County of Wicklow & all in the Barony of Upper Talbotstown. Bounded on the North by Tonoughmore Psh.; on the East by Kiltegan; on the South by Rathvilly Co. Carlow and on the West by Rathvilly Co. Carlow and Baltinglass Co. Wicklow.

This Parish is in the Barony of Upper Talbotstown Co. Wicklow and Province of Leinster about four miles from Baltinglass, on the road from Dublin to Hacketstown, about one sixth is mountain or uncultivated land. There is much pasture in the Psh.

It is a Rectory and Vicarage in the Diocese of Leighlin forming part of the Union of Kiltegan in the gift of the Bishop and Government. There is no Church or Glebe Land 3 in the Psh. The Church of Kiltegan serving for it. There is a Roman Catholic Chapel in Englishtown T.Ld. In Colvenstown Upper is the grave yard, it has in the foundation of the old church of Kilranelagh; an ancient well is in the grave yard called St. Bridgets Well. In Cloughneagune T.Ld. are two objects of antiquity, St. Bridgets Chair and St. Bridgets Head Stone. In Bolycarrigeen T.Ld. is a Druidical circle of stones about 40 feet in Diameter, also a Rath called Crusuna (Crossone) Rath. In Upper Talbotstown (There was a Castle on Talbotstown fort⁽¹⁾) is a Fort, called Talbotstown Fort, with ditch surrounding, it is said the Barony took its name from it. There is a Police Station in Lower Killaleah. The National School is in Upper Talbotstown. At Fortgranite is a good school house with apartments for Master & Mistress built and supported by the Proprietor of the Land; there is also an infants school and a Sunday school well attended. In Talbotstown Lower is an ancient well called Tubber-na-christhamaun 4 said to be good for various cures. There are four good seats in the Psh., Kilranelagh a large & good house, beautifully situated with regard to Mountain scenery, the residence of Mr. W. Greene Esqre.; Ballinroon a good new ho., the residence of Geo. Cummin Esqre.; Fort Granite an excellent

ho., the residence of Captn. Dennis and Barrederry the residence of Pendred Esqre. Porcelain earth resulting from the decomposition of Felspar has been found at Kilrenagh in purity nearly equal to the Cornish China Clay. At the North of Psh. Granite and slate are abundant and greenstone frequently occurs. County Cess laid on for this Psh. at Summer Assizes 1857 was £103. 17s. 1½d.


