Throughout the winter rainwater poured freely into the two front reception rooms, and one of the back bedrooms had lately been flooded out on several occasions. Soon after taking over the house he had the two front reception rooms distempered at his own expense, but both rooms were now in a condition of damp mouldiness and the carpets and furniture were in perpetual danger of being ruined. They had frequently to move everything out of these rooms and place basins here and there on the floor. In his Opinion Mr E. A. Swayne B.L. stated :-

(1). - In my opinion the Guardians could not legally borrow from their Treasurer or in the open market the sum requisite to make up £2,200. As I understand the position the Guardians with the approval of the Local Government Board have obtained power to raise a loan of £1,400 from the Board of Works and this loan was sanctioned under the Dispensary Houses (Ireland) Act, 1879, and the Acts incorporated therewith. This liberty to raise £1,400 must have been given on a definite scheme containing specifications and estimates. Under the rules and regulations made under the foregoing Act no alteration in "the plans, specifications or estimates" can be made without the approval of the Local Government Board. I accordingly do not think Querists can borrow in either of the ways suggested, at all events without the consent of the Local Government Board.

(2). - No.
