I am to say that it will be open to occupiers, workers or any other person affected to lodge objections against the Regulations. If, therefore, any person desires the Regulations to be further considered he should lodge objections in accordance with Section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, and in pursuance of that Section the Minister for Industry and Commerce gives the following notice:—

That he proposes to make Regulations for the processes of loading, unloading, moving or handling goods in, on or at any dock, wharf or quay and the processes of loading, unloading or coaling any ship in any dock, harbour or canal, in accordance with the enclosed draft and that any objections in respect of the draft regulations by or on behalf of any person affected must be sent to the Minister for Industry and Commerce within 30 days of this date. Every such objection, which must be in writing, must state (a) the draft regulations or portions of the draft regulations objected to; (b) the specific grounds of objection; (c) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for. I am directed by the Minister for Industry and Commerce to enclose Draft of Regulations which he proposes to make under Section 79 of the Factory and Work shop Act, 1901, in lieu of existing Regulations dated 24th October, 1904, in respect of the processes of loading, unloading, moving or handling goods in on or at any dock, wharf or quay and the processes of loading, unloading or coaling any ship in any dock, harbour or canal.

I am to say that it will be open to occupiers, workers or any other person affected to lodge objections against the Regulations. If, therefore, any person desires the Regulations to be further considered he should lodge objections in accordance with Section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, and in pursuance of that Section the Minister for Industry and Commerce gives the following notice: That he proposes to make Regulations for the processes of loading, unloading, moving or handling goods in on or at any dock, wharf or quay and the processes of loading, unloading or coaling any ship in any dock, harbour or canal, in accordance with the enclosed draft and that any objections in respect of the draft regulations by or on behalf of any person affected must be sent to the Minister for Industry and Commerce within 30 days of this date. Every such objection, which must be in writing must state (a) the draft regulations or portions of the draft regulations objected to; (6) the specific grounds of objection; (3) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for Copies of the draft regulations may be obtained on application at the offices of the Department of Industry and Commerce, Lord Edward Street, Dublin.
