In Barony of Upper Talbotstown & Co. Wicklow. Bound-
ed on the North by Frysntown Psh.; on the East by Bonough-
more Psh.; on the South by Baltynglass and on the West by
Ballymure Psh.

This Psh. is in the Barony of Upper Talbotstown and County of Wicklow and contains about 5831 acres 3 rods
1 per. nearly the whole of which is cultivated. It is distant from Baltynglass about one mile. It is in the Di-
ocese of Leighlin and forms part of the Union of Baltynglass.
The church (a neat building) is close to the Town or village
of Stratford on Slaney, and there is a Glebe house in it
occupied by the Curate. There are three
good seats in the Psh., Saunders Grove a splendid man-
sion occupied by Captn. Drought, Golden Fort occupied by
Genl. Saunders the proprietor and Ballyhook at present un-
occupied. There is a Police Station in Saunders Grove
T.Ld. A grave yard in Golden Fort T.Ld. An old ruin in
Ballyhook Hill T.Ld. called Stratford old Castle. A
Fever Hospital, one half mile east of Stratford. Rempere
Chapel Ruins in Rempere T.Ld. A corn mill and Tuck mill
in Lower Tuckmill T.Ld. Two ancient wells of note, one
called Tubbermoyal in Winetavern & the other called St.
Bernard's well in Rempere T.Ld. There are several Reths
in the Psh. The two largest of which are called Rath-
coran and Rathnarees, the former is much elevated above the
surrounding country, having its altitude 1256 feet above

the sea and 851 feet above Tuckmill cross roads only one and a half miles to the N.E.W. of it. The River Slaney runs through part of this Psh.; it takes its source at nearly the top of Lugnequille Mountain (in Donoughmore Psh.), the highest mountain in Co. Wicklow. The Mail Coach road from New Ross through Baltinglass to Dublin runs through the Psh. from S.W. to N.E. The Market Town is Baltinglass and the Post town for the North part of Psh. Stratford on Slaney and for the South portion Baltinglass. The Town or Village of Stratford on Slaney is in this Parish for description of which see pages (MS.) 39, 47 & 48. County Cess laid on at Summer Assizes 1837 was £215. 19s. 8d.

Saundersgrove House -- Major General Saunders 29

Saundersgrove Townland. Close on east bank of Slaney river; from the ground rising on each side of the Slaney to a considerable elevation the situation is a good deal confined & still more so by a number of large trees surrounding the House.

A first rate house, old style of building, five stories high; slated. Robt. P. Saunders Esq. Proprietor; occupied by --- Drough Esq. (tenant).

Golden Fort House -- Major Gen. Saunders, Proprietor 30

Goldenfort Townland; on the southern slope of Country rising from the banks of River Slaney; the situation commands an extensive view to the South. A good new house, two stories high, slated; the residence of Genl. Saunders who is also the Proprietor.

Rempere Chapel River -- Custom of Parish 31

Rempere Townland on the left side of the Road from Rempere Crossroads to Ballytone, about one fourth of a mile from Crossroads at a cluster of houses. It was a Roman Catholic Chapel, built about 100 years and about 10 years in ruin.

Rempere Cross Roads -- Custom of Parish 32

Rempere Townland. On the road from Baltinglass to Bumbocell about two miles from Baltinglass going from Baltinglass; the one to the left leads to Ballytone and the one to the right to Dunlevin.

St. Bernard's Well -- T.O.C. 33

Rempere Townland in N.W. point; about 40 perches N.E. of Rempere Chapel ruin.

Stratford on Slaney (contd.)

The Village is nearly in ruins, has a church, Presbyterian meeting Ho. and R.C. Chapel in it. The Village was built chiefly for people employed in a large cotton printing Factory, about one fourth of a mile distant, now in disuse. There is a post office in the Village.

This town or village which is of recent date owes its origin to Edward late Earl of Alborough who towards the close of the last century conferred on his family name "Stratford" and distinguished it from other places of that name by the addition of "Slaney", the name of the river which runs close to it. A battle was fought here during the disturbances of 1798. It is built on the summit of a considerable hill rising from the bank of the River. The extensive cotton and calico printing works established in 1792 by Messrs. Orr and Co. are no longer worked, the proprietors not being able to carry on the business. The manufactory is fast going into ruins for want of being inhabited. There is some talk of its being about to be sold. The machinery was worked by water power and gave employment to several hundred persons. There is a fever hospital about half a mile from the town or rather village. There is a patent for two fairs in the year but none are held.
