Moyne (Parish) (contd.)

County of Wicklow and all in the Barony of South Ballinacor. Bounded on the North by Donoughmore Psh.; on the East by Ballinacor Psh.; on the South by Kilpipe & Prebawn Pshs. and on the West by Kilcommon, Hacketstown and Kiltegan Pshes.

This Psh. is in the Co. Wicklow and Province of Leinster and contains about ----- about five sixths of which is mountain uncultivated land. It is a perpetual curacy in the Diocese of Leighlin and in the patronage of the incumbent of Hacketstown. The Globe house is situated close to the Church and is occupied by the Revd. Robt. Wright the Curate. There is a Dispensary and school House near the church; about 80 children are taught in this school which is supported principally by annual donations from the Curate and the Governors of the founding Hospital; Earl Fitzwilliam gave the school house and five roods of ground. There is a Roman Catholic Chapel in the Psh. in Askinagap T.Ld. The only seat in the Psh. is that of Capt. Tate which is Coolballnitaggart Lodge; The Psh. is nine miles long from North to South but in the middle it is very narrow being only about half a mile from E. to W. In Slieverce T.Ld. is an ancient well called St. Columbkil's well at which Patterns were held formerly but have been discontinued since 1833. Markets and Post towns Hacketstown, distance about four miles and Tinehely the same distance.

Nearly all cultivated producing wheat, tho' little of it sown, barley, oats and potatoes; a Capital road passes thro' the West and S.W. Portion of T.Ld. leading from Moyne to Timahely; another bye road passes thro' centre of townland. Is well supplied with water on the East side by a stream and on the S. & W. by a small river. Market & Post towns Hacketstown and Timahely.
