Clergy put a stop to it. Still children are brought here for cures, and numberless old rags ac. are tied to the bushes over the well. St. Nichs. day being in Hovr. the inclemency of the weather did not answer for the sports, and the immersion of the children, therefore these practices were performed in June. There are two small Raths partly defaced in the R. side. A most on high ground in the Bast side is called Tornant Woat, and eight chs. to the Bast is a grave yard cabled Tornant grave yard. Good roads bound the Td. on the West and another passes through the S. side. Dunlavin, the market Town is about half a mile hence. Muel is got in Kyledoon bog about 10 I. miles hence.

In Dunlavin is a Dispensary for the poot, the Doctor receives \$50 per annum from the County and 250 from subscribers; attendance. Wednesday & Friday. A Police Station, generally 10 men and a chief constable. A good market House of ancient erection. In 1835 it was repaired by Lady Tynte which cost 2300. A school House built by subscription, is not under the patronage of any society but receives books from the London Hibernian Society, and some small unlimited subscriptions from the neighburing gentlemen. A grave yard where the church formerly stood. A Post office. The Established Church built in A816 which cost 21,750, 21.300 of which was given by the Board of First Fruits; it is a small neat building capable of containing about 400 persons: in the yard of which is interment. A R. C. Chapel repaired and enlarged about 18 years since. The yard in which it stands was gift of Lady Tynte. ! Chapel would accommodate upwards of 600 persons and is numerously attended. There are two caravans travelling daily to, and from Dublin by Kilcullen, fare 2/2. post from Dubbin to Dunlavin is carried by the South Mail daily to Kilcullen, and from thence by a cross post.
