In the Central East part of Ballinacor Bar. Wicklow County 4 miles S.W. of Rathdrum. Bounded on the N. by Ballinacor; on the East by Rathdrum and Castlemacaden; on the South by Ballintemple & Kilpipe, and on the West by Kilpipe & Ballinacor Parishes.

Contains 11,053 acres 2 roods 8 pers. The appearance 3 of the Parish is bare and unvaried, owing to the great portion of it which is uncultivated; it is however diversified in the E. and S.E. by considerable patches of Plantation and Trees in the Hedge Rows and fences. The surface varies in its level above the sea from 117 feet in the vicinity of the Aughrim river to 1,318 feet the summit of Cushbawn Mountain. Shape of the parish irregular; its length from E. to W. is about 5 miles, and breadth from N. to South about 4½ miles. There is no market town in this Parish, but there are several villages and the detached houses are numerous and built of stone.

The villages are Ballinaclesh in Ballinaclesh Townland;

Aughrim in Aughrim Upper Townland; Macreddin, in Macreddin West Townland; and Sheanamore, in Sheanamore Townland.

The roads and lanes are numerous connecting the villages and Farm Houses. There are several patches of Marsh & Bog through the parish; the streams are numerous but inconsiderable in point of size except the Aughrim which bounds the Ph. for 4 or 5 miles on the South; and the Avonbeg which bounds it on the N.E. There are 7 Bridges in the Ph. or connecting it with the adjoining parishes; one over the Aughrim called Coate's Br. and another over the same river called Aughrim Br.; a third over the Aughrim has no name. Ballinaclash Br. over the Avonbeg at Ballinaclash village & connects the Ph. with Rathdrum Ph.; the other 3 Bridges are Tinnakilly Br., Macreddin Br., and Sheanamore Br. all over a small stream which runs through the middle of the Ph. from N.W. to the South East, and joins the Aughrim River. The Houses having particular names are Fort Portnor House in Ballymaurice Upper Townland; Croneasallagh House in Croneasallagh Townland; Ballard Park in Ballium Townland; Ballinaclash Cottage in Ballinaclash Townland; Abbey View in Bahana Whaley Townland & Ballymoney House in Ballymoney Townland. There is a R. C. Chapel in the village of Macreddin, a School in the village of Sheanamore and a police station in the village of Aughrim. The antiquities are the ruins of an Abbey, Lady Well, 3 Forts in Cleneskin Townland, one in Ballyshane Townland, one in Ballymaurice Upper Townland and a Rahean in Cronebeg Townland.
