




I have the honour to report that I have audited your Accounts as commissioners of Wicklow Harbour for the year ended 31st December 1919 and I forward herewith a certified Abstract thereof It is to be regretted that the Income derivable from Harbour tolls and Dues again shows a diminution without a corresponding decrease in the normal expenditure the result being that at the End of the year their is not any appreciable balance available for distribution to the Guaranteeing areas in relief of their liabilities with less shipping entering the port and consequently less duties falling to be discharged by the officers it is difficult to find justification for the increases in salaries awarded to the Harbour master and Secretary. From the point of view of the depreciation of the purchasing value of the found sterling an increase
