In the N.E. part of Arklow Bary., Wicklow County; the market town of Wicklow is in the N.W. corner of this Parish; bounded on the W. by Drumkay and Glanealy Parishes in Arklow Bary., Arklow Barony; S. by Dunganstown Pa. in Arklow Barony; N.W. by Rathnew Pa. in Newcastle Barony and N.E. & E. by St. George's Channel.

Contains 3030 acres 2 roods 16 pers. all cultivated except a small portion of rocky land along the shore.

Part of the Town of Wicklow is in the North of this 3 Parish. The places of worship in the Town of Wicklow are a church, two R. C. Chapels, a Methodist Chapel and a Quakers Meeting House. Shape of the Parish is circular and compact, greatest length from N. to S. three miles, greatest breadth in the Centre from E. to W. two and a half miles; surface undulating; the E. which is bounded by the shore of St. George's Channel is Rocky & steep, rising almost perpendicular, at the high Water Mark, to the height of from 50 to 80 feet. The highest point is in Ballyguilemore T.Ld. in the West of the Par. 614 feet above the sea. The roads & lonings are conveniently numerous and in good repair. The two principal ones are leading from Dunganstown to Wicklow, one of which bounds the Pa. on the West, the other passes through the Central

parts; there are several bye roads branching from them, some of which connect the two; others intersect the Central & Eastern parts of the Parish; there are some small streams which rise in the Parish and nearly all flow Southward, none of them however, are worthy of notice; the Houses are pretty numerous and nearly all in clusters; the dwellings are chiefly stone; offices mud; the only respectable house, except in Wicklow Town, is Kilpoole House in the South; there are several sand, gravel, & clay pits throughout the Parish. The antiquities are the 4
Ruins of Black Castle in the N.; St. Bridget's Well in the Central E.; Ruins of Brides R. C. Chapel in the East & Kilpoole Fort and the site of a grave yard in the South.

It was formerly a place of strength being nearly inaccessible on two sides; the rocks being scarped & washed by the Sea; the third or land side had a fosse partly natural and partly artificial.

This light House has been allowed to go to ruin on account of its being so far inland that when vessels approached the shore the light was concealed from their view by the prominent Headland. Of the two new light-houses one stands immediately on the coast and is termed the Lower, the other is about 206 yards West of the Lower and is called the Upper Light House.



Chapels which are the only places of worship in the Parish; its shape is irregular thus  its greatest A.B. is two D one and of a mile; Surface undulating being from 30 to 615 feet above the sea at Low Water, being highest at A. and lowest at B. in Wicklow Town; Roads sufficiently numerous, the roads from Rathdrum to Wicklow and from Danganstown to Wicklow pass along the East; streams and wells sufficient for watering but not worth describing; houses few, the only one having any distinctive names is Marlton House in the N.E.; No antiquities; the shape of the South portion is oblong, lying nearly N. & South, greatest length one and a half miles, breadth half of a mile; surface gently undulating is from 75 to 368 feet above the sea at Low Water, being highest in the North and lowest in the South; houses few; the Potters River meets it in the N.W. and flowing Southward bounds it on the West for one and a half miles when it leaves it; there are several gravel & clay pits throughout both portions of the Parish; the roads in the South portion are few; the only Antiquity is Tubberville Well.
