"Miley-Hall" derived its name from a man of that name 5 who ixm built the House & sold his title to the present Tenant (Mr. Brown). The House is 70 links long & 34 broad, built of common stone, is two stories high & roofed like a court.

"Liffey Cottage" was built by the Marquis of Down shire (it was not) & got that name from its mearness to the Liffey, it is 50 links long by 50 broad & has outlets at the East side; it is a low house, well slated, built with common stone & a neat residence for a Farmer.

"Sherlocks Well" derived that name from a man called Sherlock who lived where "Liffey Cottage" now stands before it was built by the Marquis of Downshire. It springs out of gravel & is both clear & rapid.

The Road from Blessington to Dublin passes partly x2 6 along the West side, and another road branches off from 2k this in an Easterly direction through the middle to the Village of Kilbride; there is a neat & well finished House
