In reply to your query re the above.


We wish to state that the quorum of the Wicklow Harbour Commissioners is four.

This is laid down by Section 24 of the Harbours Act, 1940. Section 19 (2) of the Harbours Act, 1946 provides that if a member of a harbour authority is absent from more than half of the meetings during any period of six consecutive months he shall vacate his office, unless the harbour authority decides that there is good reason for such absence.

Sub-section 6 of the same Section states that when a member of a harbour authority becomes disqualified the Commissioners should forthwith declare the office to be vacant and should co-opt another member.
