WICKLOW STUDENTS SET FOR NATIONAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP FINAL

Teenage entrepreneurs from Greystones Community College and Colaiste Bhride will represent Wicklow at this year's Student Enterprise Programme National Final in May, the Local Enterprise Office Wicklow has announced.

The students all took part in the County Wicklow final on 27th February, which was held at Clermont House, Wicklow County Campus, Rathnew. An estimated 140 students from 13 schools took part in the annual Award ceremony locally, while 18 schools and 1300 students participated in the 6 month Enterprise programme.

The enterprise education initiative, funded by the Government of Ireland through Enterprise Ireland and delivered by the 31 Local Enterprise Offices around the country, saw over 30,000 students from just under 500 secondary schools take part in 2024/2025 event. The programme supports students to create, design and market their own business, all with the hope of reaching the National Final.

During the event the mini businesses are visited by a number of judges who assess their stand and their presentation, separately the business founders also deliver a business pitch in the Dragon's Den. There are over 7 prizes awarded in addition to the overall prizes, these range from Best Innovation, Best Intellectual Property, Best Sales and Marketing, Best Stand and Best Presentation.

WICKLOW'S YOUTH BIODIVERSITY CONFERENCE

Blessington Community College is proud to host the county's inaugural Youth Biodiversity Conference, organised by the school's Student Environmental Council. Students from first to fifth year have been actively engaged with a range of environmental topics, and this conference aims to further these efforts by involving even more students. Wicklow County Council is supporting the event, which will take place on Wednesday, 2nd April, from 10:30am to 1:30pm.

Invitations have been extended to three additional secondary schools — Coláiste Bhríde from Carnew, Scoil Chonglais from Baltinglass and St. Kevin's Community College from Dunlavin — to encourage broader participation in biodiversity initiatives across the county. Various political representatives, community groups, and policymakers have also been invited to join the event.

The primary objective of the Youth Biodiversity Conference is to amplify the voices of young people, empowering them to speak out about the ongoing biodiversity crisis and inspire further action. The organising committee has carefully selected key topics to ignite passion and foster a lasting commitment to sustainability among attendees. As part of the process the students of Blessington Community College will have a number of Biodiversity workshops on various biodiversity topics, where students from the committee can present their own findings with conference participants.

Housing Needs Assessment 2024 (SSHA 2024)

The Summary Social Housing Assessment (SSHA) 2024 is the continuation of the ongoing process of annual assessments of national housing need. It provides vital data to inform the ongoing development of housing policy. The purpose of the process is to identify the current level of national housing need. At county level, it captures the total number of households qualified for social housing support across the county whose social housing need is not being met, in order to understand the level of need for such support. The social housing applications were reviewed from 1st November 2023 to 4th November 2024. The data on the housing needs for Wicklow was returned to the Department by 2nd December 2024.

The following actions were taken to complete the HNA 2024:


- Forms issued to the social housing support applicant.
- Advertised in paper and on local media to remind applicants to complete and return these forms.
- Reminder letters issued to applicants.
- Follow up emails and phone calls to the applicant.
- Review of list by housing teams Homeless, Traveller accommodation and Tenant Sustainment Officers.
- Reports on the Social Housing application list were generated from the Ihouse System.

Re-Let's / Voids

A new local area maintenance framework was setup in 2024. 17 contractors were appointed to cover all five Municipal District areas for works such as housing refurbishments works, repairs and adaption grants.

The Council can only recoup a maximum of $\leq 11,000$ per house from the Dept of Housing Local Government and Heritage, whereas the average cost of relets was $\leq 31,000$ per house in 2022 and $\leq 35,500$ per house in 2024.

According to CSO Census 2022 data:

The overall vacancy rate for rental properties (private and social) on Census night was 7%, so our vacancy rate is less than half the overall rate for a rental sector where Local Authorities account for only 29.8% of the properties. Also, Wicklow County Council's vacant units only account for 3.2% of the total number of vacant units in our county.

Housing Maintenance

Planned Maintenance in the form of electrical remedial works has been completed at Parkmore in Baltinglass. Protech Electrical is currently carrying out remedial works at Palladius Park in Donard and will then move on to Mallinswood, Grangecon.

Gas and oil boiler servicing and repairs continue in all MDs. Checks for fire blankets, smoke and carbon monoxide alarms are part of the boiler service visit and any missing or time expired alarms are replaced. Heat Pump maintenance contract documents are currently being prepared, and tender competitions will be run on www.supplygov.ie shortly.

Housing crews are also currently replacing fire blankets, smoke and carbon monoxide alarms in our housing stock following a request sent out for replacements needed at the end of 2023.

Mortgage To Rent

A total of 52 households are tenants of Wicklow County Council through the Mortgage to Rent Scheme and as such pay a weekly rent to WCC. WCC leases these properties for a 25-year period from Home for Life, all 52 properties have been inspected, and our housing team administers the monthly lease payments to Home for Life.

Private Rented Accommodation Regulation & Enforcement

The Targeted Inspection programme on private rented accommodation continues. **Housing For All** requires 25% of all private rented properties to be inspected annually. This equates to approximately 1500 properties in County Wicklow every year. Target properties are selected using a Risk Based approach. The Council is responsible for enforcing the Housing (Standards for Rented Houses) Regulations 2019 (SI 137 of 2019).

Prohibition Notices are published on the Council's website and there are currently 6 such notices (the oldest dates back to 2020). Note that in the case of properties subject of HAP, service of a Prohibition Notice results in the HAP payment being stopped as per Section 41(2) (d) (i) of the Housing (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 2014 and this happens within a maximum of 13 weeks.

Capital Assistance Scheme (CAS)

Under CAS, the Department is accepting applications for capital funding for the delivery, through either construction or acquisition, of housing accommodation, to cater for priority groups including:

- elderly.
- homeless persons (including "care leavers" exiting State care on reaching the age of 18).
- people with a disability, with particular emphasis on moving people with disabilities from congregated settings into community-based living.

Assessment criteria

CAS funding operates in partnership with Local Authorities and Approved Housing Bodies.

Local Authorities assess the specific need for CAS funded housing being cognisant of the actual housing need of the CAS groups identified in the latest Social Housing Assessment, consultations with suitable local inter-agency/co-ordination groups that deal with special needs, such as the housing and disability steering groups, national policies and guidelines, including the National Housing Strategy for Disabled People.

In 2024, Wicklow County Council delivered 7 acquisition units and 4 construction units, in partnership with Ark Housing Association (3), Sunbeam House Services (3), National Association of Housing for Visually Impaired (NAHVI) (1) and St John of Gods (4 construction units).

Active projects 2025

Wicklow County Council is currently actively working with Ark Housing, Sunbeam housing association, Newgrove Housing Association, Túath, Depaul Housing, Tiglin and Peter Mc Verry Trust to drive projects to completion.

Homeless HAP Place Finder

The Homeless HAP Place finder provides assistance in:

Seeking out potential properties suitable for households currently identified as homeless or at risk of homelessness.

- > Liaising with specific households to establish their specific needs.
- > Establishing relationships with local property agents and landlords; and,
- Supporting those homeless households to (a) prevent the necessity to enter emergency accommodation or (b) to exit emergency accommodation and secure a tenancy.
- To date, 611 households (427 families & 184 singles) have been assisted under the Homeless HAP Scheme in Wicklow County Council from the inception on 1st October 2018 to 28th February 2025. (241 homeless cases, 342 prevention cases to date and 28 direct provisions). 153 properties were sourced by WCC.

Addressing Homelessness in Partnership with Approved Housing Bodies

Homeless Supported Temporary Accommodation – Kilmantin Hill, Wicklow

Kilmantin Hill has 11 rooms to support persons either homeless, exiting a higher support facility, or in danger of becoming homeless.

There are 9 clients supported in the Kilmantin Hill facility, operated by Dublin Simon. There is continuous transition by the clients to suitable alternative accommodation.

A report is being undertaken at present to cost the refurbishment of the current rooms with a view to making them all ensuite. More details will be available over the coming months.

Homeless Family Service – Fitzwilliam Road, Wicklow

Dublin Simon are engaged by Wicklow County Council to operate and manage the facility at Fitzwilliam Road, Wicklow as a Family Homeless Service. The building comprises of three 1-bed units, two 2-bed units, and two 3-bed units. Eleven families have now transitioned or are in the process of transitioning to a permanent home and the resulting vacancies are in the process of being occupied with families experiencing or in danger of homelessness.

It is envisaged that families will avail of the service for circa 6-months STA (Supported Temporary Accommodation) with key working support to enable families to transition from homelessness into Homeless HAP, or alternative longer-term accommodation.

Homeless Supported Temporary Accommodation - San Remo, Bray

San Remo is operated by Dublin Simon and incorporates a service model whereby there are a number of emergency/cold weather initiative beds and Supported Temporary Accommodation Beds (STA). There is on site key working support linking in with clients.

The Neighbourhood Liaison Committee is now operational and meets monthly.

Bi-monthly meetings are held with Dublin Simon and Wicklow County Council staff.

Homeless Supported Accommodation - Carraig Eden, Greystones

This facility provides 35 ensuite bedrooms with associated kitchens and common areas and is fully operational. Wicklow County Council run an in-reach service with the clients to support them as they continue their journey into more permanent accommodation.

Other Homeless Supported Accommodation

Wicklow County Council owned properties in Wicklow, Bray, and Greystones, leased to Approved Housing Bodies, provide 12 units of low to medium supported accommodation targeted to the particular support needs of the clients. Six of these persons living in shared accommodation have now successfully moved into their forever homes and this in turn created space to move further people out of homelessness.

A homeless outreach service has been rolled out in Bray and is proving very successful.

Housing First

Peter McVerry Trust has been appointed as the Housing First Programme Implementer for the Mid-East Region. Wicklow County Council is committed to working with them and has now reached and surpassed the targets identified in the programme. Housing First recognises that a stable home provides the basis for recovery in other areas.

Properties will be provided by both Wicklow County Council and Peter McVerry Trust for the implementation of the programme.

Wicklow County Council has, to date, successfully accommodated 18 clients under Housing First. Other clients proposed for Housing First have been assessed by the team and are availing of key support work pending finalisation of sourcing of accommodation. The main issue facing this programme is the availability of 1-bed units in suitable locations with easy access to required services.

Homeless Action Plan 2024 – 2026

The plan was approved by the elected members of Wicklow County Council at the Council meeting on 8th April 2024.

Community

Local Enhancement Programme 2025

The launch of the Local Enhancement Programme 2025 was announced on the 7th of November 2024 by Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD, and Minister of State with responsibility for Community Development and Charities, Joe O'Brien TD.

This fund is being provided by the government to support community and voluntary groups, totalling €7 million to be allocated across the local authority network.

County Wicklow has received €199,044 as part of the Local Enhancement Programme 2025, details of which were shared by Ministers Humphreys and Joe O'Brien TD. The allocation is broken down as follows:

Under the Local Enhancement Programme 2025, there will be €6 million in capital funding available nationally to assist community and voluntary groups, particularly in disadvantaged areas. This funding can be used for minor capital works, improvements to facilities, and the purchase of equipment for community use.

Additionally, this year's fund includes €1 million in current funding to support community and voluntary groups with non-pay running costs, such as energy bills (electricity, refuse charges, heating), and other operating expenses (rental or lease costs, insurance bills).

The Department of Rural and Community Development administers the Local Enhancement Programme 2025 through Local Community Development Committees (LCDCs), with support from Local Authorities in each area.

It should be noted that groups applying under the €1 million current fund are not precluded from applying for the capital funding and vice versa.

The Wicklow Local Community Development Committee (LCDC) is responsible for allocating funding through this scheme. Applications must relate to one or more key priority areas identified in their LCDC's Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP) to be eligible for consideration.

Applications for funding closed on Friday 7th March 2025 and the assessment process will be underway shortly.

Community Recognition Fund (CRF) 2024

In March 2024, Wicklow County Council welcomed the announcement from the Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD, along with her colleague Minister Joe O'Brien TD, regarding the allocation of €1,584,550 to Wicklow under the 2024 Community Recognition Fund. This funding is part of a larger investment of €50 million in national funding for project delivery over 2025 and 2026.

The Community Recognition Fund was first introduced last year to recognise the significant efforts made by communities in welcoming and supporting newcomers to Ireland. The fund aims to support the development of community infrastructure and facilities for the entire community, acknowledging the contributions made by local communities in accommodating arrivals from Ukraine and other countries. Eligibility for this scheme is limited to areas with high levels of new arrivals. Funded projects must be capital in nature, provide medium- to long-term benefits for their communities, and be capable of being completed in 2025 or 2026.

Earlier this year, Wicklow County Council sought expressions of interest for project proposals during the scheme's first phase, resulting in the approval of €694,300 for seven community projects*.

The final application window closed on Friday, 10th January 2025, Wicklow County Council are currently awaiting a decision from the Department of Rural & Community Development on the success of the proposed projects.

This final application window of the CRF scheme was advertised in the Wicklow People, Wicklow Times, WCC Instagram Facebook and X pages, WCC website, and PPN Facebook page.

A Community Recognition Fund online information session was held online on Wednesday 11th December. This was very well attended by a number of community groups and elected members. The session focussed on breaking down the scheme outline and the main criteria for this funding.

County Wicklow Age Friendly Programme

Older People's Council, Executive Group - Meetings and Representation

The Older Peoples Council met on the 5^{th of} February 2025 to discuss upcoming events for 2025.

OPC Executive is planning for wider engagement with older people across the county and recruitment of more members of the OPC this year.

Clinics for the Greystones area and Blessington area will be scheduled for 2025.

Wicklow Train Station report is to be finalised and works to begin shortly.

County Wicklow Age Friendly Alliance

Alliance meeting was held on the 22ndJanuary 2025. Each stakeholder gave an update on their Programmes.

"Care and Repair" for the Arklow Area – This is a programme aimed at helping the older person in the community avail of minor works being carried out around their home. Interviews will shortly be taking place. Initially this programme will be a pilot project following which a decision will be made regarding the viability of rolling out in other areas/towns within the county.

Citizens Information Centre (CIC) got Accreditation for Age Friendly Status. They are hoping to put their Arklow Office forward for the award this year.

Age Friendly Ireland Committee

A Regional Programme Managers convention was held in Trim, Co. Meath in February 2025 where reports from each County were submitted. Talk shops were held on various programmes e.g. Age Friendly Town, Age Friendly Business, Training Course and the upcoming Convention in May.

Access Officer

Training for Access Officer commenced in October 2024.

Comhairle na nÓg

The position of Co-ordinator has been filled. A meeting is to be scheduled shortly.

Healthy Age Friendly Homes

The Healthy Age Friendly Homes Programme in Wicklow continues to support older people over 65 years of age to live in their own home for as long as possible.

Since the commencement of programme in Wicklow in January 2024, the level of interest in the programme has been greater than anticipated. Consequently, a large number of referrals to the programme in Wicklow have been received, and the wait times to be seen by the Local Coordinator are longer than originally forecast.

Since her appointment to her role in January, Local Coordinator for Wicklow, Marion Van der Wel, has been conducting home assessments on a weekly basis to our programme participants. As part of her role, Marion offers a wide range of supports to our participants, including but not limited to, arranging fall detector personal alarms, helping with housing adaptation grants, organising Care and Repair services, linking-in with community services, signposting the older person to health services etc.

The programme has gone from strength-to-strength in Wicklow since its inception. The 2024 projected targets for the programme in Wicklow have been exceeded, which demonstrates the success of the programme, and is a testament to the concerted collaborative efforts of the Local Coordinator and Local Authority Staff.

Healthy Wicklow

Active Communities

Preparation is underway to include a FitStick track in Coolafancy Community Field and Shillelagh GAA. Appraisal has been completed on the 5^{th of} March for both areas by FitWalk Ireland. Healthy Wicklow has collaborated with Crosscare Youth project to reengage its members in Rathnew. Funding has also been allocated to facilitate a handball programme with the Traveller Men in CEART.

Social Inclusion Community Activation Programme (SICAP):

Approval of SICAP Annual Plans 2025 and the Annual Performance Review of the 2024 programme is nearing completion. These will be presented to Wicklow LCDC by the programme implementers Bray & North Wicklow Area Partnership and Co. Wicklow Partnership at March meeting for final review and approval.

Implementation of the actions contained within each Annual Plan is currently underway with targeted supports and services being provided to the most disadvantaged and marginalised communities within the county.

Public Participation Network:

PPN Review: As Wicklow PPN is now over 10 years old a timely review of the PPN is being undertaken in conjunction with Omra Support Agency. Following an initial meeting in February, a facilitated session of Wicklow PPN will take place on 12th April which will include Stakeholders, Secretariat members, PPN Staff, Coordinator of Wicklow PPN hosting company Wicklow Travellers Group (WTG) and members of WTG board. The aim of the review is to develop a clear understanding of how the PPN should work with all its stakeholders in a respectful, prudent and efficient manner and explore roles, responsibilities and procedures.

New job-share Resource Worker recruited to work alongside existing Resource Worker.

Ongoing progress of work of subcommittees/groups/issue-based projects: DISC (Disability & Inclusion Steering Committee); SING (Social Inclusion Network Group); Food Poverty Strategy.

The 2025 Service Level Agreement between Wicklow County Council (WCC) and Wicklow Travellers Group (WTG) pertaining to Wicklow PPN, the Memorandum of Understanding between WCC and Wicklow PPN, and the Memorandum of Understanding between WTG and Wicklow PPN has now been completed and submitted to Department of Rural & Community Development. Once approved Wicklow PPN will receive first tranche of 2025 funding.

Funding streams: Circulated information on 24 different funding streams including facilitating an online information session on the Local Enhancement Programme funding.

Consultations: Information on 12 National and 5 Local Consultations including: Co. Wicklow

Outdoor Recreation Plan; N81 Improvement Scheme; Part 8 Murrough Masterplan; Road Safety and Traffic Calming Scheme; Safe Routes to Schools Black Lion Manor, Greystones.

This will replace the Greystones – Delgany & Kilcoole LAP 2013 - 2019 Consultants have been appointed to carry out the SEA and AA for the Variation.

LOCAL AREA PLANS (LAP) / LOCAL PLANNING FRAMEWORKS (LPF)

There are 5 Local Area Plans in Wicklow for the following settlements – 'Bray Municipal District', 'Wicklow Town - Rathnew', 'Greystones – Delgany & Kilcoole', 'Arklow & Environs' and 'Blessington'. We are currently reviewing all five in the following order.

Draft Wicklow Town – Rathnew Local Area Plan 2025

The draft Wicklow Town – Rathnew Local Area Plan 2025 was on display for 6 weeks from 09 October to 20 November 2024 with 166 submissions received. The forward planning team prepared a Chief Executives Report which was issued to the elected members on the 10 of January 2025 for their consideration. The recommendations in the Chief Executives Report were considered at the regular council meeting on the 10 of February 2025. From this meeting, a number of material amendments are proposed to the Draft LAP. These material modifications were published and placed on the online consultation portal on 03 March 2025 and will be accepting submissions up to 31 March 2025. Blessington Local Area Plan

The draft Blessington Local Area Plan 2025 was on display for 6 weeks from 30 October to 11 December 2024 with 253 submissions received. The forward planning team prepared a Chief Executives Report on the draft LAP which was issued to the elected members for their consideration on the 31 of January 2025. The elected members have considered the recommendations of the Chief Executives Report and voted to make material amendments to the draft LAP at a council meeting on the 03 of March 2025. These material amendments will be published and placed on the online consultation portal on 24 March 2025 and will be accepting submissions up to 23 April 2025. LOCAL PLANNING FRAMEWORKS (LPF)

The new Planning Act passed into law last year does not make provision for the preparation of 'Local Area Plans' as currently provided for under Section 20 of the 2000 Act. While the Act makes provision for new types of plans, called 'urban area plans', 'priority area plans' and 'coordinated area plans', these can only be prepared where it is an objective of the County Development Plan to prepare such a plan. In the new scheme, the idea is that CDPs will include more extensive 'settlement specific objectives' (which would include zoning) such that only in particular circumstances might one of these new 'local' plans be necessary for a settlement. Once the new section of the Act is commenced, there will not be a provision that allows LAPs that have been commenced, but that are not yet adopted, to complete the adoption process i.e. any stages of LAP making completed to that date will be 'void'. All indications are that the section of the new Act dealing with 'plans' will be commenced by the end of Q2 2025 so this change appears to be imminent and would directly impact on the local area plans due to be commenced.

We have the option of adding settlement specific objectives in relation to the towns needing new local plans into the County Development Plan by way of variation. Therefore, the new set of local plans will be adopted into the County Development Plan by way of variation. This process provides a very similar plan making process to the former LAP process in that it includes public consultation, CE reports, member's decisions, material amendments etc. The plans that will be prepared will address all of the same issues as LAPs – it will only be the adoption process that will be slightly different. It is intended that the Greystones – Delgany & Kilcoole plan will be the first plan to utilise this alternative process.

GREYSTONES – DELGANY & KILCOOLE LOCAL PLANNING FRAMEWORK (LPF) / VARIATION

Pre-draft consultation closed for the new 'Greystones - Delgany' & 'Kilcoole' Plan closed on 31 January 2024 with 115 submissions received. Two well-attended public information days were held in January 2024. All valid submissions have been reviewed and considered. The draft LPF / Variation is currently being prepared and it will go out on public consultation for 6 weeks with submissions invited from everyone. It is hoped that the draft LPF/Variation will commence display in Q2 2025.

Consultants have been appointed to carry out the SEA and AA. All other studies / assessments are intended at this time to be carried out in-house.

ARKLOW LOCAL PLANNING FRAMEWORK (LPF) / VARIATION

The pre-draft public consultation stage of the plan ran from 01 March 2024 to 02 April 2024. An online consultation web portal was created for this stage, with submissions invited through the portal. 80 submissions were received. A well-attended public information day was held on 15 March 2024. Consultants have been appointed to carry out the SEA and AA for the LAP and they are continuing to work on the SEA/ AA work. DBFL have also been appointed to complete an ABTA (Area Based Transport Assessment) and prepare an LTP (Local Transport Plan) for Arklow which will underpin the Draft LPF/Variation. All other studies / assessments are intended at this time to be carried out in-house. It is hoped that the draft LPF/Variation will commence display in Q3 2025.

All other studies / assessments are intended at this time to be carried out in-house.

RESIDENTIAL ZONED LAND TAX (RZLT)

The Government's <u>Housing For All – A New Housing Plan for Ireland</u> has introduced a new tax to activate vacant land for residential purposes as a part of the 'Pathway to Increasing New Housing Supply'. The RZLT process has two parts:

- 1) **Identification and mapping of the land in scope for the tax**. This is undertaken by **local authorities** through the publication of annual draft and annual final maps as outlined above.

RZLT 2025

The draft RZLT maps for lands liable in 2025 were published on 01 February 2024. Submissions were invited on the draft maps up to 01 April 2024 with 9 submissions received. Submissions requesting a variation of the zoning of land were invited up to 31 May 2024 and no submissions were received by WCC. Determinations on the 9 submissions were issued by 01 July. Landowners had until 01 August to appeal the decision to ABP in the determination and 3 appeals were made.

1.0 Town Regeneration

1.1 Town Centre First Masterplans

1.1.1 Blessington Town Centre First Masterplan

Blessington, as a Pathfinder Town, is leading the way in the development of a Town Centre First Masterplan. This masterplan offers a clear and strategic framework for the positive and sustainable development of the town, both in the short term and in the future. Currently, the implementation of the Town Centre First (TCF) plan is in the planning stage, focusing on revitalizing key areas in the town.

Rural Regeneration and Development Fund (RRDF) funding has been allocated specifically to redesign Main Street and Market Square, two central areas that will play a significant role in the town's regeneration. The goal is to bring these projects to a shovel-ready stage, which means they will be fully prepared for the next phase, where they can be submitted for Category 1 RRDF funding to secure further financial support for construction and development. This initiative is a significant step toward enhancing the town's infrastructure, economic vitality, and overall community appeal.

1.1.2 Newtownmountkennedy Town Centre First Masterplan

Newtownmountkennedy is one of 26 towns selected nationally under Phase 2 of the Town Centre First Plan initiative. The town will receive €30,000 in funding to support the development of its own Town Centre First Plan, aimed at guiding the revitalization and sustainable development of the town centre, transforming it into a vibrant and thriving hub for the community. The funding is provided under the Town Centre First Measure 2 Suite of Supports. The plan must be completed, and all associated claims submitted to the Department by 5th September 2025.

Following the establishment of the Newtownmountkennedy Town Team in November 2024, the Town Regeneration Officer (TRO), in collaboration with the Town Team, has drafted and issued the tender document for the creation of the Town Centre First Plan. The deadline for submitting tenders was 7th March 2025. The received tenders have since been reviewed, and the selected tenderer is expected to be appointed by the end of March.

1.2 Town Centre First – Suite of Supports

1.2.1 Town Centre First Town Team Support Fund – Measure 1

Baltinglass, Rathdrum, and Kilcoole have been approved for €10,000 in funding under the Town Centre First Town Team Support Fund – Measure 1. This funding is aimed at establishing or further developing town teams in areas where they are either not yet established or in the early stages of development. These teams will play a crucial role in driving the revitalization and sustainable development of the town centres. Originally, the deadline for drawing down the funding was set for 15th November 2024. However, an application was submitted to the Department of Rural & Community Development for an extension, which was granted. The revised deadline for drawing down the funding is now 8th May 2025, giving these towns additional time to finalise their plans and ensure the successful formation of their town teams. This extension provides a valuable opportunity for further planning and preparation within these communities.

Queen's University of Belfast has won the competition to produce the Health Checks and will begin work in April 2025.

1.2.2 Town Centre First Measure 3 Suite of Support

Two applications have been approved for funding under Town Centre First Measure 3 Suite of Supports;

- a) Blessington Project will create plans to develop a high quality public space in the Market Square. Project will commission professional services to carry out a predevelopment exploration of the Market Square as a de-risking exercise for the construction phase if the project was successful in a later funding application.
- b) Wicklow Town Project will engage a supplier/contractor to complete a comprehensive design plan aimed at improving of public lands surrounding the Black Castle in Wicklow Town and assessing the structure and condition of the Castle.

The capital funding agreement was returned to the DRCD on 16th September 2024. The *Town Centre First Measure 3* projects must be completed with all associated claims submitted to the DRCD by 30th September 2025. The Town Regeneration Officer (TRO) has been actively working with the respective town teams to prepare tenders for the associated works, with tenders set to be issued to the market in March 2025.

1.3 Town and Village Renewal Scheme 2023

Wicklow Co Council has been awarded €725,000 from the Department of Rural and Community Development under Town & Village Renewal Scheme 2023. The Projects selected were;

- a) Kirikee, Glenmalure for work on their Community Centre to include renovation of the roof, windows ceilings and walls.
- **b)** Lacken to renovate the old schoolhouse to be used as a community centre to include café and community shop and a small heritage section.
- c) Wicklow Towns, Murrough BMX pump track to develop into best- in-class asphalt covered pump track for all ages and abilities. The Acceptance Agreements have been signed and the commencement of the tender process was discussed with the associated Town Team /Community Groups in early September.

Meetings are ongoing with the respective Community Groups to review their tender documents prior to issuing to the market. A conservation architect has been appointed for the project in Lacken, as the building is listed in the Record of Protected Structures (2022-2028).

These three projects must be completed with all associated claims submitted to the DRCD by 31st October 2025.

1.4 Town Teams

The process of forming a new Town Team in Newtownmountkennedy was completed in November 2024. Following this, the newly established team held its first meeting in December 2024. This marks an important milestone in the town's efforts to revitalise and develop its town centre as part of the Town Centre First initiative. The formation of the Newtownmountkennedy Town Team brings the total number of Town Teams in County Wicklow to five, joining Arklow, Blessington, Greystones and Wicklow.

The Town Regeneration Team will now plan to form Town Teams in Bray, Rathdrum, Kilcoole, and Baltinglass in 2025.

1.5 Rural and Urban Regeneration Development Fund Grant Applications

1.5.1 Blessington RRDF

Blessington has been awarded over €1m funding under the Rural Regeneration Development Fund to be used for the regeneration of Blessington Town Centre, the development of plans for public realm works, the redevelopment of a vacant/derelict property to create an eHub and a Visitor Centre for the forthcoming Blessington Lakes Greenway. Meetings are being planned with the Town Team in March 2025 to progress these works.

1.5.2 Baltinglass RRDF

The costings for Baltinglass Gateway to Southwest Wicklow came in over budget on both the public realm and the Courthouse refurbishment. The proposals have been revised and the necessary technical plans are complete in order for the works to commence. Works on the Public Park and playground are almost completed. Application for further funding on this project was made to the Department on the 7th February 2024. However, the submission was not successful. The Town Regeneration Team have meet with the consultants regarding the public realm works and a finalised a first phase of the works, which will hopefully go out to tender early in Q2 2025.

1.5.3 Newtownmountkennedy RRDF

The project is at a standstill over contested issues regarding the design of the public realm. Following the necessary revisions, it is hoped that agreement will be reached with the plans signed off and submitted for Category 1 funding. A revised design will also form part of the Town Centre First Plan referenced previously.

1.5.4 Urban Regeneration Development Fund Call 3

Wicklow will receive €2.5 million to assist long term vacancy and dereliction. Four properties have been chosen (two in Arklow and two in Wicklow). The two properties identified in Wicklow have since had refurbishment works commenced on them by their owners and are no longer available for purchase. Two further properties are now to be identified and this process has commenced.

An additional property has been identified in Arklow and approval has been received from the department to start the process of acquiring this property.

1.5.5 Bray Harbour Improvements – URDF Wic0004

A revised business case has been sent to DHL&H in December 2024. A tender brief is currently being prepared for the procurement of engineering consultancy services to produce detailed designs, environmental reports and an application to An Bord Pleanála for the proposed works. A WCC project team are meeting monthly to track progress of the project.

TOURISM

1. SOCIAL MEDIA COORDINATOR

Good As Gold Company has commenced work on the VisitWicklow social media accounts. A Communication plan is being put in place for the next 10 months with the objective to maximise the reach and engagement of the various VisitWicklow social media platforms which includes Facebook, Instagram and TikTok.

2. 'SAUVONS LES KEVINS' FRENCH DOCUMENTARY

Wicklow County Council and Tourism Ireland France are supporting the launch of the French documentary 'Sauvons Les Kevins'. The documentary explores the origins of the name 'Kevin' and explains how in the mid 90's the name Kevin became very popular in France. The documentary includes an extensive section on Wicklow and Glendalough. French TV station Paris Premiere is airing the documentary in March with a media launch on the 17th of March. The event and destination will be extensively promoted through both Tourism Ireland and Paris Premiere's social media accounts.

3. FAST PACKING THE WICKLOW WAY YOUTUBE VIDEO

As part of the EcoTrail promotion, Videographer and Influencer Jeff Pelletier was invited to 'Fast Pack' the Wicklow Way a couple of weeks before the race. Jeff created a 25 minute video showcasing the adventures that he and his partner went through over the three days on the Wicklow Way. The video was posted to his 130,000 YouTube followers, recording more than 50,000 views in just ten days. The story was relayed in Ireland by local and national media.

4. GLENDALOUGH AND WICKLOW MOUNTAINS NATIONAL PARK VISITOR EXPERIENCE AND MANAGEMENT MASTERPLAN (VEMMP)

Work continues on the implementation of recommendations contained in the 7 – 10 year VEMMP. The Local Advisory Group and the Working Group of the Glendalough Partnership continue to meet regularly to support the implementation of actions contained in the VEMMP. Updates shared at the recent Local Advisory Group meeting include:

- Fáilte Ireland has appointed DESIGN ID as consultants to design an All Ability Trail connecting Laragh to the Monastic City and Upper Lake. They will carry out full consultation with all stakeholders, local community and landowners, in conjunction with the Local Advisory Group.
- Fáilte Ireland has also appointed KSN Project Management to provide key Project Management Services to assist in the delivery of Phase 1 of the VEMMP over the next two years. These consultants will work closely with the Glendalough Partnership partners and the Local Advisory Group, to provide additional support, and consistency across actions being delivered.
- The National Monuments Service and the OPW have collaborated in preparing a brief for a Conservation Management Plan to advise on the delivery of the VEMMP. A consultant is due to be appointed imminently.
- All consultants will meet to co-ordinate aspects of their work which impact on others and will provide an update to the Glendalough Partnership.
- Wicklow County Council have arranged for traffic management, additional temporary parking and VMS signage for Summer 2025 in order to maintain a flow of traffic through Laragh and to the various car parks. This will be supplemented by a social media campaign encouraging drivers to park responsibly and respectfully.
- NPWS, working with Coillte, have secured funding for phase 3 of the Spinc upgrade. This will build on the improvements made in 2024 in removing boardwalk and replacing with aggregate trails.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Abbey Grounds, Wicklow

The Fáilte Ireland Destination Towns project at the Abbey Grounds continues as planned, with expected completion later this year.

Special Projects

GRID: The GRID (Greystones Regional Innovation District) continues to operate, with several companies occupying current office space. Fit out work continues on the remaining unlicensed offices.

Sites on Mill Road, Greystones: The Mill Road sites' progress is on hold pending PRA confirmation of site registration.

Carnew Remote Working Hub: Notice of intention to seek Part 8 planning approval was advertised on the 12th March 2025. Consultation is now open and accepting submissions until 12 noon on Monday 22nd April, 2025.

Marketing Plan: The planned posts as Gaeilge scheduled for Seachtain na Gaeilge have now concluded. The #ChooseWicklow campaign will continue until April 2025, with regular social media posts each week.

Offshore Renewable Energy

The Offshore Renewable Energy (ORE) Network will convene on Monday, March 24th, to support engagement with offshore renewable energy companies and networking and plan activities for the year ahead.

Skills Strategy

The skills taskforce continues to drive implementation of the actions contained within the Wicklow Skills Strategy. Their next meeting is planned for May 2025.

Food and Beverage Strategy

Wicklow Naturally was nominated for the Irish Restaurant Awards 2025 under Local Food Hero for Wicklow. The nomination celebrated Santina Kennedy who has been working as Wicklow Naturally's coordinator since the start of the network.

Wicklow Naturally is applying to the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine for funding under the Rural Innovation and Development Fund (RIDF) for a new food related event to be run later this year

- 3 licensed wastewater discharges to waters were monitored and deemed non-compliant and corrective action requested.
- 4 licence application to discharge wastewater to water refused.

Municipal Wastewater Treatment Plants – Ambient Monitoring

- 38 River samples taken upstream and downstream of wastewater discharges of municipal wastewater treatment plants.
- 4 Lake samples taken upstream and downstream of wastewater discharges of municipal wastewater treatment plants.

Planning & Development

- 0 environmental reports on referred planning applications/consultations were completed concerning agricultural development.
- 4 environmental reports on referred planning applications/consultations were completed concerning commercial development.
- 3 environmental reports on referred planning applications/consultations were completed concerning housing development.
- 0 environmental reports on compliance with planning permission conditions were completed.

Control of Dogs

Dog Licences

For the month of February 2025, a total of 562 dog licences were purchased. Of this amount 255 were purchased online, which represents 45% of all licences purchased.

XL Bully Regulations

From 1 February 2025, it is illegal to own an XL Bully dog unless you have a Certificate of Exemption. The certificate means you can keep your XL Bully at your address until the end of their natural life. All XL Bully owners had to have made an application for a Certificate of Exemption no later than 1st February 2025. As at that date 55 applications had been received by Wicklow County Council. A dog must be neutered for the Certificate of Exemption to issue. All dogs have until the end of June 2026 to be neutered, but the application must have been received by Wicklow County Council by the 1st February 2025. 8 applications were received after the 1st February 2025.

Lambing Season

The official launch of this campaign by the IFA was carried out on Monday 10th February at a farm in Newcastle, Co Wicklow. A number of reports of dogs worrying sheep have been reported since then, and the dog wardens have been carrying out inspections. A social media campaign is being run, by Wicklow County Council, until the end of April reminding dog owners to ensure they dogs are not allow run freely in the countryside.

Projects Office

Whitestown Remediation Project

The draft remediation plan has been presented to the court and has been approved in part. Tender Documents for the Outlets for Material excavated from the site and also for the main contractor are presently being prepared.

Avoca Mines Remediation Project

The Council is working in Partnership with DECC to advance the Remediation of the Avoca Mines project. Currently, this work primarily involves making the mines sites safe, by replacing fencing and making safe access to locations that require sampling and monitoring. The contract has been awarded to complete the fencing around Cronebane and Tigroney sections of the Mines. Monitoring and repair works to existing fencing continues.

Arklow Flood Relief Scheme

Planning Application and CPO has been approved by An Bord Pleanála. Byrne Looby Partners Ltd., (now known as Ayesa) has been appointed to carry out the detailed design and tender stage of the project. Site Investigation and Archaeological Investigations will be carried out in 2024.

Wicklow Arts Office

Creative Ireland Programme

The **Creative Wicklow Grant Scheme** was assessed as part of Wicklow County Council's Creative Ireland Programme in March. Just under €38,000.00 was awarded to imaginative and community led activities throughout the county. The fund was open to application from not-for-profit organisations, local community groups, arts, heritage, biodiversity and cultural groups, venues and societies.

Through this fund Wicklow County Council seeks to support projects that communicate and celebrate aspects of Wicklow People and Place in creative and innovative ways. The Council makes the awards for projects that effectively capture and showcase the richness of county Wicklow's arts, culture, creativity, heritage, nature, biodiversity, and history. Wicklow County Council encourages applicants to consider presenting the work as part of key calendar events such as Culture Night, Heritage Week, and Biodiversity Week for example.

The **Sing in Wicklow Grant Scheme** was opened and will fund the professional development of choirs, singing groups, and professional choir leaders to extend valuable opportunities for community participation in choral singing. Applications close on April 7th at 4pm.

Arts Programme

The **Artist Coaching and Mentorship** development Scheme was opened to applications and will close on April 7th at 4.00pm. The programme is designed to cater for a range of artists at different career stages, successful applicants will work individually with four experienced coaches from the arts and cultural sector. The goals of the sessions are agreed between client and coach.

Payments were made to the successful applicants under the Individual Artist, Artist in the Community Collaboration and Arts Festival Award Scheme's. Just under 100,000 in total was invested through these awards.

Creative Places Baltinglas

Creative Places Baltinglass initial €335,000.00 investment from the Arts Council over three years completes in June 2025. An application was developed by the Arts Office in partnership with the West Wicklow Interagency Group, community and local creative consultation. The application was submitted on March 27th, 2025. If successful the Creative Places Baltinglass Programme will continue for a further two years with a further Arts Council investment of 180,000.00.


Library Programme Highlights

- Engineers Week: STEPS Engineers Week aims to promote engineering and the importance of the

Our patrons thoroughly enjoyed the sessions and had the opportunity to see and use equipment they had never experienced before.

Anyone4science nosted two bilingual workshops on 'How to Make a Kite,' and the Mobile Music School offered a 'Let's Explore' music workshop for young children. Additionally, we ran an Irish language poetry competition and an art competition under the theme 'Island' in Wicklow primary schools.

- **Digital Literacy:** Blessington Library is running a four-week digital literacy course for adults across March and April. The course is supported by Transition Year students from Blessington Community College.
- **St Patrick's Day:** Professor Wadden delivered a talk exploring the life of St. Patrick examining the stories, historical evidence, and sources that shape our understanding of St. Patrick's life and legacy.
- Health Ireland at Wicklow Town Library: Chair yoga sessions took place across four dates in Wicklow Library.
- **Funky Fungi at Ballywaltrim Library:** A Funky Fungi Needlefelting Workshop for kids with needle Felter, Miriam Brady took place at Ballywaltrim Library on Saturday, March 1.
- **Bray Library New Junior Film Club:** Bray Library Junior Film Club has its first meeting on March 20th. They will meet every 3rd Thursday of the month at 6.30pm to discuss a featured film.
- Blessington Library World Book Day: Pupils from the Ash Room at Blessington educate Together School visited Blessington Library to take part in a writing workshop facilitated by Fighting Words in celebration of World Book Day. Fighting Words was founded by Roddy Doyle and Seán Love and offers free workshops that encourage children to become authors of their own stories, fostering a love of literature and creative expression.
- Arklow Library Celebrate World Book Day: To celebrate World Book Day, Arklow Library had welcomed residents from the Asgard nursing home to the library for a special visit.

Archives & Genealogy Service

- **Digitisation programme:** The Wicklow and Arklow Harbour Commissioners minute books are being prepared for digitisation and will be available on Wicklow.ie shortly.
- **Outreach activities:** The Archives provided a tour of its collections to the Kildare and Wicklow Adult Literacy for Life group. The John Tate's Charity exhibition was displayed in County Buildings. The Our Wicklow Women community archives exhibition was displayed in Wicklow Hospice for International Women's Day.
- **Collections management:** Arranging and cataloguing of the County Archives business archives continues collections include records relating to milling, merchants, blacksmiths and dairy suppliers. Cataloguing of local authority collections continues with early Old Age Pension records, commencing 1908.
- **Conservation:** The next volume in our Wicklow Corporation collection is currently out for repair and conservation, covering dates 1710-1762.

Outdoor Recreation

Roundwood: The Roundwood Upper Loop was reopened in March following the repair of damage caused by Storm Darragh. In addition, the Roundwood Play Trail was opened for the first time and had 4812 children access the amenity in its first weekend.



Sugarloaf: The Sugarloaf Restoration Project was completed in March. The first three months of 2025 saw over 200,000 visitors and so it is expected that the new trail will see a huge increase in visitors to the site.

Wicklow Trails App: The Wicklow Trails App was launched in March, promoting the extensive trails across Wicklow to both locals and visiting tourists alike.

Wicklow Sports & Recreation Partnership

- Disability Club Grants 2025: Wicklow Sports and Recreation Partnership is offering a Disability Sports Club Grant to support clubs in making their activities more inclusive and accessible for people with disabilities. Clubs can apply for funding of up to €1,000 to help remove barriers and create a more inclusive environment for all participants. The closing date is 1st May 2025 and funding can be used towards:
 - Disability support for education and training: providing training for coaches and volunteers to enhance their understanding of inclusive practices
 - Programme activation and delivery: supporting the development and delivery of inclusive sports and physical activity programmes within their club
 - Small-scale equipment for inclusive programmes: purchasing equipment that helps adapt activities to include participants with disabilities.

Public Lighting Energy Efficiency Project (PLEEP)

The initial survey element of the above project has been completed. This is the initial phase of the project; the design is currently ongoing. The retrofitting of lanterns has commenced in Arklow, Baltinglass & Bray MDs with c. 650 lanterns replaced.

Speed Limits

The change to the rural local road default limits came into effect on 7th February. Signs have been erected by the MDs. Review/revision of the urban speed limits are due to commence in the coming months.

Road Schedule

The road schedule is currently under review, with an aim to have a completed schedule available online by the end of 2025.

M11N11 Junction 4 to 14 Improvement Scheme

The Option Selection report was published along with Bulletin #11 on the project website <u>www.n11m11.ie</u> on 14 December 2021. The publication followed the review of submissions received during public display in 2021. Phase 3 Design and Environmental Evaluation was due to commence in Q1 2022. The scheme is currently suspended as no funding is provided. The Wicklow County Council project team are continuing to meet with the public and any interested parties.

M11N11 Bus Priority Interim Scheme

The BPIS seeks to achieve the early delivery of bus priority measures in advance of the main scheme between Loughlinstown Roundabout and Junction 9 (Glenview). The scheme is currently at the Options Selection phase (Phase 2 of TII's Project Management Guidelines).

A non-statutory public display on the emerging preferred options for sections A and C took place in November 2022. A further non-statutory public display event was held in the Glenview Hotel in September 2023 that presented the overall emerging preferred option for the BPIS between Loughlinstown Roundabout and Junction 9 (Glenview).

The public display documents are available to view on the project website <u>www.n11m11bpis.ie</u>. The Post Consultation Report which summarises the issues raised has been prepared and is available on the Project Website since the 18th October 2024.

Since December 2023, work has been progressing to develop the emerging preferred option in greater detail and to undertake a thorough environmental evaluation of the scheme.

Specifically, the reassessment of options currently being undertaken is focussed on Sub-Scheme B, between Junction 6 (Bray/Fassaroe) and Junction 8 (Kilmacanogue). Further details on the options being assessed are presented in the Post Consultation Report. This work is currently progressing, and following completion of this revisit of Phase 2, details of any revision to the final preferred option will be published. This is expected in late Q1 2025.

N11 Parallel Service Road at Kilmacanogue

A noise assessment to the east of the new Parallel Service Road Scheme was carried out during April and May 2022. The options review and design commenced in March 2023 following confirmation of funding from TII. Site investigation

works were completed in November 2023. This information has been reviewed by the Design Team and the final design option has been prepared. Direct consultation has taken place with the affected residents/landowners. The procurement of a contractor for the construction works is currently being progressed by the project team in conjunction with TII.

N81 Knockroe Bend Realignment

Tenders for a Per-Cent Art Feature are being procured by the Arts Office. The preferred feature has been selected pending the completion of the final assessment stage.

N81 Irishtown West, Whitestown Lower, Hangman's Bend and Tuckmill Lower "N81 Four Studies"

Following completion of Phase 1 feasibility studies (The N81 Four Studies – Feasibility Report), Wicklow County Council are now progressing the following two projects:

- N81 Whitestown Lower Project; and
- N81 Hangman's Bend and Tuckmill Project.

The Phase 2 Options Selection work is currently progressing under TII's Project Management Guidelines. A non-statutory Public Display event on the Route Options took place in the Inis Fail Germaines, Main Street, Baltinglass, on Wednesday 27th March 2024. The public display documents are available to view on the project website <u>www.N81whitestownandtuckmill.ie.</u> The period for submissions ended on Friday 26th April 2024. A second non-statutory public consultation on the emerging preferred options commenced on the 30th January 2025 with a display event in Germaines in Baltinglass. Submissions and observations were accepted up until 12:00 noon on 27th February 2025

N81 Hollywood Cross Rural Traffic Calming Road Safety Improvement Scheme (RSIS)

The Feasibility and Options report (Phase 2) was approved by TII in November 2023. The Design Report (Phase 3) was approved by TII in April 2024. The Part 8 statutory process (Phase 4) commenced on the 28th March 2024 with the period for submissions by interested parties ending on the 14th May 2024. At the May 2024 meeting of Baltinglass Municipal District the Elected Members voted to approve the Chief Executive's recommendation for the scheme to proceed. The Detailed Design and Contract Documents (Phase 5) are being prepared in advance of tendering for a contractor for construction.

Park & Ride/Share at Hollywood

A feasibility report, funded by the Baltinglass Municipal District was prepared and submitted to TII in Oct 2021. This report considered an option for parking accessed from the N81. TII subsequently provided funding to further examine the feasibility and options.

TII have indicated that they do not support the proposed additional access to the N81. As a result, the option for a parking facility accessed from the N81 has been discounted from the traffic calming scheme. Suitable parking locations that can be accessed from the regional/local road network are being investigated.

N81 Blessington Gateway Project

The Feasibility and Options report (Phase 2) was finalised and approved by TII in October 2023. TII have also approved funding to proceed with the design phase in accordance with TII Standards. Wicklow County Council are progressing this project to the design phase (Phase 3) to be followed by any necessary statutory approvals process (Phase 4).

N11/M11 Strategic Bus Park & Ride Facilities

Proposals for bus-based Park & Ride facilities are being progressed adjacent to the N11/M11 at Junctions 6 (Fassaroe), Junction 11 (Kilpedder) and Junction 16 (Ashford/Rathnew).

The Park & Ride at Junction 6 Fassaroe was approved by the Elected Members at the meeting of the full Council in November 2023. Land acquisition and tendering was carried out during 2024 and construction work is expected to commence during Q1 of 2025

The Bus Park & Ride at Junction 16 (Ashford/Rathnew) was approved by the Elected Members at the meeting of the full Council in March 2025.

The preliminary design for the Bus Park & Ride at Junction 11 (Kilpedder) is being progressed in conjunction with the NTA Park & Ride Delivery Office.

Arklow to Shillelagh Greenway

The Phase 2 Route Options Report has been submitted by Wicklow County Council to Transport Infrastructure Ireland (TII) for review. Following completion and approval of Phase 2 works we will proceed to Phase 3, involving Design and Environmental Evaluation. Negotiations are still ongoing with landowners.

Blessington Inner Relief Road

As of September 9th, 2024, An Bord Pleanála (ABP) have granted permission for the northern section of the Blessington Inner Relief Road as a partial approval for a planning development. The residential development (330 units) has been refused permission by ABP. A preplanning LRD application was submitted in November 2024 based on the current Draft Blessington LAP.

Wicklow Greystones Greenway

The Phase 2 Route Options Selection Report is currently under way through the project design consultants. Meetings and information sharing is ongoing with Irish Rail for their East Coast Rail Infrastructure Protection Project.

Chapel Road Pedestrian and Cycle Infrastructure Improvement Scheme - Wicklow County Council Compulsory Purchase No. 1 Order 2021

The Letter of Acceptance has been issued to the contractor with a pre-construction meeting and contract signing planned for 14/02/2025. The CPO Notice to Treat was issued on all landowners in October 2023 and Notice of Entry issued in November 2024 with the CPO fully confirmed in January 2025. Discussions between Wicklow Roads Project staff and landowners are ongoing. A Wicklow County Council appointed valuer is engaging with valuers and homeowners as part of the CPO process.

Blessington eGreenway

In January 2025 Wicklow County Council was notified by An Bord Planeala that the planning application for the Blessington Greenway submitted Under Section 177AE of the Planning and Development Act had been refused. Wicklow County Council with their project consultants and legal counsel are currently reviewing the decision before deciding on how to proceed.

Kilmacanogue to Bray Southern Cross Active Travel Scheme

TII have instructed Wicklow Country Council to issue tender documents for design services for the development of the Kilmacanogue to Southern Cross Active Travel Scheme.

Active Travel Updates

Projects under Construction

Ballyguilemore Active Travel Facilities (Wicklow MD)

Provision of new pedestrian facilities and road safety improvements along the Ballyguilemore Road between Carrig View and the entrance to the proposed new St. Patricks GAA Pitch. The scheme includes for new footpaths and road widening works. Construction of the new footpath is complete, along with the drainage and public lighting works. Road edge reinstatement works have also been completed and the planting of new native hedgerow and native trees along roadside boundary are also complete. Remaining accommodation works have begun and a contractor has been appointed and is scheduled to commence the final phase of works at the end of March.


Arklow South Cycle and Pedestrian Scheme (Arklow MD)

Provision of 2.8km of segregated cycle track along the R-772 Wexford Road, Arklow between Knockmore Roundabout and M11 Junction 21. The scheme will also construct 1.4km approx. of pedestrian footpath. Construction works have been completed on this project. Stage 3 of Road Safety Audit to be completed.

Safe Routes to Schools: St. Kevin's National School, Greystones (Greystones MD)

Provide infrastructure for schools to increase walking and cycling as the preferred travel mode where possible and improve safety at front of schools. Front of school implementation works are completed. New pedestrian crossing and footpath civil upgrade works are completed on Church Lane. Demobilisation and handover

to school has been completed and the SRTS flyer has been issued to the school for circulation.



Safe Route to Schools: Scoil Nioclais Naofa, Dunlavin (Blessington MD)

Provide infrastructure for schools to increase walking and cycling as the preferred travel mode where possible and improve safety at front of schools. This project includes implementing a one way system on the eastern side of Fair Green. The fronts of schoolworks, for the school zone, have been completed and works on permeability link are also complete. Public lighting is scheduled to be installed, date to be agreed with contractor. Stage 3 of Road Safety Audit to be completed and a launch will be arranged with An Taisce and the school.

Kilcoole Road Footpath (Greystones MD)

Footpath to be constructed linking Greystones to Kilcoole. Construction works are ongoing on the new boundary wall at Barna Cottage.

Project Updates

Bray Transport Interchange (Bray MD)

New plaza and public transport interchange in front of Bray DART station, with revised car parking, set down and taxi rank arrangements. David Walsh Civil Engineering commenced ground works in Mid-February. Main drainage works have been completed. Paving has been installed on Quinsborough Road and Adelaide Road. Works are progressing on schedule. Buses are relocated to temporary stops. Florence Road, drainage, paving and road surfacing substantially complete. Accommodation works are ongoing.



Bray Transport Interchange

Wicklow Station Pedestrian and Cycle Link (Wicklow MD)

New pedestrian and cycle bridge to be provided at Wicklow Train Station, linking Station Road to the Port Access Road. Bus and vehicle set down to be provided along with cycle parking. The acquisition of lands on northern side of rail line has been completed. NTA approval has been granted for the commencement of Phase 5-Detail design and Procurement.

Wicklow Active Travel Pathfinder Project (Wicklow MD)

Provision of pedestrian and cycle improvements along the R750 and Station Road from Abbey Street carpark to Station Road Junction to improve linkage to Wicklow Train Station. The project scope has been revised. Design to focus on pedestrian and cycle improvements between the town centre and Train Station. Preliminary Design issued to NTA and comments received. Traffic modelling of the 3 junctions completed. Consultant contract only extends to end of Phase 3. Tender advertised for consultants to manage the project through Phase 4 -7. Gateway 3 report issued to NTA for approval.

Bray Bridge footbridges and tie- ins (re-draft tender) (Bray MD)

New footbridges and alterations to the road to make provision for cyclists. Tender documents have been prepared for the appointment of a new Consultant to progress the scheme from Phase 3 to Phase 7. Consultants Brief has been issued to the NTA for approval.

Baltinglass Bridge Active Travel Scheme (Baltinglass MD)

Provision of improved facilities for pedestrians and cyclists at Baltinglass Bridge. The tender period has concluded for the appointment of a Technical Consultant to progress the scheme through Phases 2 to 4. A total of 5 tender submissions were received. Tender Assessment is ongoing. A post tender clarification has been issued to one of the tenderers.

The Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant is a payment you can get if you are turning a vacant house or building into your permanent home or a rental property. The grant applies to qualifying vacant properties in cities, towns, villages and rural parts of the country.

A grant of up to €70,000.00 is available, if the refurbishment costs exceed the standard grant of up to €50,000.00; a topup grant amount of up to €20,000.00 is available.

To qualify for the grant, applicants must:

Have proof of ownership or evidence of active negotiations to buy the property (that is, confirmation of engagement from the estate agent or owner of the property) where you are seeking approval in principle for a grant.

- Live in the property as your principal private residence or make it available for rent.
- Have proof that the property has been vacant for at least 2 years and that it was built up to and including 2007.

Operational Fire Statistics February 2025

There were **80 incidents** attended during the month of February 2025. Due to laid down procedures to mobilise two stations to potentially serious incident types, individual Fire Stations were mobilised on a total of **100 occasions** including **6** mobilisations in other counties. On no occasion did an incident commander request additional resources over what was prescribed in the Pre-Determined Attendance.

Operational activity for the month of February 2025 **decreased by 30% (- 43 mobilisations) on the preceding month January 2025 (143 mobilisations)** which is normal for the month of February. Domestic house fires decreased (-14 mobilisations), RTCs reduced (-12 mobilisations) small malicious urban fires reduced (-13 mobilisations) while alarm activations increased by 8 to 23 or 23% of all activity in the month, or 40% of all activity in Bray.

Operational activity for the month of February 2025 increased by 5% (plus 5 mobilisations) on the equivalent month in 2024 (February 2024, 95 mobilisations). There was an increase in mobilisations to domestic house fires (+8), an increase in alarm activations (+11) but a decrease in small malicious urban fires (-8) and a decrease good intentioned false alarm (-11).

59 new residential houses and 12 Extensions were notified to LA for Commencement & 69 newly completed residential units with an additional 46 apartment units and 3 non-residential units were submitted, assessed and validated in February. In February 7 BCMS submissions were invalidated.

BER certificates for all newly completed units were requested & submitted to Building Control as per S.I. No. 243/2012 - European Union (Energy Performance of Buildings) Regulations 2012.

Building Control continued with site inspections in February to identify non-compliances with Building Regs onsite and 2 Section 11 Compliance Requests were issued.

Revised Information requests remained high in February for both Commencement Notices and Certificates of Compliance on Completion, 63% of Commencement Notice submissions & 57% of Certificate of Compliance on Completion submissions required revised information. Revised information requests are issued to nominated role holders of submissions when compliance with Building Regs has not been demonstrated.

Opt Out submissions are both extensions and single unit dwellings, generally from BCMS users who are unfamiliar with both BCMS and Building Regulations which leads to Building Control resources being directed to resolving both administration and technical issues with Opt-Out Submissions.

It has been observed by Building Control during CN Assessments that there has been an increase in the proposed use of non-traditional, uncertified products and systems. Additional resources have had to be used to assess both these new products/systems and associated alleged certification. These resources are being used for Market Surveillance, which is one of the key roles of Building Control.

Wicklow Building Control continues to perform rigorous assessment of submissions at commencement stage and onsite presence during construction. These methods remain the best way to promote compliance with Building Regs.

In February Building Control staff also attended & assisted the Dept of HLGH subgroup committee on revising existing Codes of Practice & Guidelines.


