WICKLOW SCOOPS FOUR AWARDS AT 'COMMUNITY OSCARS' - Four community groups from Wicklow were successful at the National Pride of Place awards on 10th November.

These annual awards are known as the Oscars for community groups, and they highlight the tremendous work being done by community groups all over the island of Ireland. The presentation ceremony was held in Armagh this year.

The village of Hollywood won Gold in the Population 0-500 category while Avoca Village won Silver in the Population Category 500- 1500. Greystones Tidy Towns also won Silver in the Creative Place Category and Rewild Wicklow took home Gold in the Special Award category.

Sponsored by IPB Insurance, the Pride of Place competition was initiated 21 years ago though a Cooperation Ireland programme to acknowledge the invaluable work undertaken by volunteers and those involved in local community development.

The Pride of Place competition has grown into the largest competition recognising community development achievements on the island of Ireland.

DISABILITY AND INCLUSION STRATEGY LAUNCHED - Wicklow's first ever Disability and Inclusion Strategy has been launched.

Wicklow County Council's Disability and Inclusion Steering Committee (DISC) has been working towards this launch since the committee was established in 2020.

The Strategy outlines the various ways that Wicklow County Council and its partners intend to make the services they provide equitable and accessible to all. It aims to ensure that persons with a disability have an equal opportunity to pursue their ambitions, realise their potential and live fulfilling lives. It also seeks to build on the progress made by Wicklow County Council and many other partner agencies and individuals.

Public consultations took place around the county and online to help inform the drafting of the Strategy. A questionnaire was also posted on Wicklow County Council's website to allow for public contributions.

These consultations identified three Action Areas to address the issues raised throughout the consultation process:

- 1. Participation, Communication and Rights
- 2. Community Participation, Accessibility & Universal Design
- 3. Employment, Housing and Recreation.

Individual actions are aligned to the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Person's with Disabilities throughout the document.

Wicklow County Council, in partnership with the Disability Inclusion Steering Committee (DISC), will undertake a leadership role to progress actions in the strategy alongside staff from across every department in the local authority.

Wicklow County Council currently has agreements in place for units in Greystones, Ashford, Newtownmountkennedy, Blessington, Baltinglass and Wicklow with delivery ranging from 2023-2025. This includes the units listed above. WCC is in negotiations in respect of over 100 further units with delivery dates yet to be confirmed.

Wicklow County Council is currently holding discussions with a number of developers at preplanning and planning stage. There are over 100 potential Part V units with planning permission but it's difficult to determine whether they will all proceed or even on what timescale.

Croí Cónaithe (Towns, Cities and Rural) – Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant

The Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant is a payment you can get if you are turning a vacant house or building into your permanent home or a rental property. The grant applies to qualifying vacant properties in cities, towns, villages and rural parts of the country.

A grant of up to €70,000 is available.

If the refurbishment costs exceed the standard grant of up to €50,000, a top-up grant amount of up to €20,000 is available.

To qualify for the grant, applicants must:



- have proof of ownership or evidence of active negotiations to buy the property (that is, confirmation of
 engagement from the estate agent or owner of the property) where you are seeking approval in principle
 for a grant.
- live in the property as your principal private residence or make it available for rent.
- have proof that the property has been vacant for at least 2 years and that it was built up to and including 2007.

Affordable Housing

Greenhill Road Affordable Housing Scheme was launched to the public for applications on 09/01/2023, and closed on 30/01/2023. There was a lot of interest from the public and Wicklow County Council received over 140 applications for the 36 properties. Wicklow County Council are currently 'sale agreed' on all the 36 units. – 10 of the sales have now closed.

Wicklow County Council also received approval for future affordable housing schemes in the county in the past month – one development in Rathnew (44) and another in Baltinglass (22),

Baltinglass - Portal closing on 4th October for these 22 units

Rathnew - Site to be completed approx. August 2024 – properties will be advertised for sale in early 2024

Wicklow County Council also has plans for further developments throughout the county.

Housing Maintenance - Boiler servicing & safety checking campaign

The focus now is on servicing and safety checking of 1416 Oil and 2269 Gas boilers around the county. Contractors are reporting **access rates as low as 60%** which is surprising given the current "Cost of Living" crisis with high fuel costs. It is in tenants' interests to ensure that they provide access to contractors to service and safety check boilers. Oil boilers in particular will consume more fuel if soot build



up is not removed at the annual service. Also important checks and replacement of components such as fuel hoses are carried out on oil boilers which prevents expensive loss of fuel and environmental damage which is extremely expensive to clean up. All new boilers fitted now are condensing boilers which have higher thermal efficiency and use less fuel.

The Homeless HAP Place finder provides assistance in:

- > seeking out potential properties suitable for households currently identified as homeless or at risk of homelessness;
- > liaising with specific households to establish their specific needs;
- > establishing relationships with local property agents and landlords; and,



- > supporting those homeless households to (a) prevent the necessity to enter emergency accommodation or (b) to exit emergency accommodation and secure a tenancy.
- ➤ To date, 486 households (345 families & 136 singles) have been assisted under the Homeless HAP Scheme in Wicklow County Council from the inception on 1st October, 2018 to 30th November 2023. (204 homeless cases, 270 prevention cases to date and 11 direct provision). 132 properties were sourced by WCC.

Addressing Homelessness in partnership with Approved Housing Bodies

Homeless Supported Temporary Accommodation - Kilmantin Hill, Wicklow

Kilmantain Hill has 11 rooms to support persons either homeless, exiting a higher support facility or in danger of becoming homeless.

There are 10 clients supported in the Kilmantin Hill facility, operated by Dublin Simon, with continuing transition by the clients to suitable, alternative accommodation at the moment.

Homeless Family Service - Fitzwilliam Road, Wicklow

Dublin Simon has been engaged by Wicklow County Council to operate and manage the facility at Fitzwilliam Road, Wicklow as a Family Homeless Service. The building comprises of 3 x 1 bed units 2 x 2 bed units and 2 x 3 bed units – Nine families have now transitioned or are in the process of transitioning to a permanent home and the resulting vacancies are in the process of being occupied with families experiencing or in danger of homelessness

It is envisaged that families will avail of the service for circa 6 month STA (Supported Temporary Accommodation) with key working support to enable family's transition from homelessness into Homeless HAP or alternative longer term accommodation.

Homeless Supported Temporary Accommodation - San Remo, Bray

San Remo is operated by Dublin Simon, incorporates a service model where there are a number of emergency/cold weather initiative Beds and Supported Temporary Accommodation Beds (STA). There is on site key working support linking in with clients. CWI (Cold Weather Initiative)beds are now in operation in San Remo and will continue until Aoril 2024.

The Neighbourhood Liaison Committee is now operational and meets monthly.

Bi- monthly meetings are held with Dublin Simon and Wicklow County Council staff

Homeless Supported Accommodation - Carraig Eden, Greystones

The facility providing 35 ensuite bedrooms with associated kitchens and common areas is fully operational. Wicklow County Council run an in-reach service with the clients to support them as they continue their journey into more permanent accommodation.

Other Homeless Supported Accommodation

Wicklow County Council owned properties in Wicklow, Bray and Greystones, leased to AHBs, provide 12 units of low to medium supported accommodation targeted to the particular support needs of the clients. Six of these persons living in shared accommodation have now successfully moved into there forever homes and this in turn create space to move further people out of homelessness.

A homeless outreach service has been rolled out in Bray and is proving very successful



Housing First

Peter McVerry Trust has been appointed as the Housing First Programme Implementer for the Mid-East Region. Wicklow County Council is committed to working with them and has now reached and surpassed the targets identified in the programme. Housing first recognises that a stable home provides the basis for recovery in other areas.

Properties will be provided by both Wicklow County Council and Peter McVerry Trust for the implementation of the programme.

Wicklow County Council has, to date, successfully accommodated 19 clients under Housing First and it is hoped that at least one further allocation will take place before the end of 2023. Other clients proposed for Housing First have been assessed by the team and are availing of key support work pending finalisation of sourcing of accommodation – the main issue facing this programme is the availability of one bed units in suitable locations with easy access to services etc.

Energy Efficiency Fabric Upgrade Phase 2

All 71 properties given approval for energy efficiency fabric upgrade works in 2022 have been completed. Surveying of the houses identified for 2023 Programme is substantially completed and approx 35 have commenced on site.

Ukrainian Response

 As of 31st October, the numbers of Ukrainians Displaced Persons in emergency type accommodation is 1,715 (although we know that there are considerably more in the County)

- WCC are currently assessing all Displaced Ukrainians persons in the County in order to identify their accommodation needs as well linking them in with all the relevant services and supports within the community.
- WCC are working through a list of pledged properties within the County and matching families accordingly. As of the 15th November we will have housed 240 number displaced Ukrainian people into pledged stand-alone Offer a Home properties
 Larger buildings and vacant units are also being identified and explored as potential options for medium to long term accommodation.
- The Community Response Forum continues to meet on a monthly basis

County Wicklow Age Friendly Programme

County Wicklow Age Friendly Strategy 2023-27

Action 1.6 Walkability Audits

Aughrim: Walkability Audit carried out July 2023, co-ordinated by the Age Friendly Ireland Regional Manager Southeast (Alice Corbett) and the County Wicklow Age Friendly Programme Manager (Clodagh Whelan). A diverse group of local community participants, with a mix of abilities and disabilities, included Kunstverein, Aughrim, Tidy Towns and Active Retirement Group representatives.

The audit report has been circulated to relevant stakeholders. The Age Friendly Programme Manager met with Municipal District Administrator and Executive Engineers on 14th November to discuss action plan to address some of the recommendations from the walkability audit.

Avondale House: Members of the new Older People's Council (OPC) Executive Group participated in a guided tour of Avondale House, to audit the accessibility of the venue and experience for older people. The walkability audit was co-ordinated by the Age Friendly Ireland's Regional Manager South-East and Age Friendly Programme Manager for County Wicklow. Overall feedback on the venue and the experience was very positive. Detailed feedback has been sent to Coillte Operations Team by the Age Friendly Ireland Regional Manager.

Action 3.8 Appoint Healthy Age Friendly Homes Co-ordinator & Rollout Wicklow Programme

Healthy Age Friendly Homes (HAFH) Programme – National Programme Manager, Mark Harrington, visited Wicklow County Council, on 3rd October 2023, to meet with Director of Services, to update on the rollout of the national programme in advance of the appointment of the local co-ordinator.

Aoife Mc Grath has been appointed as Regional Programme Manager, South East Region, by Age Friendly Ireland, and the local co-ordinator for County Wicklow is expected to commence early 2024.

Older People's Council, Executive Group - Meetings and Representation

Wicklow Age Friendly County Alliance

The multi-agency Wicklow Age Friendly County Alliance, which is chaired by the Chief Executive of Wicklow County Council, will meet next on 12th December, to review progress on implementation of the County Wicklow Age Friendly Strategy 2023-2027. This meeting will be held in West Wicklow.

National Age Friendly Achievement and Recognition Awards

Beyond the Trees Avondale has been shortlisted for the National Age Friendly Achievement and Recognition Awards, in the Business Innovation Category. The judges visited Avondale 2nd October. The decision of the judging panel is due to be announced at the annual Awards Ceremony on 30th November 2023, at Clayton Whites Hotel Wexford and hosted by Age Friendly Ireland.

Disability and Inclusion Steering Committee

The first Disability and Inclusion Strategy for County Wicklow was approved by the Disability and Inclusion Steering Committee (DISC) and presented to the full Council on 2nd October, by Laura O'Callaghan, Disability Information Officer (Disability Federation of Ireland). The strategy was proposed by Cllr Miriam Murphy, second by Cllr Tommy and adopted unanimously by the full Council. A formal launch event was held in the Arklow Bay Hotel on Thursday 2nd November.

CLÁR Funding Scheme

Rathdrum Cancer Support (€44,034) and Wicklow Irish Community Rapid Response (€50,000) were awarded funding under the CLÁR Funding Scheme (Measure 2: Mobility, Cancer Care and Community First Responders Transport). In total, Minister Humphreys announced over €2 million for 37 Vehicles for Mobility, Cancer Care and Community First Responders throughout the Country.

Successful applications under Measures 1 and 3 of CLÁR 2023 will be announced at a later date.

Town & Village Renewal Scheme 2023

Closing date for submissions of Expressions of Interest in the Town and Village Renewal Scheme 2023 was 5th October 2023. The TVRS23 Projects Assessment and Selection Panel, met in Wicklow County Council, on Tuesday 10th October, to determine which projects will be selected by Wicklow County Council for submission to the Department for Rural and Community Development this year.

All Expressions of Interest were assessed based on the eligibility criteria and priorities contained in the 2023 Town and Village Renewal Scheme Outline. The panel selected 5 projects for development into an application for grant funding. These were submitted to DRCD on 10th November 2023.

Creative Communities Engagement Officer

Marlena Murphy was recently appointed to the role of Creative Communities Engagement Officer and joined the Wicklow Arts Office team on Monday, 16th October 2023.

Marlena will be responsible for engaging proactively with relevant directorates and personnel, internal and external, and will be a key member of the Culture and Creativity team. She will work to promote and enhance access to, engagement with, and enjoyment of Ireland's culture and creativity. The role is part of the Creative Ireland Programme, which is an all-of-government initiative that aims to mainstream



creativity in the life of the nation so that individuals and communities can realize their full creative potential and promote individual, community, and national well-being.

'Way with Words' Returned to Blessington Library

On 13th and 14th October, the 'Way with Words' Literature Festival's packed fun filled programme featured a range of events that included readings, workshops and activities for all ages.

With 267 people in attendance across all 8 eight events, the programme included a performance of 'My delicious Hat' by Paul Timoney; a graphic novel workshop specifically for children and young people by award-winning writer by award-winning Aoife Dooley; writing workshops by Jane Clarke, William Ryan, and Tanya Farrelly, and an evening reading by Eithne Hand, David Butler and Jane Clarke.

The in-conversation with Edel Coffey moderated by local writer Olivia Fitzsimons has been rescheduled to Saturday 9th December.

Wicklow Music Teaching Residency

The Wicklow Music Teaching Residency is a partnership between the Wicklow County Arts Office and Music Network. County Wicklow residents aged 55 and over are invited to pick up musical instruments they used to play in times gone by and start playing again under the guidance of 'The Rossana Trio'.

This year's participants will receive tuition on uilleann pipes, whistle, flute, violin/fiddle or bodhrán with The Rossana Trio, comprising renowned musicians Mark Redmond (uilleann pipes, whistles, flute), Lynda O'Connor (violin/fiddle) and Robbie Walsh (bodhrán).

The closing date for applications was Wednesday 1st November 2023 at 2pm.

Wicklow Arts Office and Music Network have partnered to deliver the third edition of Music Teaching Residency to Wicklow. 'The Rossana Trio', comprising renowned musicians Mark Redmond (uilleann pipes, whistles, flute), Lynda O'Connor (violin/fiddle) and Robbie Walsh (bodhrán), will be based in the Wicklow County Campus, Rathnew for the duration of the residency.

This residency focuses encourages people aged 55 and over to return to playing an instrument and to share in the joy of group music-making. Participants will receive free tuition from the trio from November 2023 to March 2024.

Following an open call for participants, the Residency received 34 applications for 15 places on the programme. The selected participants include 7 men and 8 women, and they come from across Wicklow County including Arklow, Bellynerrin, Roundwood, Glenealy, Wicklow Town, Kilpedder, Delgany, Bray, Enniskerry and Greystones.

Creative Places Baltinglass

Completion of Baltinglass Mural

The longest mural in Ireland was completed on 18th October in Baltinglass as part of the Creative Places Baltinglass programme. The mural adorns the 58-metre-long hoarding at Belan Street and Mill Streets and depicts the formerly active railway station in the town.

To inform the project, historical photographs were sourced from the local Historical Society and local agricultural merchant Quinn's of Baltinglass. Sixteen local artists participated in the project, which took over two weeks to be completed. The once dull hoarding has been transformed and is now an attractive and colourful feature in Baltinglass.



Capacity Building Session

15 people attended a free 'Capacity Building' event for artists and creatives based in the Baltinglass area on Friday, 3rd November.

The session provided local artists and creative practitioners with an opportunity to connect and share whilst also gaining an insight into the recently launch Artist One-to-One Coaching scheme.

Wicklow Artist Salon

Over 60 people attended the sold-out Wicklow Artist Salon on Saturday 4th November 2023 in Kilruddery House.

As the final Salon in the 2023 series, five emerging/early career artists discussed their 'Influences' and explored art forms such experimental circus, dream pop, lens-based art, fiction, and documentary film.

Commemoration Programme for Jennie Wyse Power

Wicklow Arts Office held a two-day programme in Baltinglass on 17th and 18th November to celebrate Irish activist, feminist, politician and businesswoman Jennie Wyse Power's connection to County Wicklow as part of Creative Places Baltinglass and supported through the Decade of Centenaries Programme (2012 - 2023) funded by the Department of Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport and Media.

The programme included the unveiling of two new commissions, a tapestry portrait of Jennie Wyse Power by Visual Artist Sarah Bracken Soper and a commemorative poetry collection by Wicklow Poet Jane Clarke alongside five free creative hands-on workshops for young people and adults.

YARN Storytelling Festival 2023

YARN Storytelling Festival 2023 returned to County Wicklow from 11th - 23rd November 2023. To celebrate its 14th edition, Mermaid Arts Centre devised a unique programme brimming with some of Ireland's finest storytellers alongside international guests such as Monique Burg from France and the 2023 Storyteller in Residence, Philip Byrne.

Exciting activities are in full swing at Ballywaltrim Library, offering a diverse range of opportunities for community engagement.





Social Inclusion Community Activation Programme (SICAP):

Tendering process for the new 2024-2028 contracts continues. A negotiation process with the tenderers has recently concluded and it is envisaged that contracts will be finalised and signed before end December to ensure the new programme commences on January 1st 2024.

Current SICAP contract 2018-2023 continues to be successfully implemented across the county by Bray Area Partnership and Co. Wicklow Partnership in supporting those most disadvantaged, namely long-term unemployed, those living in disadvantaged areas, lone parents, people with disabilities, Travellers, those with low educational attainment etc.

Economic Development, Planning, and Infrastructure

1. Economic Development

Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP) 2023 – 2029

The Local Economic and Community Plan Framework (LECP) was approved by the elected members of Wicklow County Council and the first two-year implementation plan is currently being finalised.

Town Regeneration

Blessington Town Centre First Masterplan

Blessington is a pathfinder town and is the first to receive funding for a Town Centre First Masterplan. Luc Consultants have been awarded the contract to develop the Masterplan which is expected to be complete by mid-November. The Masterplan will provide Blessington with a clear framework to positively develop the town now and into the future.

On Friday the 27th October a public consultation and exhibition took place in Blessington Library. Members from the design team MKO were present to answer any questions from the public along with members of the Town Regeneration Team and Blessington Town Team. The exhibition was open for a week which allowed the public to come and view the exhibition and give their views and ideas.

Blessington Town Team

A working group made up of members of the Blessington Town team has been established to oversee the implementation of the Town First Policy.

Arklow Town Team

The Town Team have received additional funding for the Arklow Pottery Website, which has now been extended to include more stories and experiences from pottery staff along with photographs of Arklow pottery pieces. The reprint of the Pottery Trail brochure has now been completed.

The Town Team in collaboration with Arklow Tidy Towns and Arklow Coastcare have produced signage to display around the South Quay and South Beach area to encourage visitors to the water ways to remove at least three pieces of plastic.

An open day event will be held in the New Year to attract new members as well as showcase the work and projects completed by the Team since its inception.



Bray Town Team

A meeting took place recently between Urban Mode and the Town Team Steering Group to further discuss the establishment of a Bray Town Team.

Greystones Town Team

"Christmas in Greystones" begins on 18th November 2023 and the "Christmas Plaza Market" will open every weekend up to Christmas.

The Sustainable Greystones team will have representatives attending the National Street Feast 2024 organisers in a seminar in LinkedIn to explain the Greystones template to other communities nationally.

Wicklow Town Team

The Wicklow Murals – South Quay Connectivity Project: All six murals have been painted and public feedback has been fantastic. As part of this project the committee has commissioned Wicklow artist, Emma Jane Rushworth to create a Wicklow Heron sculpture which will be placed at South Quay (beside the Scouts Hall) overlooking the Quays.

Rural and Urban Regeneration Development Fund Grant Applications

Steering Group for the Progression of URDF and RRDF Projects

The Chief Executive has established an interdisciplinary team for the progression of Wicklow County Council's URDF (Urban Regeneration and Development Projects) and RRDF (Rural Regeneration and Development Projects) projects. The group will meet monthly to streamline the advancement of RRDF and URDF projects along with a working sub group that will meet fortnightly and report to the steering group. This is a significant step in setting up the structures for town regeneration in the County.

Blessington RRDF: Blessington has been awarded over €1m funding under the Rural Regeneration Development Fund (RRDF) to be used for the regeneration of Blessington Town Centre, the development of plans for public realm works, the redevelopment of a vacant/derelict property to create an eHub and a Visitor Centre for the forthcoming Blessington Lakes eGreenway.

Baltinglass RRDF: The costings for Baltinglass Gateway to Southwest Wicklow have come in over budget on both the public realm and the Courthouse refurbishment. The proposals have been revised and the



necessary technical plans are complete in order for the works to commence. Works on the Public Park and playground are underway.

Newtownmountkennedy RRDF: The project is under review at present due to revisions necessary to the public realm, due to contested issues regarding the design of the public realm. Following the necessary revisions, it is hoped that agreement will be reached, the plans will be signed off and submitted for Category 1 funding.

URDF: Urban Regeneration Development Fund

URDF Call 3: The URDF announced recently that Wicklow will receive €2.5 million to assist long term vacancy and dereliction. Four properties have been chosen (two in Arklow and two in Wicklow) and the process has commenced in acquiring these properties. An information gathering notice has been published on a number of the properties seeking information to be directed to the Council.

Bray Harbour Improvements: Work has commenced on preparing tender documents for the procurement of engineering consultancy services for the purpose of producing detailed designs, environmental reports and an application to An Bord Pleanala for the proposed improvement works at Bray Harbour. The tender will be issued when the URDF funding has been confirmed for the next phase of the project.

Tourism

Social Media Campaign: McKennaCreative has been engaged to run an extensive social media campaign from mid-October to the end of the year. The campaign started off with the Halloween festivities around Wicklow and has now moved into 'Christmas in Wicklow', highlighting events and activities taking place during the holiday season.

EcoTrail Wicklow: Wicklow County Council through EcoTrail Wicklow was invited by Failte Ireland to travel to the Festival des Templiers in the Occitanie region in the South of France. The Templiers Festival is a three day event and is one of the largest trail running events in France, with 13,000 participants. The objective of the trip was to see the involvement of the local and regional tourism boards in such events. The trip will help improve EcoTrail Wicklow's festival atmosphere and develop Wicklow as a Trail Running destination.



Abbey Grounds, Wicklow

Regular meetings continue to take place with the Project Management Team for the Abbey Grounds. A structural engineer and quantity surveyor has been appointed to progress the works on the Coach House/Café. Public lighting design, mechanical and electrical works for the project is advancing also. A detailed archaeological survey of the existing ruins is being carried out.

Wicklow County Campus Masterplan

Wicklow County Council will use the Masterplan to act as a catalyst for economic development in the county and attract investment and further development. Expected delivery of the Masterplan is the end of January 2024.

Special Projects

Greystones Enterprise Centre: The purchase of the Enterprise Space in Greystones is expected to be completed by mid-November.

Sites on Mill Road, Greystones: Progress on the Mill Road sites is on hold pending PRA confirmation of site registration.

Carnew Remote Working Hub: A tender has issued for the design of the former Bank of Ireland building in Carnew for the provision of a remote working hub and ancillary facilities.

Marketing Plan: It is expected that a consultant will be appointed before the end of 2023 to develop a Marketing Plan for County Wicklow, highlighting the availability of Remote Working Hubs and Broadband Connection Points.

Offshore Renewable Energy

The Offshore Renewable Energy (ORE) Network continues to meet regularly and engage with the offshore renewable energy companies who are developing proposals off the coast of County Wicklow.

Skills Strategy

The Draft Skills Strategy will be presented to the Skills Taskforce in November and is expected to launch early in 2024.



Food and Beverage Strategy

Work continues on the development of an Action Plan to achieve objectives set out in the Wicklow Food and Beverage Strategy.

OctoberFeast, a festival telling the story of Wicklow Naturally members, ran throughout October and proved a big success with well attended events.

The Wicklow Naturally co-ordinator contract has now ended. However, the team have plans in place to continue to promote the Wicklow Naturally brand and its objectives.

Regional Enterprise Innovation Scoping Scheme (REISS)

A Priming Grant of €199,600 was awarded to Clermont Enterprise Hub CLG from Enterprise Ireland's Regional Enterprise Innovation Scoping Scheme (REISS) for the provision of Design Services for a Food Incubation Development Hub at Wicklow County Campus.

Variation No. 1 to the CDP (Rathdrum Town Plan)

Variation No. 1 to the County Development Plan was adopted and came into effect on 06 November 2023. The variation is in relation to Rathdrum Town Plan and is to rezone 0.81ha of land at Ballygannon, Rathdrum, from 'RN – New Residential' to 'OS2 – Passive Open Space' and amend the written text of the Rathdrum Town Plan to reflect the changes consequent from the rezoning.

The proposed variation went on public display for a period of 4 weeks until 03 October 2023, with 9 Submissions received. A Chief Executive's report was prepared on the submissions received. This report was issued to the Elected Members for their consideration. All relevant documents are available online to view.

Local Area Plans

Work is ongoing on the preparation on three new LAPs for 'Wicklow Town & Rathnew', 'Greystones – Delgany & Kilcoole' and 'Blessington'.

Pre-draft consultation closed for the new Wicklow Town & Rathnew Local Area Plan. Submissions were invited up to 28th September 2023 and are currently being assessed. All valid submissions will be reviewed and considered and a draft plan prepared. Once the draft plan is prepared it will go out on public consultation for 6 weeks with submissions invited.

The team are at the data gathering and surveying stage and are in the process of preparing the online consultation web portal for the pre-draft consultations for Greystones – Delgany and Kilcoole as well as Blessington. It is intended to start pre-draft plan public consultation for Greystones – Delgany & Kilcoole and Blessington in Q4 2023.

Consultants have been appointed to carry out the SEA and AA for the three LAPs and they have commenced their preliminary work. All other studies / assessments are intended at this time to be carried out in-house.

RZLT – Residential Zoned Land Tax

By Circular letter NRUP 02/2023 the Minister has advised that the first liability date for the tax is proposed to be deferred from 1st February 2024 to 1st February 2025. The deferral is only to delay the liability for the tax, and final maps will still be required to be published on 1st December 2023 and updated in 2024 and 2025.



The intention of the proposed deferral as announced in Budget 2024 is to allow a further opportunity for landowners to engage with the mapping process in 2024 and to make representations regarding rezoning after publication of the draft map on 1st February 2024.

This proposed deferral will provide time for the adoption of local area plans and the removal of rezoned land prior to publication of a final map on 31st January 2025.

Vacant Site Levy

This programme is still ongoing and is affected by the proposed deferral of the RZLT. As liability to the RZLT is now proposed to be deferred for one year, it is considered appropriate to maintain provisions in legislation for the management and continued charging of the vacant site levy in respect of land which is identified on the register. This will continue to facilitate imminent placements on the register, conclusion of appeals and to facilitate the issuing of demands in relation to the levy for the period to the end of 2024. This will ensure that the use of the levy as an active land management measure will continue until the RZLT is in effect.

GIS database created to document Early Medieval Church Sites and Historic graves and headstones. Public talks held in Tinahely on 10th September and in Rathdangan on 16th October.

Conservation Management of Council owned lands (Climate Action): Conservation Management prescriptions and recommendations drafted in consultation with local stakeholders to increase the climate resilience of Council owned land at Bray Head and address recreational and other pressures. Presented at the Bray MD meeting on 3rd October and officially adopted by members.

Archaeology: Community Monuments Fund- CMF 2023 is co-ordinated on behalf of Wicklow County Council by the Heritage Office. Applications received from private landowners, community groups, public authorities and other custodians of archaeological heritage. Five projects were approved for a total budget of €108,174 as follows; Drumgoff Barracks €5,000; Kilpipe Church and Graveyard €30,523; Newcastle Castle €29,982; West Wicklow Historic Graveyards €30,000; Derralossary Church and graveyard interpretation €12,669. All projects underway. Recoupments due 17th November.

Built Heritage Capital Funds (Architecture): The allocation for Wicklow under the Built Heritage Investment Scheme (BHIS) is €101,000 with 2 approved projects under the Historic Structures Fund (HSF)- Crusher House, Barravore (stream1) €35,000 and Cronroe Gardeners cottage (vernacular) €10,000.

E-Planning Project.

The ePlanning system went live on 17th April 2023 with applications being submitted online almost immediately. Since going live **49.18%** of applications have been received online (789 received in total: 388 through eplanning and 401 hard copy). The copper dome, an iconic structure, was reinstated on top of the lighthouse recently, following a major restoration job by Arklow Marine Services on behalf of Wicklow County Council.

The original copper dome dating back to 1884 disappeared in a winter storm in 1976. It was retrieved by local fishermen and divers and was stored in a boatyard on the seafront up until it closed in the eighties.

M11N11 Junction 4 to 14 Improvement Scheme

The Option Selection report was published along with Bulletin #11 on the project website www.n11m11.ie on 14 December 2021. The publication followed the review of submissions received during public display in 2021. Phase 3 Design and Environmental Evaluation was due to commence in Q1 2022. The scheme is currently suspended as no funding was provided to continue during 2022 or 2023. The Wicklow County Council project team are continuing to meet with the public and any interested parties.

M11N11 Bus Priority Interim Scheme

The BPIS seeks to achieve the early delivery of bus priority measures in advance of the main scheme between Loughlinstown Roundabout and Junction 9 (Glenview). The scheme is currently at the Options Selection phase (Phase 2 of TII's Project Management Guidelines).

A non-statutory public display on the emerging preferred options for sections A and C took place in November 2022. Following further analysis, an emerging preferred option for the provision of bus priority measures between Junction 6 (Fassaroe) and Junction 8 (Kilmacanogue) have now been identified. A Public Display event was held in the Glenview Hotel on 12th September 2023. The display presented the overall preferred option for the BPIS between Loughlinstown Roundabout and Junction 9 (Glenview). The public display documents are available to view on the project website www.n11m11bpis.ie. The deadline for receipt of Submissions on the emerging preferred option has closed on the 3rd November 2023. The Project Team are now considering the submissions received.

N11 Parallel Service Road at Kilmacanogue

A noise assessment for the 7 no residential properties to the east of the new Parallel Service Road Scheme was carried out during April and May 2022. The options review and design commenced in March 2023 following confirmation of funding from TII. Site investigation works were completed on the 9th and 10th November 2023. This information is necessary to inform the final design option selected and is currently under review by the Design Team.

N81 Knockroe Bend Realignment

Tenders for a Per-Cent Art Feature are being procured by the Arts Office. The preferred feature has been selected pending the completion of the final assessment stage.

N81 Irishtown West, Whitestown Lower, Hangman's Bend and Tuckmill Lower "N81 Four Studies"

Following completion of Phase 1 feasibility studies (The N81 Four Studies – Feasibility Report), Wicklow County Council are now progressing the following two projects:

- N81 Whitestown Lower Project; and
- N81 Hangman's Bend and Tuckmill Project.

The Phase 2 Options Selection work is currently progressing under TII's Project Management Guidelines.

N81 Pavement Capital Works

Resurfacing works of 1km of the N81 between Tuckmill and Saundersgrove is expected to be carried out in 2023.

N81 Rural Traffic Calming & Bus Stop at Hollywood

The Feasibility and Options report is being finalised for submission to TII for approval and funding to proceed to the design stage.



Park & Ride/Share at Hollywood

A feasibility report, funded by the Baltinglass Municipal District was prepared and submitted to TII in Oct 2021. This report considered an option for parking accessed from the N81. TII subsequently provided funding to further examine the feasibility and options.

TII have indicated that they do not support the proposed additional access to the N81. As a result, the option for a parking facility accessed from the N81 has been discounted from the current scheme. A way forward is to consider suitable parking locations that can be accessed from the regional/local road network.

N11 Pavement Resurfacing Works

N11 surfacing works between junctions 7 and 16 will be carried out by the N11 maintenance contractor over the period from May to September 2023. Surfacing works have been between Junction 5 and Junction 7 on the M11 southbound and northbound were completed during September and October 2023. These works were carried out at night to minimise traffic disruption.

N11/M11 Park & Ride Facilities

Proposals for bus based Park & Ride facilities are being progressed adjacent to the N11/M11 at Junctions 6, 11 and 16. A part 8 for the Park and Ride at Junction 6 Fassaroe commenced on Wednesday 23rd August 2023 with plans and documents on public display until Wednesday 20th September 2023. Submissions or observations were accepted on or before 12 noon on Wednesday 4th October 2023. The Chief Executives report was presented to the full council meeting of Wicklow Co. Co. on the 6th November 2023 where it was passed following a vote by the councillors.

Arklow Public Realm

The Parade Ground Public Realm works have reached a significant milestone, with substantial completion and successful snagging. Currently, the project is in the 12-month defects period, during which any necessary remedial works are addressed. The contractor has approached the conciliator to discuss the appointment and agree on a mutually acceptable timeline for the resolution of any remaining issues. David O'Leary MKM Dispute Resolution appointed as conciliator. Conciliation meeting took place on the 17th and 18th October, final settlement agreement confirmed. Meeting with URDF, DoHLGH regarding drawdown of additional funding.

Arklow to Shillelagh Greenway

A successful non statutory public consultation event was held on the emerging preferred route in September and October where more than 100 submissions were received. We are currently in the process of reviewing submission received as part of the public consultation process and are in the final stages of Phase 2 Options Selection, which will determine the preferred route for the Greenway before moving on to Phase 3, involving Design and Environmental Evaluation.

Baltinglass Town Centre Plan

The consultants are actively engaged in preparing documents for the delivery of a revised tender package for the town centre works, focusing on a reduced scope. Simultaneously, they are conducting a value engineering exercise specifically targeted at this aspect of the project. The objective is to bring the scheme within the budget limits currently in place. Reduced scope town centre works presented at Baltinglass Municipal District meeting. Final tender package issued by Arup. The direct labour crew have met regarding the undergrounding of utilities to de-risk project. Setting out of services by direct labour crew has been carried out. Meeting took place with ESB, Eir, and Enerveo to check provisions for utilities Arup to make design changes to advance undergrounding.

Blessington Inner Relief Road

The current focus of the project is on the detailed design phase, including the preparation of associated documents such as the Compulsory Purchase Order (CPO) documentation. These efforts are crucial in order to advance the scheme towards obtaining statutory approval. Given the potential impact of the project on the Poulaphuca Special Protection Area (SPA), it is necessary to prepare a Natura Impact Statement (NIS) to assess and document any potential effects on the SPA. Once the detailed design and associated documents, including the NIS, are completed, the project will proceed to seek statutory approval from An Bord Pleanála.



Wicklow County Council Compulsory Purchase (Chapel Road Pedestrian and Cycle Infrastructure Improvement Scheme) No. 1 Order 2021

The Notice to Treat was issued on all landowners in October 2023. Consultants are making steady progress in the detailed design phase and are currently focused on preparing the tender documents for the construction phase which are anticipated to be issued in December of 2023.

Wicklow Greystones Greenway

Wicklow County Council has recently engaged consultants Atkins for the project and their work is already in progress, focusing on data gathering. Additionally, the consultants are actively organizing detailed environmental surveys, which will play a vital role in shaping the route options and conducting constraint studies.

In April, a productive meeting took place with Irish Rail concerning the East Coast Rail Infrastructure Protection Project. During this meeting, an agreement was reached to facilitate the sharing of environmental data, fostering collaboration between the involved parties.

Meeting with the National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) took place in June. The meeting provided an opportunity to engage with the NPWS and discuss important aspects related to the project.

Atkins and Irish Rail consultants Jacobs are in communication regarding environmental surveys with a further joint meeting taking place in late August. Constraints Report has been finalised. Landownership maps are being completed. Stage 1 Route Corridor Assessment is being progressed. Draft public consultation material is being developed.

Independent agronomist appointed for the scheme.

Blessington eGreenway

Under Section 177AE of the Planning and Development Act, we have formally submitted our planning documents to An Bord Pleanála. Given the need to conduct comprehensive additional surveys and generate a substantial volume of supporting material, An Bord Pleanála has agreed to extend the submission deadline to January 2024. We are diligently working on preparing our response to meet this revised deadline.

Active Travel Updates - October 2023

Completed Projects

Priory Road Footpath (Greystones MD)

Provision of new footpath on Priory Road, Delgany linking the new Archers Wood and Eden Gate developments to Delgany village.

Projects under Construction

Arklow North Cycle and Pedestrian Scheme (Arklow MD)

The construction of cycle and pedestrian facilities on the R-772 Dublin Road. The scheme involves construction of a footpath and segregated cycle facilities on the R-772 between the M11 Junction 11. The works are substantially completed with road resurfacing and cycle track surfacing works to be completed in November. There is a requirement for a utility Contractor to install cable ducting in the carriageway to facilitate a network of proposed solar farms in the area. WCC are unable to complete the remaining surfacing works until the cable ducting has been installed. The cable ducting works are scheduled to be completed by November 17th, and WCC have scheduled to commence the road resurfacing works after this. It is anticipated that all works on Arklow North will be completed by the end of November.

Arklow South Cycle and Pedestrian Scheme (Arklow MD)

Provision of 2.8km of segregated cycle track along the R-772 Wexford Road, Arklow between Knockmore Roundabout and M11 Junction 21. The scheme will also construct 1.4km approx. of pedestrian footpath. Works continue to progress, with drainage and utility works on northbound carriage to be completed. Accommodation works have been completed on the southbound carriageway. Preparations will begin for slip form kerbing on the northbound carriageway.



Bellevue Junction Improvement works in Delgany (Greystones MD)

Upgrading of the junction of the R-762 and Bellevue Hill. The project will improve pedestrian accessibility and safety and enhance village centre aesthetics by widening and landscaping the paved pedestrian areas, upgrading public transport facilities, undergrounding services, and upgrading public lighting. Surfacing to be completed.

Kilcoole Road Pedestrian and Cycle Improvements (Greystones MD)

Provision of 500m of new footpath and 500m of cycle track along the R-761. Works are being progressed by the NTA deliverables team. Project nearing completion, with cycle track surfacing works to be completed.

Safe Routes to Schools: St. Kevin's National School, Greystones (Greystones MD)

Provide infrastructure for schools to increase walking and cycling as the preferred travel mode where possible and improve safety at front of schools. Front of school implementation works are substantially completed. Waiting on ESB power disconnection for signage. High friction surfacing has been completed.

Safe Routes to Schools: St. Johns Senior National School, Arklow (Arklow MD)

Provide infrastructure for schools to increase walking and cycling as the preferred travel mode where possible and improve safety at front of schools. Front of school implementation works are substantially completed. High friction surfacing works are contractor and weather dependent at this time of year.

Safe Routes to Schools: SS Michael and Peter Junior School (Arklow MD)

Proposals to improve road safety and make the areas adjacent to the schools safer, so that children can be encouraged and facilitated to walk and cycle to the schools safely. Construction works are substantially completed. High friction surfacing works are contractor and weather dependent at this time of year.

Project Updates

Bray Dart Interchange (Bray MD)

New plaza and public transport interchange in front of Bray DART station, with revised car parking, set down and taxi rank arrangements. Contract to be signed with Contractor. Legal agreements to be signed.

Wicklow Active Travel Pathfinder Project (Wicklow MD)

Provision of new and improved pedestrian and cycle facilities along Marlton Road, Rocky Road, R-750 and Station Road to provide strategic routes to Wicklow Train Station. Baseline Assessment and Rapid Build Options Report to be prepared by DBFL and issued to NTA.

Greystones Active Travel - Pathfinder Project (Greystones MD)

Provision of new and improved pedestrian and cycle links to Greystones Train Station. The spine route extends from Greystones Marina to Shoreline Sports Centre. The project will include improved pedestrian and cycle crossings along the Charlesland Dual Carriageway. Detail design of roundabout issued to NTA for approval to construction. Consultants to continue work on preliminary design of spine route.

Killincarrig Village Enhancement Scheme (Greystones MD)

Provision of improved pedestrian facilities and public realm improvements. Signed CE Part 8 report issued to Elected Members, to be discussed at the next District Meeting.

Ballyguilemore Active Travel Facilities (Wicklow MD)

Provision of new pedestrian facilities and road safety improvements along the Ballyguilemore Road between Carrig View and the entrance to the proposed new St. Patricks GAA Pitch. The scheme includes for new footpaths and road widening works. Part 8 CE Report has been completed and issued to WMD elected members. Will be included on the agenda for the November WMD meeting.

Ongoing consultation with landowners.

Convent Road (Greystones MD)

Design and implementation of safety and accessibility improvements on Convent Road. Work to commence on preliminary design. Meeting held with Elected Members and design consultants to discuss options assessment report, further meeting to be held with Delgany Community Council following their objection to the conclusion of the report.



Other News

The Active Travel team, along with Greystones Cathaoirleach Mark Barry and Cllrs. Derek Mitchell and Lourda Scott, were delighted to welcome Maaike van Koldam, the Ambassador of the Kingdom of the Netherlands to Greystones on Wednesday 8th November, along with members visiting from the Dutch Cycling Embassy and colleagues from the National Transport Authority to present details of our Active Travel policies and to showcase both past, present and future Active Travel schemes within the district.



Bridge Rehab works

The Bridge crew has completed repair and maintenance works at 13 bridges and another 2 have commenced in recent days.

The 2024 Works Plan has been sent to DTTAS for approval.

Machinery Yard

Works continue on the maintenance of council vehicles, plant and machinery. Winter maintenance machines are currently out in the districts as the season started last month.

A consultant has been appointed to compile the licence application for Dangerous Substances (oil, fuel, etc.). All the relevant paperwork is currently being prepared.

Invasive Species (Japanese Knotweed)

The contract to treat 110 sites on regional and local roads throughout the county is complete. The successful Contractor carried out the works and recording sites at the end of September. The list for next year has commenced with recording of queries from the public.

Winter Maintenance

The season started on Monday 15th October. 1 call out to date. Machinery Yard is finalising maintenance on some gritters. Winter Service Plan has been finalised and distributed to neighbouring authorities and agencies.



Salt supplies are currently being topped up from the national centres.

Operational Fire Statistics October 2023

There were **147** incidents attended during the month of October 2023. Due to laid down procedures to mobilise two stations to potentially serious incident types, individual Fire Stations were mobilised on a total of **169** occasions including **12** mobilisations in other counties. On no occasion did an incident commander request additional resources over what was prescribed in the Pre-Determined Attendance.

Operational activity for the month of October 2023 increased by 43% (51 mobilisations) on the preceding month (September 2023: 118 mobilisations). Most of this increase can be accounted for by the increase in bonfires and similar outdoor fires set maliciously in the run up to Halloween (monthly increase +35 incidents). There was also an increase in automatic fire alarm activations +7 (up from 21 to 28 in the month).

57% of incidents in Bray were bonfires, which represented 25% of all incidents across the county for the month.

Operational activity for the month of October 2023 was down 11% (20 mobilisations) on the equivalent month in 2022 (October 2022: 189 mobilisations). There was a decrease in domestic fires (-12 mobilisations), a decrease in gorse fires (-7 mobilisations).

124 new residential houses and 80 apartments were notified to LA for Commencement & 148 newly completed residential units plus 2 non-residential units were submitted, assessed and validated in September. BER certificates for all newly completed units were requested & submitted to Building Control as per S.I. No. 243/2012 - European Union (Energy Performance of Buildings) Regulations 2012.

5 No. 7 Day Commencement Notices for material change of use of existing commercial warehouses to be converted into Refugee Accommodation in Arklow were submitted in October. The proposed development is to provide accommodation for approximately 400 Refugees. The 5 Commencement Notices have not yet been validated and extensive Revised Information has been requested

Building Control continued with site inspections in October to identify non-compliances with Building Regs onsite and 4 Section 11 Compliance Requests were issued.

Revised Information requests were high in October for both Commencement Notices and Certificates of Compliance on Completion, 66% of Commencement Notice submissions & 58% of Certificate of Compliance on Completion



submissions required revised information. It should be further noted that some Opt Out Submissions are requiring 2 to 3 Revised information requests which results in submissions being assessed 2 to 3 times to ensure compliance prior to commencement.

Opt Out submissions are both extensions and single unit dwellings, generally from BCMS users who are unfamiliar with both BCMS and Building Regulations which leads to Building Control resources being directed to resolving both administration and technical issues with Opt-Out Submissions. Wicklow Building Control continues to perform rigorous assessment of submissions at commencement stage and onsite presence during construction. These methods remain the best way to promote compliance with Building Regs.

Online applications via www.checktheregister.ie continue to be received and processed daily.

We are continuing with our weekly social media campaign. We also forwarded static images to TD's, Councillors and Senators to share on their social media platforms. Letters, forms and posters have issued to all transition, fifth and sixth year heads to encourage voter registration from 18 year olds and pre-registration of 16 and 17 year olds. We have also liaised with all sports clubs in the county and requested that they put our media images on notice boards within the club facilities.

Wicklow County Council is the first local authority in Ireland to roll out the new software release of the new iReg database, having been involved in its development and testing and it is providing greater assistance in processing applications. This includes a quicker turnaround time and if there are queries regarding any aspect of the application we can contact the applicant much quicker to resolve any issues. This new system also provides for easier processing of applicants from other counties by automatically notifying the other local authority that the applicant has moved to Wicklow and to remove them from their database.

The Boundary Commission Report was issued at the end of August 2023 and we await the legalisation in relation to these changes.


