McCarriek & Co. note forwarding Colliery certificates for last lots of coal (29 tons) delivered at the Workhouse; and in reply to a further letter from the Club stated that after the acceptance of their contract they made arrangements with the Whitehaven Colliery for the shipment of a cargo in order to execute the contract. Before the order was executed the Whitehaven Colliery went out on strike & the Colliery informed them (Memo Mr. O. McCarriek & Co.) that they would be unable to execute the order for some time.

Meanwhile, as coals were required for the Union, they supplied the immediate wants with coals fully equal in quality to that contracted for. The balance of contract would be supplied with Whitehaven coals & Colliery certificate duly forwarded.

Order. That Memo Mr. O. McCarriek & Co. be asked if they are prepared to allow the Board of Guardians a rebate of 2/- a ton on the quantity of coals supplied which is not of the quality or description contracted for.
