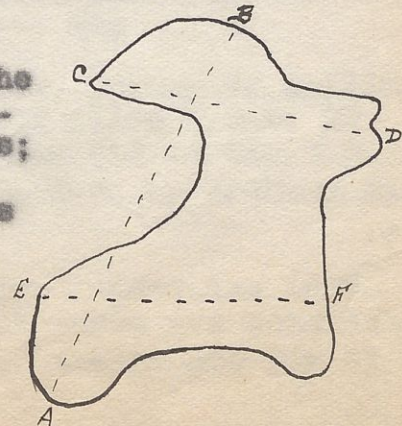

Contains 12154 acres 3 roods 27 pers. of which 3350 acres is uncultivated. An Impropritate Curacy (together with Kilnener) in the Diocese of Ferns, Province of Dublin.

The general appearance of the parish is bare and sterile owing to the large portion of uncultivated land which it contains. There are, however, some woods and plantations which diversify it, where they occur; one of considerable size in Coolalugg Townland in the West side of the Parish, another in Ballamanus Townland in the North side of the Parish and a third of considerable size called Rednagh Wood which is in Rednagh Townland; There are some patches of Plantation in the Townland of Clone and many of the Hedge Rows and fences through the Parish have trees growing in them. Shape irregular something like the adjoining Figure. The length from the South (A B) to the North (across part of the Ph. of Prebawn) is about seven and a half miles; breadth from C D about five miles, and E F about four and three quarters of a mile. The streams are numerous, but small, none having names except the Aughrim River which divides the parish from

Ballintemple and Ballykine Parishes; and the Derry River which divides it from Prebawn Ph. There are several bridges over the streams; those having names are Aughrim 3 Br., Rednagh Br., and Ballamanus Br. over the river Aughrim; Annacurrah Br. over the river Derry; Kilpipe Br., Rosmestraw Br., Mucklagh Br. & Killeavey Br. over small streams which have no particular names.

No Market Town in the parish; no Villages but the houses are rather numerous, some in clusters and others isolated, all stone; those having distinctive names are Rednagh House and Coolbawn House. There is a Police Station at Aughrim Br. and a corn mill at Kilpipe Br. There is no main road, but the bye roads, and lanes are sufficiently numerous and convenient for the agricultural purposes of the parish.

The altitude of the Parish above low water, varies from 180 feet in the vicinity of the Aughrim river, to 1985 feet, the summit of Croghan Mountain; several patches of marsh and bog throughout the parish. The Parish Church is in Curraghbawn Townland; no R. C. Chapel nor other place of worship; no schools. The antiquities are two forts, and the ruins of a church in the townland of Kilpipe, a fort in the Townland of Kilbawn & one in Clone, <sup>(1)</sup> gravel pits in the Ph.
