In the S.E. part of Arklow Barony, Wicklow County. Bounded on the North by Redcross and Ennereilly; W. by Castlemacsdan and South by Arklow Parishes and E. by the Irish Sea.

Contains 6744 Acres 3 roods 1 per. of which 405 acres are not uncultivated. Formerly a rectory & vicarage in the Union of Arklow and diocese of Dublin. The Tithes were compounded for £217. Os. 9<sup>½</sup>s. per annum of which £200. Os. 2<sup>½</sup>d. is the property of the incumbent and £17. Os. 6<sup>¾</sup>d. belong to the Lessee of the Impropriator; now forms a benefice or union held by the Revd. Dr. Walsh, & consists of Kilbride, part of Ennereilly.

The places of Worship in the Parish are a Protest. Church and two R. C. Chapels. The Church, which is in the central part of the Parish is a neat new building in very good repair, there are sittings in it for about 800 persons, the usual congregation being about 600; one of the Chapels called the New Chapel is a good stone building in very good

repair and capable of holding about 500 persons - the other Chapel is in Barroneskey West Townland, See Described p. 41 (MS.). Barroneskey School is in the North of the Parish for description see p. 41. (MS.). There are no almshouses nor any funds for the relief of the poor.

The shape of the Parish is regular and compact inclining to a square form, the greatest length from the North to the South extremities diagonally across the Parish is about four and a half miles and from E. to W. four miles. The surface, except in the North extremity, is flat, being generally about 200 or 300 feet above the sea; a ridge of hills rises rather abruptly in the N.E. & N.W. to the height of 800 & 900 feet above the sea at Low Water; the appearance of the Parish in general is bare & unvaried except in the S.W. where the beautiful Demesne of Shelton Abbey gives this part a more pleasing appearance.

The houses throughout the Parish have in general a comfortable appearance, are chiefly stone and built in small clusters. The fuel used is coals, turf and dried wood.

There is no Town or Village in this parish, but, the Town of Arklow which is nearly adjoining the South side of the Par. is the chief market town and post Town.

The roads throughout the Parish are conveniently numerous and in good repair; the main direct, though not the Mail coach road from Arklow to Dublin, by which a stage caravan travels passes through the East side of the Parish, entering it at Arklow Bridge in the S.E. and bearing in a Northward direction for one mile where the road leading to Newbridge branches off to the N.W. The Dublin road still continues in a North direction for half a mile to the new R. C. Chapel, whence its direction is N.E. for nearly two miles, when it leaves the Parish.

There are several small streams running through the Parish, the principal of which is one that rises in the N.W. a little beyond the Parish Boundary at "Pucks Hole"; its direction through the Parish is S.E. for about two and a half miles to Tynock Bridge on the road from Dublin to Arklow, a little S.E. of which is Tynock Corn Mill on this stream; its direction from the Corn Mill is Eastward till it empties itself into the Sea; about half a mile from the source of this stream its bed is 250 feet above the Low Water of the sea. The Oyoca river meets the Parish in the S.W. and flows along the South side of the Pa. in a S.E. direction till it empties itself into the sea.

The houses having names are Rockvue, Johnstown, Ballymoney, Killinskyduff, Kilbride and Shelton Abbey, the seat of the Earl of Wicklow.

The only Antiquities is a Raheen in the North extremity of the Parish. There are three grave yards, one in Templemichael, one in Templerny & the other in Kilbride Townland.
