## Ballintemple Parish (contd.)

Contains 4087 acres 1 rood 21 pers. of which 1187 $\frac{3}{4}$  acres are uncultivated. It is in the Diocese of Dublin. The Tithes are compounded for £112. 10s. which is due & payable to the Revd. Edward Simple Rector of the Parish; the Arch Bishop of Dublin is patron of the living.

The appearance of this Ph. is bare, in consequence of 21  
a great part of it being uncultivated, and nearly destitute  
of wood. The surface varies in its height above the level  
of the sea, from 30 feet in the vicinity of the Aughrim  
river, to 1399 feet in the Townland of Upper Ballykillageer.  
The shape of the Parish is very irregular; its  
greatest length from S.W. to N.E. is something less than  
4 miles, and its greatest breadth from E. to W. about 2 $\frac{1}{2}$   
miles. There is no town in this Ph., nor any main road,  
but the houses are numerous and all built of stone; the  
bye roads and lanes sufficiently numerous for the agri-  
cultural purposes of the Ph.; the Villages of Ballina-  
sillogue and Ballinagon which consist of a few stone houses  
are situated in the Townlands of the same names. The  
places of worship are the Established Church in the Town-  
land of Ballintemple; and Ballykillageer R. C. Chapel  
in the Townland of the same name, and about the centre of  
the Parish. There is a Glebe Ho. in the Townland of Cool-  
gorrow. There are two school houses viz. Ballykillageer  
School, close to the R. C. Chapel; and Ballintemple School  
in the Townland of Ballintemple. The Parish is well  
watered by small streams, none of which have distinctive  
names except the Aughrim river which bounds the Ph. in the  
N. and N.E., and the Goldmine River which bounds it on 22  
the South and South East and falls into the Aughrim river  
at the "Wooden Bridge." The Antiquities are the ruins of  
a Church, in Ballintemple Townland; the ruins of a R. C.  
Chapel in Ballycoog Townland, 4 chains South of Ballycoog  
House; Tubberthamavullagh Well; 2 forts, one in Ballin-  
temple Townland and the other in Montague North Townland.  
There are two Bridges over the Aughrim, one called Coat's  
Bridge in the N.W. and the other called the Wooden Bridge,  
in the East, at the junction of the Aughrim and Goldmine  
river. There is a Bridge over the Goldmine River about  
one eighth of a mile S. of the Wooden Br.

Contains 260 acres 34 pers. of which 116½ acres are uncultivated; Leases are for 3 lives; rents from 10/- to 14/6 per Irish acre; shape oblong, greatest length is seven eights of a mile & breadth half of a mile; a stream runs along the South Ry.; the East side of this Tld. is uncultivated; there is a bog in the S.W. corner, and an ancient Fort in the North; Houses few and stone; one road in the Townland.

Ballykillageer R. C. Chapel -- Called after the Townland 39

In the N.E. side of Ballykillageer Townland by the road side, which forms the E. Boundary. Built in the year 1832 is slated & in good repair, capable of containing 300, average attendants 250 persons.

Ballykillageer School House -- Called after the Townland

Contiguous to the above mentioned Chapel. It is a small cottage thatched & in good repair, number of scholars 45, 36 of which are males, they are all R. Catholics, the Master, John Kelly, receives from the scholars from 2/- to 3/6 per quarter, he has no other emolument from the school, instituted in 1828.

Ballintemple School House -- Called after the Parish 40

In the Central South part of Ballintemple Townland by the side of a road.

A neat slated building in good repair built in 1827. number of scholars on the roll 33, of which 15 are protestants, the remainder are R. Catholics, there are 20 males & 13 females; Scholars pay from 1s. to 3s. per week; the master has also £8. per ann. for being clerk of the church, and one Irish acre of ground attached to the School house. Divine Service for the Church of England congregation is performed in this School House, the church being out of repair.

Ballycoog House (right) -- called after the Townland 41

In the South side of Ballycoog Lower Townland. It is a two story slated House in Pretty good repair.
