The claim for Income tax in this case is in my opinion founded on a misconception of the application of the Income tax Acts to the facts of the case and is untenable

When Income tax was originally introduced in 1799 a number of deductions were allowed for the purpose of arriving at the amount of the taxable profits from a trade

or business (i.e. under what is known as Schedule D and among these deductions was an allowance of the amount of interest paid on borrowed money the Income Tax on this interest being subsequently assessed on and collected from the person to whom it was paid. But as far back as 1803 this mode of procedure was altered and the principle was established on taxing income at its source - Under this altered system the trader was no longer allowed for the purpose of arriving at his taxable profits to deduct interest on loans but he was authorised to deduct and retain the amount of the tax on the interest when paying it to the person to whom it was due and so the Law remained down to the Act of 1888.

Prior to this Act it was optional for a person who had made an annual payment (like interest on loans, rent etc) to deduct the income tax when making the payment.

Once this Act he is bound to make the deduction and to pay the amount so deducted over to the Crown, unless the payment is made out of income which has already been assessed to Income Tax.

Applying this to the present case if the Harbour Commissioners instead of borrowing from the Board of Works had borrowed from a private lender they would not be entitled, in arriving at their assessable profits, to deduct as an item of expenditure the interest payable on the loan. That is to say they would pay Income Tax on the interest but on the other hand when paying the interest on the loan they would be bound to deduct the Income Tax from the interest so paid and as the interest was payable out of profits or gains which had been brought into charge (i.e. on which Income Tax was

In a case like the present where the money has been borrowed from the Government and the Interest is paid to the Board of Works the reason for not allowing a deduction for Interest on borrowed money is gone.

The Board of Works is not liable for Income Tax on the Interest it receives and therefore there is no reason for not allowing the Harbour Commissioners when arriving at their taxable profits or gains to deduct the Interest so paid. But even if the Surveyor of Taxes were right the result would be the same for if the Harbour Commissioners were not allowed to deduct the Interest on the loan and paid Income Tax on that amount they would be bound to deduct the Income Tax so paid from the Interest payable to the Board of Works and could retain it for their own use.

In this view of the case I need scarcely say that the fact that the Interest owing to the deficiency of profits, has to be made up out of the rates is wholly irrelevant.

I may also point out that Section 5(2) of the Wicklow Harbour Advances Act 1897 is inconsistent with the Surveyor of Taxes.

"I am directed by the Ministry to say that as there is now only one month before the expiration of the current financial year and as the state of the public finance is serious, there is no prospect of a free grant being made available before the month expires. With regard to the financial year beginning 1st April next, the Government does not intend to make any grants to harbour authorities for the development of harbours until it has received the recommendations of the Commission on Reconstruction and Development recently appointed. One of the matters to which that Commission has been requested to pay special attention is the condition of the commercial ports and harbours generally; and it is contemplated that in due course the Commission will recommend a general plan of dealing with them.

"Your Commissioners will consequently appreciate that it is impossible for this Ministry or the Ministry of Finance to promise grants to particular harbours in advance of the Commission's report. It is suggested that you should communicate with the Commission on the matter, the Secretary's address being— 19 Earlsfort terrace, Dublin.

"In the above circumstances the Minister considers that it would only put your Commissioners to unnecessary trouble and expense if they sent up a deputation since, for the time being, it would not be possible to give effect to their application."

The Secretary said he wrote to the Secretary of the Reconstruction and Development Commission and received the following reply, dated March 6th:—

"I am in receipt of yours of yesterday's date, asking that a deputation from your body should be received by this commission one day next week.
