Submission

Density - as for specific locations, I would have thought the old Dell site in Bray is a good example, however I would pause density until we have our, services, schools, transport links and infrastructure at the best it can be. The Vevay road will suffer when the Dell properties are completed. Finnegans Bray for example have cancelled certain bus times as the bus was simply getting stuck in the early morning congestion and people had to exit the bus and walk. I did a while back discuss a park n stride opportunity at the top of the Vevay road especially for morning school traffic.

Density - our property and that of next door were built in the back garden of a large house circa 2009 - to be honest, two houses have been crammed into a site, with a shared drive and entry and egress directly onto a main road less than 20 metres from a traffic lit crossroads....i would avoid that and wonder what the planners were thinking to have passed the same.

Urban sprawl: keep the houses out of the sea and floodplains...

Economic Opportunity – Tourism - Shops & Services - Community Facilities **Submission**

To raise a specific service: Dog daycare - in the last few years a successful dog daycare facility has opened up and expanded (Currently the subject of an enforcement order and retention planning - file 24/60727 due to it's location in a zoned residential area and lack of planning) Potential for job creation - it currently stands at 2/3 fulltime staff. In the CORRECT/APPROPRIATE location this could be a great service for Bray and environs.

I would classify Bray as a location for bits'n'bobs - I wouldn't view it as a classic retail destination.

Southern Cross retail park for example would benefit from a makeover - with placemaking soft planting and

focal points/covered sit out areas.

I'm not sure if Bray has a local card - Laois for example have https://www.laoisgiftcard.ie/ Highlight the retail zones - a map of Bray retail - southern cross/kilruddery/bray main street/Tesco/Supervalue both sides of Bray and offshoots, quinsboro road and retail kiosks at the prom and mini retail such as Killarney Park, the Boghall road/Ballywaltrim shopping area/LIdl/post office etc. Is there a small retail opportunity at the new library planned for Ballywaltrim.

Tourism potential:

Top class berthing facilities for visiting boats.

Enhancement of the Swan Sanctuary zone, provision of fresh water facilities at the beach for the swans as opposed to drinking the dirty water under/near the parking area directly adjacent to the beach. The zone is a great draw for visitors, local and from out of town. It's a place of solace for people in the evenings, and a source of joy for children to feed the swans. Perhaps a HUGE Swan statue/Installation that would serve as a focal point and photo opportunity/backdrop - or go whimsical and install a boat feature with Swans inside/seats to sit next to one. The anchor on the compass rose here could be enhanced - please don't let this area turn into concrete greystones harbour though!

Tourist accommodation could be a tricky one - with people crying out for homes...is short term stay in locals homes an option?

Educational/sport, community and recreation - on the south side of Bray - the playground enhancements at Ballywaltrim playground (Climbing zones etc) are wonderful - this site has more potential to further develop a unique aesthetic - lets get people travelling to uses it, then availing of nearby centra, crooked pots, regal fare etc..

360 CCTV is needed in this area though. Potential too for outdoor cinema events on the green area/basketball courts. Introduce a lower hoop height for smaller kids and a ball dispenser system - linked to mobile phone or some such too access.

Do we have enough school places in Bray to serve population now and in 2034 for example?

Older people - I have always been a fan of parks for older people - adult size swings and meet n greet areas - the chess table at Ballywaltrim Playground is a super idea, (however close to some unsocial activities and drug sales). Advertsing that the chess pieces can be borrowed from the community centre would be great to see on signs at the park. Expansion of recreation zones for older people and people who live alone. Perhaps even urban allotments spaces on a raised bed system for older people and wheelchair users.

Herbert Road - closure - I am not convinced this is a good idea - this needs more thought and to be taken off the table.

The volume of traffic and the extent of housing is not being met with the required infrastructure.

The endemic habit of racing through amber lights! I think people use the amber as a last shot to get through instead of it's correct use as a signal to slow and come to a stop! Perhaps the introduction of a trial of the lighting sequencing in northern Ireland would be of benefit. the red light jumping on the killarney road is criminal and occurs on almost every change of lights!! Killarney road has had a number of pedestrians hit of vehicles.

The use of single bike lanes as dual bike lands needs to be addressed immediately - take teh boghall road, it is frequently used as a contra flow land on both sides. this poses huge risk at junctions such as ALDI, Lidl etc This needs to be dealt with ASAP and perhaps signage, directional arrows, byelaws to reflect same and a PR campaign.

The above is an obstacle, a danger and now that i have highlighted it - it is essential this is passed onto roads and Bray MD.

Obstacles - perhaps as mentioned above re the urban realm - the introduction of art elements to make a route interesting and attractive. I would also suggest 'timed signage' this could have a recognisable logo - for example exiting Ripley Hills or Fairy Hill - a small sign 300 X 600 to indicate the time into Bray Townhall will take 22 mins walking, 5 mins cycling etc, with the distance.
