

night in those Wards we consider 4 visits to those wards sufficient for the night nurse to pay each night. We hereby order the night nurse to attend and go round with the Doctor on Mondays Wednesdays & Fridays between 9 o'clock and 11 am. but not later than 11. and order that she be permitted to sleep all day on the intervening days as we consider it physically impossible for the night nurse to be efficient if kept out of bed till 12 or 1 o'clock each day. We request the Doctor to leave his orders for the night nurse in writing. We order the night nurse when not engaged with patients to retire to her room and remove her light from the Wards as it is contrary to rules of local port Board to have a permanent light in the Wards.

Copy of a resolution forwarded by the Pl. Officers association with regard to the proposed local port Bill was read to the effect that it would be injurious to the interests of the Public Service and unfair to the Poor Law Officers to have the administration of the Public Health, Sanitation, Jurors, Diseases of Animals & other acts or such of them as might be transferred to the proposed County Councils taken out of the hands of a trained body of officials & handed over to new officers wholly unacquainted with their provisions & working & that the employees of the Poor Law Service were entitled to protection in the full enjoyment of the offices which they at present held, or to adequate compensation in the event of its being considered necessary to the symmetry of the proposed measure that they should be deprived of all or any of them.

Mr. Speares proposed & Mr. Apperley seconded the adoption of the resolution which was passed with the addenda moved by Mr. Apperley & seconded by Mr. Jordan. That we consider the compensation should be paid out of the consolidated fund or out of the three millions which the Financial Relations Commission state England takes from Ireland.
