#### INTRODUCTION

Extract from IRELAND'S COURT HOUSES published by Irish Architectural Archive 2019, Burns O'Connor and O'Riordan, Editors describes the building as follows;

-This is a concise summary of the History of the suject building.

'A two storey over raised basement, five bay building on an island site in Market Square, facing Main Street, Baltinglass Courth House was originally erected in the mid to late 18th century.

Richard Johnson, architect, signed and estimate of £558 10s for repairs to the building in 1795. Further repairs and improvements were carried out by Wicklow Grand Jury in 1828 and again in 1830. The first edition OS Map shows a barracks behind the court house. The basement came to serve as bridewell, but this was after 1837, when Lewis's Topographical Dictionary reports that a separate bridewell was 'inconveniently situated' in the town. A house was erected to the north c.1850 and expanded to provide municipal offices towards the end of the 19th century. Foley and O'Sullivan, architects and engineers, reconstructed the building after it was damaged by fire in April 1920. The works were completed in 1926. Rendered, with cement block architraves to the square head windows, its most obvious external feature is a pair of opposite granite stairs leading to the entrance porch with its hoodmoulded openings and granite pediments. Internally, the double height courtroom contained a free standing dock, high level jury box, and niche behind the judges bench. Repaired and extended by Newenham Mulligan and Associates, 1999, the comlex accommodated court use and local library. The court element closed in 2013 following the amalgamation of Baltinglass District Court with Carlow.

#### Wicklow County Council Consultant's Brief

-This is a summary of the brief of Wicklow County Council for the project

In it's introduction to the brief for development, WCC describes the site, have relatively recently been refurbished for use as the town library explains the position under the Rural Regeneration and Development Fund in accordance with CWMF (Capital Works Management Framework), the library, heritage centre, and court house are a group of important buildings in the centre of Baltinglass, the project looks to reestablish the court building as a focal point and central part of the town and community. The architect will work to standard conditions of engagement in close cooperation with WCC. The uses proposed for the building include relocation of the adult library, the children's library will remain in the heritage centre and a new community co working facility will develop in the old library. The remaining rooms will be made into attractive spaces available for community activities, metting rooms, work spaces to support local businesses and enterprise. The key milestones for design development include FSC (Fire Safety Certificate) Part & Planning Procedure, preparation of Tender documents, issue to tender, tender appraisal, appointment of building contractor and supervision of the building works. A significant project planning requirement is the Heritage Centre and the existing library facilities will remain open to the public during the course of the works in the court house.

#### Architect's Understanding of the project

-This is a summary of the Architect's interpretation of the brief

The court house is located on an island site in the public space in the centre of the town. The attendant buildings and yard have relatively recently been refurbished for use as the town library and heritage centre. The project was initiated with a limited scope, based on a notified budget. The form of the building is a five bay, three storey (two over basement), the heritage centre is a two storey 1990's extension, with separate entrance through the central carriage door of the two storey house (on the north flank) with a lift and accommodation including the children's library and facilities shared with court use and built over former bridewell uses. The court building is reached by a pair of straight flights of stairs to a porch (addition to the original building) making a significant public address to the public space of Baltinglass however 'tight' access. The court room proper is double height in dimension and the 1990's planning is uneasy in scale (following removal of earlier court furniture) with staircase leading to second floor rooms, presumably the product of complex circulation involving unresolved shared facilities with the heritage centre and the necessary separation of Judiciary, public access, accused and prisoner. External impervious sand cement plaster (non-breathable) is not appropriate. There is substantial water ingress and condensation throughout both the court and heritage buildings. Compliance with building regulations, including sustainability and access are challenging. A preliminary architectural assessment is an 'unhappy' building which requires serious analysis, assessment and consultation in order to realize a good plan for works and uses of the building. Note the exhibit in the heritage centre is 'rich' in detail and information including local history of the building and the neighborhood of West Wicklow, if in a 'jaded' condition. A most striking feature is the vaulted ground floor accommodation which have survived in their terrifying original form, which in themselves are major feature of the Heritage Centre.

VISION including Heritage Impact, Library at Baltinglass

The idea, the spirit of the development is love of the town of Baltinglass and its principal public building in the river valley near the monuments to the North and West, love of every stone and detail of their construction and a desire to contribute to the well being of all of its citizens and welcome visitors.

The place of the library is at the centre of the life of Baltinglass, a place of learning and work for people of West Wicklow to build a vibrant local community, a place for meeting as well as a place of work and a place for economic inspiration and development of Baltinglass. The library is the catalyst for the development of the heritage centre, built up over many years, and now envisages public rooms for study, research and work.

We have the beginnings of an understanding of the form of the building and its development from our opening up contract, here recorded in photographs and notes.

It will be an open, modern, and forward looking building, inviting the citizens of Baltinglass and the neighbourhood to come in and enjoy the extraordinary opportunity offered by this development of the library service.

Most of the historic architecture has been destroyed (1922) and there is a small opportunity to preserve and present what survives, particularly the ground floor (which might join with Wicklow Goal in an outreach destination for visitors), as well as opportunity for development of the heritage centre as focal point for a short walk west through WCC property to the Cistercian remains, a National treasure on the bank of the river Slaney.

There is no case for restoration without evidence of what might have been, the proposition is to preserve and present every stone and detail of the antique and build a simple, plain, white plaster building with beautiful daylit lilbrary.
