Since your last meeting 4 cases of scarlstina have been admitted to thet Fever Hospital from Annamoe Distroct. All the patients belong to the same family. One of the patients, a child of two weeks old, admitted in a very debilitated condition, died the night following almission. One other of the patients also died some days after admission. Of the two remaining cases, one is doing well, and the other has developed otaltis media (disease of the middle ear) in both ears. This

is a complication sometimes met with in scarlet fever. Six cases of diphtheria and two contact cases have been admitted from the Aughrim District. One of the patients died, but I am glad to say that although two of the remainder of the patients had an extremely bad attack all are now doing well, though one cannot yet be considered out of danger. The contact cases have not developed the disease and I hope to discharge them to-morrow (Monday) if the weather be suitable. As no further cases have occurred during the past five or six days I hope that the spread of the disease has been checked.



I called this 4 day of September; he would not give me one nor did he do anything in any way for me since the 24th of July; so I have lost my employment and my health through his neglect. Hoping this letter may do good to some other sufferer, I remain now an idle labourer.

In view of the present financial embarrasment caused by the withdrawal of Government grants the Joint Committee was obliged to exercise the strictest supervision over the admission of patients, with a view to the exclusion of non-urgent cases, and to relatives being made liable for contributions towards maintenance wherever possible. Read letter dated 19th September, 1920, from Dr Power, Rathdrum Dispensary District, stating that the facts with regard to the case of John Doyle, of Avondale, were as follows :- Doyle attended at the Dispensary as he stated He found him suffering from inguinal hernia (rupture). He told him that an operation was the only cure and offered to recommend him for admission to a Dublin Hospital, but he declined. He then informed Doyle that a truss would give him /relief and told him to call on the Monday evening and he would do his best to fit him with one. Doyle did call but he had no truss to fit him. He measured him and said he would order one for him. It so happened that he thought there might be a truss in the Hospital and he and he asked Doyle to go there and wait for him some day. Doyle called at the Hospital but did not await his arrival. When next he saw Doyle the latter refused to call again at the Hospital. The Guardians would see that he did not neglect Doyle; indeed he attended him at any time on any day he called whether Dispensary day or not. The real cause of Doyle's complaint was that, at his request, he had given him certificates that he was unable to work, and on these Doyle actually drew , he believed, £2-15s-0d. Now, he had been informed by Doyle's employer that during this time Doyle was working and actually drawing his usual wages, a very serious matter. He (Dr Power) duly reported this to the Secretary of Doyle's Friendly Society and so stopped further payment. When Doyle called again for a certificate, he told him if it was for a certificate he was waiting he was only wasting his time, as if he was able to work yesterday he could continue working. Doyle

Read circular letter dated 30th September, 1920, from the Local Government Department, Dail Eireann, stating that on 29th June last Dail Eireann decreed the appointment of a Commission to inquire into the relations between the Local Governing Podies in Ireland and the institution in the Custom House known as the Local Government Board. The Commission duly reported and its report was before Dail Eireann at a session held on 17th September. In accordance with the deision of An Dail based on the report of the Commission insructions were now issued the public bodies of Ireland. Dail Eireann, through the Department of Local Government, called for the loyal co-operation of each public body in the task of not only smashing the enemy institution in the Custom House but also in the work of carrying out the local administration of Ireland efficiently and economically as befits the dignity and genius of the Republic. The man who was admitted on present time in receipt of £1-15s-0d a week from Messrs. Martin Ltd., Roundwood, in whose employment he was injured by an accident. This man should certainly be in a position to pay the maintenance, because it was only last week he received 27. He was a client of Mr McCarrollts, and the latter had written him advaising him that he was legally bound to pay the cost of the maintenance, and he had requested him to hand over the money to the Master of the Union. In the meantime he had written the Master to request the man to pay up. As regards the other John Byrne, he presumed he was also being compensated by Messrs. Martin Ltd. He would write Hessrs. Martin to ascertain if this was correct and would then see about getting him to pay the Guardians.

refused to reconsider. As things had gone on so long he was now willing
to take partent at the rate of seven guineas a week, which was three
guineas a week less than the Board had allowed him.
