In the South extremity of Arklow Barony, Wicklow County. Bounded on the West by Ballintemple, N. by Castlemacadam and Kilbride Parishes in the County of Wicklow, South by the County Wexford and E. by St. Georges Channel.

Contains 11860 acres of which about 1,300 acres are uncultivated and land. It is part of a union which consists of the Parishes of Arklow, part of Kilgorman, & Killahurlier. It is a Rectory as to this Parish but not as to the entire union. The present union which is called the union of Arklow is only part of a former union which was divided by the Arch Bishop of Dublin in the year 1834.

It is partly a rectory inappropriate, as to Kilgorman Parish and is both rectory and vicarage as regards the Parish itself; the Revd. Henry Brownrigg A.M. is the present rector. The Arch Bishop of Dublin is the patron of the living. The tythes are Compounded for £324. 17s. 3d. per Ann. of which £230. 16s. 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d. is Rectorial (from which is to be deducted the 25 per cent. allowed to Landlord as per Act of Parliament) and £74. 1s. 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d. is Vicarial.



## Arklow Parish (contd.)

The Church, which is in the Town of Arklow was built in 1805 and enlarged in 1827, is in very good repair and capable of holding one thousand persons, the average congregation in summer is about 700 and in winter about 600. Devine Service twice on Sundays. No Glebe House; there was a small patch of Glebe land in the Town of Arklow not quite a rood, which the Landed proprietor retains. There are no alms houses nor any permanent funds for the relief of the Poor, the Sunday collections averaging about half a guinea per week, are distributed amongst fifteen poor people weekly.

The R. C. Chapel, (which is in Arklow Town) was built in 1810 and is in good repair, it is capable of holding about 4,400 persons, but the usual congregation amounts to ~~£~~ 6,000. The Methodist meeting House is a small building capable of holding about 200 persons, it was built in 1822 and is in very good repair, the usual Congregation is about 70 persons.

There are five schools with which the rector of the 3 Parish is connected; they are all on Lord Caryforts Estate, and were built by that family. These ~~kind~~ in the Town of Arklow, one Male, one Female and one Infant, and two in the Country parts, none of these 5 are in connexion with the National Board; the Male School is under Erasmus Smiths Board; and two Female do. under the London Hibernian Society.

The shape of the Parish is irregular thus measuring from A. to B.  $5\frac{1}{4}$  miles, from A. to E. 4 miles, from E. to D.  $5\frac{3}{4}$  and from B. to C.  $4\frac{1}{4}$  miles.



The surface of the Parish is a gradual slope from the West to the sea; on the West it is about 1800 feet above the Low Water. The roads are conveniently numerous and in good repair, the principal of which is the Mail Coach road from Dublin to Wexford by Arklow; it enters the Parish in the N.W. corner near the junction of the Parishes of Ballintemple, Castlemacadam & Arklow at the Wooden Bridge over the Aughrim river; its direction is South for about 5 chains where a bye road branches off it to the S.W.; it thence ~~pa~~ bears S.E. for  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles into Arklow Town when it takes a S.S.W. direction for  $2\frac{1}{4}$  miles where it leaves the Parish at "Bonds Bridge." The Aughrim river meets this Parish in the N.W. corner and passing along the boundary in a S.E. direction for nearly  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile it meets the Ovoca River which bounds the Parish on the N.E. till it empties itself into the sea, about  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile E. of Arklow Town.



## Arklow Parish (contd.)

Where this river meets the Parish, which is a distance of 5 miles from the sea, its bed is 20 feet above the low Water; there are several small streams passing through the different parts of the Parish; there is a good quantity of Wood in the Parish, principally in the vicinity of Glenart House which is in the central North of the Parish.

Arklow Town is situate in the N.E. extremity in which are the only places of worship in the Parish for description of which see (MS.) page 36 Book No. 381. The houses throughout the Parish are generally stone; they are pretty numerous and in small clusters. The houses having distinctive names are Lamberton House, Ballyrane House, Ballyduff Ho. & Ballynatten House in the East, Upper Kilmurry House in the South, and Glenart, Ballygriffin and Thomastown Houses in the central part, of the Parish. The Antiquities are Saint Divers Well; ruin of Church & a Fort in the S.E. and a remarkable Bath or Fort of a square form in the Wood West of Ballyrane Ho. See description of the Town of Arklow for other remains. 5

In the N.E. extremity of Arklow Parish, Arklow Barony & Wicklow County, 39 miles South of Dublin; the Mail Coach from Dublin to Wexford passes through it.

A pretty large market, post & fair town; about the one half of the Town (in the central part) the Houses are of stone, two story high and in general good repair. The West and S.E. ends of it are all mud houses, one story high. There is a very good Market held in it every Thursday in which grain, vegetables, Beef, Pork and fish are the chief commodities of sale. There are also Seven 37  
 Fairs in the year helden at the following periods viz:  
 11th January, 22nd March, 19th April, 14th May, 25th June, 9th August, and 15th November; the Fairs are generally very thoroughly attended and to which Horses, Cows, Sheep, Pigs and all other kinds of merchandise are abundantly brought; it is also a celebrated place for fishing, there being about 800 fishermen residing in the Town, they all reside in the part of the Town called the Fishery which is the S.E. extremity. The number of Fishing boats registered in Arklow Custom House from the 10th Feb. 1824 till 25th May 1838 and which come in at the different creeks belonging to Dublin Port viz, Arklow, Ballymoney and Courtown are, 320

open boats, 3 cutters, 29 sloops, 8 schooners and 39 smacks, no vessel of more than 12 tons burthen can come in at any of those places; The general fish taken are herring, salmon and oysters; the months of November & December is the herring fishing season; July is the only month in which they take salmon, the remainder of the year is devoted to oyster dredging, the chief part of which are sent to be embedded at Beaumonts Malahide & Sutton.

There is the ruin of an old abbey church in Arklow still visible; a Monastery had once been there and subsequently was used as a Protestant Church till the present one was built. There are also the remains of a fine old Castle in Arklow adjoining the Barracks. The Castle of which these ruins formed a part was destroyed by Cromwell. The Barracks are very small in pretty good repair and occupied by the Police and Militia Staff. A caravan drawn by two horses carrying 4 inside & --- outside passengers leaves Arklow at --- o'clock on Monday, Wednesday & Friday for Dublin whence it returns at 1 p.m. the following days arriving at Arklow at 7 p.m. Two coaches from Dublin to Wexford pass through daily at 12 $\frac{1}{2}$  on Monday, Wednesdays & Fridays, & 11 $\frac{1}{2}$  on Tuesdays, Thursdays & Saturdays; and at 11 $\frac{1}{2}$  each day from Wexford to Dublin. The Wexford Mail passes through at  $\frac{1}{2}$  past 12 from Dublin and at --- from Wexford to Dublin. The Mail & 2 coaches travel by Rathdrum; the Caravan takes the direct road through Dunganstown Parish.
