

PREPARATION OF THE BLESSINGTON LOCAL AREA PLAN

Consultations under Section 20 of the Planning & Development Act 2000 (as amended)

Wicklow County Council intends to review the existing plan and prepare a new Local Area Plan for the settlement of 'Blessington'. An online consultation portal has been created, which details the significant planning topics that the Local Area Plan will address. The portal can be accessed through wicklow.ie and is accepting submissions from **21st February 2024 to 3rd April 2024**.
