I am directed by the Minister of Industry & Commerce to refer to your letter of 5th October from which it is noted that the Commissioners on the 9th October 1920 increased by resolution certain rates on traffic, with the exception of rates for Maunre traffic the other rates increases appear to be within the statutory maximum and your Commissioners will therefore appreciate that any increases of excess of the Statutory maxima which have not been authorized by order of the Minister in accordance with the Harbours Docks and Piers (Temporary increase of charges act 1920) are illegal.

The object of this act was to enable Statutory provisions regulating the charges to be temporarily modified to meet increased working costs so that an undertaking could be carried on without loss.

From an examination of the Wicklow Harbour Accounts for recent years it would seem that notwithstanding that practically no maintenance work was executed the income of the undertaking has not been sufficient to fully meet its liabilities and in the circumstances the Minister desires your Commissioners to fully consider the situation and to favour him with their observations thereon.

In connection therewith I am to request that you will submit with your reply a statement showing the loans at present outstanding the annual instalments
