying ground for clothes hanging on lines. Seats should be provided against opposite walls to suit sun and wind, and they should have small lave shelters projecting over them to keep off the rain.

Dr Smith recommends the Guardians to try if they cannot conveniently and with advantage change the approach to the Infirmary so that the sick should not be obliged to pass through the Work house buildings. This would be a great improvement.

There are two kitchens in the Infirmary and two fires. This arrangement is very extravagant and quite unnecessary. One of the Kitchens should be converted into a scullery, and the paving of coal thus effected would, Dr Smyth considers, be about

Surgery. There should be proper places provided in the surgery for dressings, instrument and appliances, where they should be kept in proper order, and always ready for use in any emergency. I list of all instruments and appliances should be written but and posted up in the surgery. Lest tubes, spirit lamp, and such articles should be always ready at hand.

The detary book should in future have the column for the date when extras were first ordered by the medical Officer properly filled in It could then be seen at a glance how long each patient was receiving stimulants or other extras.

Sanitary arrangements. a few years ago the Guardian's spent about £ 900 in providing a new water supply and drainage scheme. The water supply is obtained from a spring which rises in the hill at some distance from the Workhouse. The water flows in an open stream into a prepared reservoir, from which premises. Dr Smith was informed that in its course this open stream flows alongside a farmyard. It is therefore exposed to the danger of infection, which might have disastrous consequences, and it is imperative that some precaution should be taken to protect it. The simplest suggestion that occurs to Dr Smyth is to pipe the water from a point of the stream above the farm yard, or better still, from the spring itself.

The drainage system has obvious defects. It is not sufficiently ventilated. Some of the manholes have been sealed over with cement. There is one on the public lane that is so treated, Or Smith was told, because the smell was so offensive. Hong the whole length of the Infirmary building, and only about three feet from the wall, there is a drain which received the slops from the kitchen sinks. There are no grease traps to be seen. The gradient of this drain is insufficient, and it is frequently getting blocked up. The contractor told Dr Smyth that he has had to clear it out as often as about 12 times in the past two years. There is no grating or inspection hole, and for the purpose of clearing obstructions the pipe must be broken across, then patched up with a sort of saddle and the earth covered in. This drain should be opened up and laid down in a proper manner.

It appears that the privies are flushed out only three times a week. They should be flushed daily, and the Board trust the Guardians will give instructions to have this done in future.

The flushing pipe is 3 inches in diameter and opens directly into the cesspit of the privies. It comes from the drinking reservoir and gives off the supply branches to the drinking taps. The outlet tank, which receives the sewage, is about 14 mile from the Workhouse, but only

about 140 yards from a group of three dwellinghouses. The overflow runs along an open drain
into a brook which flows into the Derry river. The
tank is on sloping ground, and below it, at a short
distance is a well which was used for drinking, and
as the water from this well should not be used for
drinking purposes, it would be a wise precaution
if the quardians closed up this well altogether.
Dr Smyth states that the people who reside adjacent
to the sewage tank complain very strongly indeed

of its offensiveness.
Water blosets. There are two water-closels for the upper wards of the Infirmary-one on

for the upper wards of the Infirmary-one on each side. The closet is simply placed in the ward and enclosed by a square wooden partition. The partition includes a window of one side in its length, and half the floor in its width. The other half of the ward floor-between the closet door and the side of the ward which has no windows accommodates a bed in which a patient was lying.

The soil pipes discharge with an open mouth into the cedspits of the privies below, about two feet six inches beneath the privil seats.

These closets have been very improperly erected, and they ought to be immediately removed.

The Board would recommend the Guardians to have the whole sanitary arrangements of the Workhouse - water supply, sewerage system, relosets - inspected by a competent sanitary engineer.

Hot Water. The new hot watercirculation might be made more economical. The hot and cold pipes are in contact along part of their course and neither they now the hot water eighinder have any non-consucting material round them to prevent

prevent loss of heat. Consequently there is a delay in heating and a waste of fuel. The hot & cold pipes should be well separated, and both they and the cylinder should be felted.

It would be well if the Guardians took steps to make cure that appliances for utilizing their water supply to extinguish a fire should

be always available at very short notice. Adjacent to the Infermary there is a heap of manure which should be placed else

where, and there is a large disused underground tank in the exercise yard which is not pafely covered.

blassification. The classification in the Infirmary might be improved several inmates of the Workhouse were in the Infirmary who were under no medical or surgical treatment, and were quite able to care themselves. Some had been there for years. They spent their time idly round the fire, living in the Infirmary as if it were a lodging house.

it would be impossible to make the Infirmary what it ought to be, or to make it acceptable to the sick poor outside, so that they might avail themselves of its benefits in their time of need.

as well as an injury to the character of the Infirmary.
