ITEM NO. 10

To receive a presentation: Wicklow Cheviot Sheep Owners Association.

Mr. P. Behan and Mr. P. Dunne, Wicklow Cheviot Sheep Owners Association gave a presentation outlining the following:

- 155,000 breeding ewes in Wicklow, fifth highest sheep numbers by county in Ireland.

- 225,000 lambs born in Wicklow every Spring.
- 736 flock owners in Wicklow.
- Worth €31m to the Wicklow economy.
- Sheep farming is the backbone of rural life in Wicklow, especially in upland areas.
- Due to the upland nature of the Wicklow landscape, sheep are crucial for maintaining and improving biodiversity.
- Sheep farming indirectly sustains employment in several areas of the rural economy.
- A lot of sheep worrying attacks go unreported.
- Controlling of dogs by owners.
- Should be a ban of non-working dogs on upland areas where livestock are present.
- Dog owners need to respect signage of 'no dogs allowed'.

A broad discussion followed in which the Elected Members raised queries to which Mr. Dunne responded. There were two proposals put forward by the Elected Members.

It was proposed by Cllr. P. Kennedy, seconded by Cllr. S. Langrell and agreed by all to write to the Department of Agriculture, Food & the Marine with the following motion:

'For an amendment to the National Sheep and Goat Census by the Department of Agriculture, Food & The Marine, to add a question to the end of the form that states:

Has your flock experienced a dog attack in the past 12 months?'

It was proposed by Cllr. J. Behan, seconded by Cllr. J. Snell and agreed by all to write to the Department of Agriculture, Food and Marine with the following motion: -

"Wicklow County Council call on the Minister for Agriculture, Food and Marine to run a national TV and social media campaign about sheep worrying and dog control.

Also to change the wording in legislation 'effective control' to 'complete control'."

Elected Members raised questions which were responded to by the Chief Executive and the relevant Director of Services.

Notices of motion

Notice of motion number 1

Notice of motion in the name of Cllr. L. Scott (proposer), seconded by Cllr. L. Fenelon Gaskin and supported by Cllr. S. Stokes, Cllr. M. Barry, Cllr. O. Finn and Cllr. T. Fortune.

In light of the amount of active open space, playgrounds, general community park and outdoor facilities in Co. Wicklow, we propose that the Chief Executive establishes a Parks Division as a priority. In addition the CE applies to the relevant Department for necessary funding and includes updates to this request as a standing item on the monthly CE report."

Response

Parks and Landscape Services Departments (P&LSD) oversee the development, management, and maintenance of the county's Parks & Open Spaces, including, Tree management, Biodiversity & Sustainability, Recreation & Play, Strategies & Policy, and delivery of Capital Project i.e. public open space.

A P&LSD within Wicklow County Council would be fundamental in ensuring a cohesive and multi-disciplinary approach to the development and management of quality Public Open Space, including active & passive recreation, sporting opportunities, play facilities, community facilities, and stakeholder engagement. P&LSDs would be instrumental in planning decisions, development control, and policy development, ensuring that public and communal open spaces are designed, delivered, and managed to meet the needs of the communities. P&LSD staff would provide a technical understanding of the required provision and maintenance of existing amenities within the County and promote and lead in the protection and enhancement of biodiversity and sustainability, networking through the various organisational departments to provide input in private and county led developments, including forward planning and development management.

The establishment of a Parks Department in WCC would enable the CERA Directorate provide support across the organisation in the development of policy, setting out the needs for the county that can be delivered in a plan led, information based, solutions driven manner. The technical knowledge provided by a Parks Department will ensure that the correct facilities are planned strategically, in consultation with the communities, elected members and stakeholders.

CERA have included the provision of a Parks and Landscape Service Department in the work force place but is wholly dependent on funding being made available. There is no central government funding for such posts.

Following a short discussion it was proposed by Cllr. L. Scott, seconded by Cllr. S. Stokes and agreed by all to write to the Department of Finance to request funding.

It was further proposed by Cllr, L. Scott, seconded by Cllr. T. Fortune and agreed by all to also write to Wicklow TDs and Senators highlighting the urgent need for funding.

Notice of motion number 2

Notice of motion in the name of Cllr. S. Bourke (proposer), seconded by Cllr. P. Stapleton.

'That Wicklow County Council explore an application for RRDF funding for Town First projects similar to Carrick-in-Suir, that prioritises undergrounding of ESB and other utility cabling, to enhance the visual urban landscape of Wicklow towns, and provide funding to eliminate exterior metal shuttering from retail premises on Main streets, as recommended on page 190 of the Architectural Heritage Protection document issued by the Department of Arts Heritage and the Gaeltacht. Arklow should be used as the initial candidate to pilot this proposal as it has been singled out for criticism by An Taisce.'

'That Wicklow County Council unify the public lighting infrastructure in public Realm areas, initially by removing redundant attachments, matching lighting fixtures, and paint all stands in a single uniform colour, (grey, black or a suitable alternative), to unify the street landscape. Arklow's Main Street, Ferrybank and Wexford Road, should be the initial focus, as Arklow has been singled out for criticism by An Taisce. Other towns and villages in county Wicklow could be incorporated in this scheme to re-organise lighting to match up older lighting fixtures. Climate sensitive lighting should be prioritised'.

Response

This Notice of Motion has been referred to both Planning and Economic SPCs as correspondence in January, for consideration for inclusion in their multi annual work programmes for 2026.

(ii) Arklow Town Team to explore options and funding streams available. Where a viable project emerges, it will be through the Town Centre First process and application for funding will be progressed through next various calls for application under the various schemes.

An assessment of public lighting across Wicklow is ongoing including a review of public realm lighting. This includes the heritage/decorative style lighting (approximately 700 units) commonly found in town centres. The proposal to bring a consistent approach to lighting in public realm areas has merit and will be included in the ongoing assessment work. The priority for staff and contractors working on public lighting in Wicklow remains the repair of faulty lighting in a timely manner. This ensures areas are provided with operational lighting in the first instance which then allows the area to be reviewed regarding upgrades or retrofitting. Arklow Main Street for example required the existing lighting faults to be repaired in order to assess the extent of follow up required to restore the heritage/decorative light vista.

By way of background;

Heritage lamps in public realm areas were due to be addressed under the PLEEP contract – this work like so much other work got ‘de-scoped’ when it became problematic. This is an issue we will need to work out with our PL maintenance contractor in due course.

Suspensions of Standing Orders

Cllr. A. Cronin, seconded by Cllr. G. O’Neill and supported by Cllrs. P. Glennon, P. Mahon, J. Mulhall and P. Stapleton, requested a suspension of standing orders to discuss the following motion:

‘To seek additional roads funding for emergency repairs as a result of storm Chandra. The estimated cost of road repairs for the Baltinglass MD is €5 million’.


A lengthy discussion took place in which the Elected Members voiced their concerns in relation to the condition of road throughout the county following storm Chandra.

Cllr. J. Behan, seconded by Cllr. P. Glennon proposed an amendment to the motion by the addition of *‘the cost of road repairs for the entire County Wicklow is estimated at €15.6 million. The Council demand the government respond immediately and provide the funding required for County Wicklow’.*


The motion proposed by Cllr. A. Cronin, seconded by Cllr. G. O’Neill supported by Cllrs. P. Glennon, P. Mahon, J. Mulhall, and P. Stapleton, amended by Cllr. J. Behan, seconded by Cllr. P. Glennon and agreed by all called on the Council;

‘To write to the Department of Transport, Office of the Taoiseach, Wicklow TD’s and Senators to seek additional roads funding for emergency repairs as a result of storm Chandra. The estimated cost of road repairs for the Baltinglass MD is €5 million, the cost of road repairs for the entire County Wicklow is estimated at €15.6 million. The Council demand the government respond immediately and provide the funding required for County Wicklow.’
