


### A Chara

I am directed by the minister of Industry & Commerce to refer to your letter 25th October from which it is noted that the Commissioners on the 9th October 1920 increased by resolution certain rates on traffic, with the exception of rates for Manure traffic the other rate increases appear to be within the statutory maximum and your Commissioners will therefore appreciate that any increases of Excess of the Statutory maxima which have not been authorized by order of the Minister in accordance with the Harbours Docks and Purs temporary increase of Charges Act 1920 are legal The object of this act was to enable statutory provisions regulating the charges to be temporarily modified to meet increased working cost so That an undertaking could be carried on without loss

From an examination of the Wicklow
Harbour Accounts for recent years it would

to the High Court, The verdict of a Jury will not be set aside if there was any evidence to support it

In this case there was no evidence of a trap that is to say a concealed danger known to the defendants but of which the deceased was reasonably unaware

If the deceased was a mere license upon the defendants premises as distinguish from an invite, there was no duty to provide for his safety further than the duty not to leave a trap for him was the invitation limited to the open unobstructed road on the North side of the Pier which was lighted by the Lamp or did the deceased continue to be invited while expatiating at large over the pier If the House of Lords and especially Lord summer were right in the view held by them in Monsey Docks Co & Doctor 1923 H.C the deceased in this case was a mere licence when he was at the scene of the accident and on the evidence the defendants were entitled to a direction that there was no evidence of negligence fit to be left to the Jury In these circumstances I have no choice but to advise that the Commissioners should proceed with the appeal
