Donoughmore Psh. is in the County of Wicklow, in the Barony of Upper Talbotstown and Province of Leinster, four miles N.E. from Baltinglass and 29 miles from Dublin. The Inhabitants mostly frequent Baltinglass as their market and Post town. The mail coach road from Dublin through Baltinglass to New Ross passes through the West side of the Psh. for two and a half miles. The N., E. & S. sides are mountainous, the centre part is called the Glen of Imale. The Psh. is a Rectory and Vicarage in the

Donoughmore (Parish) (contd.)

Diocese of Dublin and the Archbishop of Dublin is the Patron. Tithes belong to the Rector. The church is to- 13 wards the west side of the Psh. in Donoughmore T.Ld. and the service is performed & by two Curates, the Rector being Non Resident. There is a pretty good Glebe house occupied by one of the Curates and there is Glebe land to the extent of about 23 acres. The R. C. Chapel is about ~~half~~ three fourths of a mile east of the church and is a long capacious building. The Parochial school house is close to the church and there are also school houses in Townlands Spinans East, Knockenarrigan & Kelshamore. The number of children in attendance varies according to the Season of the year.

The Parish contains 23,427 acres 2 roods 39 pers. about one third of which is mountain ground. On the east side of the Psh. is Lugnaquilla the highest mountain in Wicklow, being 3,039 feet above the sea. The summit of this mountain forms a kind of Table Land presenting a smooth green sod and is a fine sheep and cattle pasture for summer months. The Slaney River takes its source at a quarter of a mile North from the summit of this mountain and winds its course towards the west ~~th~~ through the middle of the Parish.

The only seats in the Psh. are two, Coolmoney (a good modern house) the residence of Lady L. Hutcheson, and Ballinaclea the residence of R. Fenton Esqre. They are both situated in the centre of the Psh. and command fine views of the surrounding mountain scenery.

At Knocknamunnion is a factory for making blankets and fraize, but it has only a supply of water about eight months in the year. The wheel is breast-wheel, 14 feet in diameter, 3 feet broad, capable of milling 50 yards of cloth per diem. Cost of milling 12d. per yard. There is a spinning machine in the factory propelled by the hand capable of spinning 2 stone of wool\ per diem. Cost of spinning 3s. 2d. per ~~x~~ stone.

The County Cess laid on for the Parish at the summer Assizes of 1837 was £416. 0s. 8 $\frac{1}{4}$ d.

~~After~~ After the Disturbances of '98 a Barrack was erected at the foot of the mountains in Leitrim T.Ld. but it has been lately disposed of to a Private individual.

In Lower Castleruddery T.Ld. is a Druidical Circle of stones about 90 feet in diameter. Forty two large stones form the ring, two of which have very thick coatings of quartz. Skeletons of the Elk have been found in a pond

a quarter of a mile S.E. of this ancient circle. According to tradition there was formerly a convent in Kelshamore T.Ld. but the site of it can only be pointed out. Very close to the site of the Convent is shewn the site of a grave yard called by the old people Cregghorn where quantities of human bones were dug up about 12 years ago. In Castle quarter T.Ld. are the ruins of a Church and Castle pretty close to one another, but parts only of the foundations can be traced. The ruins of the church is in a very small grave yard not now in use. In Ballintruerbeg is the ruin of a Castle, the E. and S. walls only partly standing, the highest part (the S.E. corner) is only about 12 feet. The site of a Castle is pointed out in Upper Ballyhubbock and there was formerly a Castle in Lower Castleruddery where now Castleruddery House stands. In Stranahely T.Ld. is shewn a spot where it is said Cavanagh (an Irish commander) had a camp. The ruins of two large houses built by Col. Percy about the year 1700, one at Sesking and the other at Snugborough are still to be seen. Some of the side walls yet remaining. The former is now the property of the Earl of Wicklow and the latter that 15 of H. H. Cooper Esqre. of Shrewl Castle, Carlow. There are several Baths and moats in the Psh. the two most worthy of notice are those in Knockendaragh and Lower & Castleruddery. On the top of the hill in Brusselstown there is an ancient Ring enclosing an area of about 10½ acres. The ring is formed of large unhewn blocks of stones piled up several feet high. It is a splendid object of antiquity. The north, east and south sides of the hill are very steep, there being a difference of 618 feet in a half a mile on the north side, 484 feet in half a mile on east side and 405 feet in a quarter of a mile on the South side. Tradition says that formerly a Boar was kept in the Ring, that it was so large that it filled the whole area, that when it required water it could stretch its neck down to the stream in the hollow, a distance of three fourths of a mile. It is also said that the hill took its name (Brisselstown) from this extraordinary Boar.

The ring encloses an area of about ten and a half acres. It is formed of large unhewn blocks of stones piled up several feet high. The North, East and south sides of the hill are very steep, there being a difference of ~~322~~ 618 feet in half a mile on the North side, 484 feet in half a mile on East side and 405 feet in a quarter of a mile on the South side. Tradition says that formerly a Boar was kept in the Ring, that it was so large that it filled the whole area, that when it required Water it would stretch its neck down to the stream in the hollow a distance of three fourths of a mile. It is also said that the hill took its name (Brisselstown) from this extraordinary Boar.
