In Barony of Upper Talbotstown & Co. Wicklow. Bounded on the North by Ballynure & Rathbran Pshes.; on the east by Donoughmore & Kilranelagh Pshes.; on the North by Co. Carlow and on the west by Co. Carlow and Ballynure Psh. Co. Wicklow.

This Parish is in the County of Wicklow and Province of Leinster, about 35 miles from Dublin. It contains about 7404 acres including detached T.ld. Ladystown. Nearly the whole of which is under cultivation. The Psh. forms a Union with Rathbran and Ballynure, is in the Diocese of Leighlin and is in the patronage of H. Carroll Esqre. of Ballynure. The church occupies the site of the Chancel 3 of the ancient Abbey. Some of the walls of the old abbey are standing close to the church and not far distant is the remains of the old castle occupied as a farm house. There is a R. C. Chapel in the town and National school close to the Chapel. There is also in the town a place of Worship for Methodists. The name Baltinglass derives its name from Baal-tin-glass signifying the pure fire of Baal and is thence supposed to have been one of the principal seats of Druidical worship. The Town is pleasantly situated in a romantic vale watered by the Slaney over which is a stone bridge of three arches connecting those parts of it which are on the opposite banks of the river. It consists of four principal streets with two or three others of less importance. There are infantry Barracks for one officer and 35 men which are now occupied by the Police force. There are two bleach grounds near the town. The market day is Friday and fairs are ~~held~~ held principally for Cattle & Pigs on the 2nd Feby., 17th March, 12th May, 1st July, 12th Septr. and 8th Decr. Until within the last few years the tolls and customs were recd. by the corporation but the collecting of them has been discontinued. Baltinglass was 4 an ancient borough & returned two members to Parliament but was disfranchised at the Union. It is a corporate town, the corporation consisting of a sovereign, deputy Sovereign, 12 Burgesses, Recorder & town Clerk, a sergeant at mace and a clerk of the market. The same Sovereign and Depy. Sovereign and other municipal officers have continued the same for the last six years. The Sovereign is also cornner but does not act as such. Burgesses are elected for life but have no functions to perform except the election of their own officers. For Lady E. Stratford's Schools see Description page 48 (MS.). The Court house and the District Bridewell may be said to be one building, the Barracks also join. Quarter Sessions are held at the Court house and Petty Sessions every alternate Friday.

Baltinglass Parish (contd.)

The District Bridewell consists of 10 cells, three day rooms, two airing yards, one school room & one infirmary or Hospital. There is a tread wheel on which three can be together but it cannot be used at present, being out of order. Besides the schools before mentioned there are four private ones. There is an excellent flour mill at the N.E.W. corner of the town, one wheel undershot, 18 feet in Diameter, 10 feet broad, capable of grinding 8,000 barrels of wheat in the year; 6,000 barrels have been ground in the year by three pairs of stones.
