Bounded on the N. by the Parish of Rathnew, also on part of the E. by Rathnew Parish and the Parish of Brunkay in the Barony of Arklow, on the South by the Part of Glanealy Parish in Arklow Barony and the Parish of Dungenstown in the Arklow Barony; on the S.W. and W. by the Parish of Kilcommon, and on the N.W. by the Parish of Derralossary.

This is the portion of Glanealy Parish in the Barony of Newcastle and consists of 14 townlands and a small portion of Glebe Land, its greatest extent is east and W. about four and a half Statute miles and N. and S. at the greatest three and one fourth and <sup>least</sup> one Statute mile; on the E. side is Ballynabarny Hill a considerable elevation, a large portion being uncultivated; on the N.W. side is a very elevated ridge, the highest point of which is Carrick-marid, a large part of this is uncultivated, and along the Eastern sides is very extensive young oak woods. The area is 5011 acres 3 roods 4 pers. of which 663 acres 2 roods 28 pers. is uncultivated.
