The damaged wall was about 14 feet high and only 2' 9" thick a section totally insufficient to support the loose filling behind on which were stumped huge masses of timber.

The immediate cause of the accident was the unrepaired undercutting of foundations referred to in Mr Olley's report probably increased by fresh scouring of the Leitrim river and seepage under the foundations of surface water from the high ground behind the Quays during the recent heavy rains.

A length of 96 feet of wharf wall require to be reconstructed and if this is done in Ferro-Concrete pile and slab work which is the cheapest method I know will cost about £1000.

Apart altogether from this <sup>reconstruction</sup> ~~reconstruction~~ the Harbour Commissioners would be well advised to have an inspection of the foundations of the remainder of the wharf wall made by a diver and to take immediate steps to protect them where undercutting is in evidence and so endeavour to prevent an extension of the present damage.
