SPECIFICATION

OF

WORK TO BE DONE IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

for _____ years of _____ perches of Road and Footpath,
between _____
and _____

IMMEDIATE REPAIRS, GENERAL DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS.

1—Immediately after the ensuing Assizes the surface is to be cleaned, holes and ruts filled with good material, stagnant water drained off, dangerous holes and grips fenced, the road made safe and convenient for traffic within one month, and afterwards repaired as specified from time to time, or continuously, as may be necessary, and maintained constantly in good order during the contract, clean, hard, and even, at all seasons.

2—No notice of inspection will be given but the County Surveyor expects the road to be in good order and repair at any time he or his assistant may visit it.

3—The Grand Jury shall have the power of cancelling the contract at any Assizes should the County Surveyor report that the road has not been kept in a satisfactory manner.

4—The Contractor is to procure a copy of this Specification, and produce it when required by the County Surveyor or his assistant.

5—All the work herein specified is to be executed in a judicious, effective, and workmanlike manner in every particular necessary for the repair, constant maintenance in good order, and improvement of the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this Specification, and to the entire satisfaction of the County Surveyor.

6—In addition to the provisions of this Specification the Contractor is at once to carry into effect any instructions of the County Surveyor or his assistant.

WIDTH OF WORKING WAY.

7—The width of the working way of the road shall be equal to the present width; but in no case less than 13 feet, except where walls, fences or grips interfere. The width to be extended or reduced as the County Surveyor may direct. In towns or villages the metalled surface is to extend to the paved channels, footpaths, fences or buildings, as the case may be, and over all open spaces.

MARGINS AND SIDES.

8—The margins to be formed of sods and clay, at least two feet wide and four inches high over the watertables. These margins to be neatly kept and edged with spade and line (a plough on no account to be used) and the working way defined by parallel lines, straight or regularly curved, according to the course of the road. Contractor to remove any waste margins that may be pointed out.

Where the sides are ravelled or broken, they are to be made up with stones, sods and clay.

The sides are also to be kept clear of all bushes, brambles, weeds, rubbish, loose stones, turf, manure, &c.

The Contractor is to cut down and remove before seed time all weeds growing on the roadsides and fences.

DRAINAGE.

9—All water-tables, side cuts, pipe holes, outlets, side, back, and catch drains, water courses, &c., to be kept, at all times, clear of mud, grass, weeds, or other obstructions to the free discharge of the water, and new ones made where necessary.

FRENCH DRAINS.

10—Where springs or soft places occur in the road, French Drains shall be made to drain off the water to the nearest outfall.

GULLETS, ETC.

11—Gullets to be opened up, cleaned out and repaired when required, and the channels through all bridges and gullets, and for such distances as may be necessary above and below the same, are to be cleared and kept clear.

12—This drainage and the edging above described in No. 8 to be thoroughly done three times a year—before 1st February, 1st April, and 1st October, and at all other times as may be required.

WASTE STUFF.

13—All scrapings and other road stuff to be used for levelling hollows in the sides, filling grips, repairing fences, &c. Any surplus stuff not so required shall become the

property of the contractor, and be removed by him forthwith, as well as any accumulation of mud, &c., that may be on the roadsides at the commencement of the contract. Road stuff on no account to be thrown on the margins.

MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF SURFACE.

14—The roadway and water-tables shall be scraped, swept and cleaned, so as to be at all times free from mud, dust, grass and dirt, especially before spreading stones.

15—The surface of the working way is to have a rounding of one inch per yard of width; but on hills this rounding must be greater. Where the road has not at present this form it must be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and re-forming the surface.

16—The surface is to be made even by picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and inequalities.

All rocks appearing over the surface and stones of more than 2½ inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes at once carefully filled with fine metalling. All surface damages that may occur to be at once repaired by the Contractor.

APPLICATION OF MATERIALS.

17—Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be covered with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen the crust.

They are to be spread at short intervals alternately on each side of the centre line of the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 3 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road. In no case will drills or small patches be allowed.

The patches to be kept raked in and blinded when necessary.

Before spreading the materials the old surface to be picked and loosened to the depth of half an inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may unite with the old.

18—Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gulleys and the arch-stones of bridges well covered with metal.

LOOSE AND OVER-SIZED STONES.

19—The surface shall at all times be kept free from loose stones which must be kept picked off by the contractor; also any stones larger than the specified size.

TIME FOR SPREADING

20—One-third of the yearly supply of stones for the road to be spread before the 1st December; two-thirds before 1st February, and all before Spring Assizes in each year.

QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

21—The stones, which are to be quarry stones if obtainable, are to be the hardest and toughest procurable within three miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and be free from clay, sand, or other extraneous matter.

QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.

22—The contractor is to supply annually at least ^{cubic yards a sufficient} quantity of broken stones for the proper maintenance of the road. This quantity to be laid down in equal heaps, not less than 18 inches high, dressed for measurement, along the sides of the road, on carefully prepared level floors, before 1st October in each year of the contract. The heaps to be outside the whole of the metal.

No road metal to be deposited or broken on roadside until the whole of the metal previously measured has been spread, and until notice in writing has been served by the contractor on the assistant that such is the case.

EXTRA MATERIALS.

23—In addition to the annual quantity as above, such extra materials must be provided and spread as may be required to fulfil the conditions of the contract for constantly keeping the surface in good repair during the whole term of the contract.

FOOTPATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GRATINGS, ETC.

24—The footpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and maintained as follows:—
If curbed with stone, all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled or broken to be resodded. Grass on both sides of path to be neatly edged three times a year, and to be cleared away wherever it may grow on path along walls. Clean out and repair all existing outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year—in February and October—and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from clay, dirt, and stones over ¾-inch diameter.

Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of 1½ inch per yard towards the road.

25—All flagged or paved paths and channels to be repaired and kept in repair.

All gratings where broken, disturbed, or removed, to be repaired, re-set or renewed.

COUNTY WORKS.

26—Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the first half-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

INJURIES, OBSTRUCTIONS, ENCROACHMENTS, TREES, HEDGES, ETC.

27—All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment or trespass. The contractor shall not allow the sides to be dug up or interfered with in any way. The contractor shall require the owners, by proper legal means, to prune and lop all injurious or obstructive hedges and trees, and shall proceed summarily against all offenders in accordance with the provisions of the Acts relative to such offences, especially 14 & 15 Vic., cap 92, secs 9 & 10, and 19 & 20 Vic., cap 63, sec 18.

SURPLUS MATERIALS.

28—Any broken stones or gravel found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the county.

29—The Contractor will be liable to a deduction of 6s for each cubic yard of road metal found deficient from above quantity at the October measurement in each year. The Contractor will also be liable to a deduction from, or a total forfeiture of, as the case may require, the sum payable at any Assizes under the contract, should he fail to comply with the several provisions of this specification; such deductions will be represented to the credit of the Barony.

PUBLIC ANALYSTS' REPORT.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report, for your information, that I have made the following analyses during the half-year ended on the 30th June, 1890:—
The following articles were analysed for Sergeants of the Royal Irish Constabulary, acting as Inspectors of Food:—

Sergeant Conroy, Roundwood, two specimens of whiskey; Sergeant Hughes, Bray, a sample of butter; Sergeant Moore, Baldinglass, three specimens of whiskey; Sergeant Morrissey, Blessington, two samples of whiskey. Of these articles, a sample of whiskey sent by Sergeant Moore was adulterated, as was also one sent by Sergeant Morrissey.

A specimen of water was analysed for the Guardians of Rathdrum Union; it was not quite up to the standard of a pure water.

The County Coroner, Mr. M. H. Jones, sent to me for analysis two lozenges, which it was supposed might have caused the death of a child to whom a similar one had been administered as a worm lozenge. It was thought that some such substance as strychnine might have been by accident put into the lozenges. I found, however, that they contained the alkaloid termed santonine, but only in the proportion of a medicinal dose.

The viscera of a fox, sent by Mr. A. G. Owen, J.P., Blessington, was found to contain strychnine.

The total number of analyses made—namely, 12—fell short by 14 of the number performed in the previous half-year.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW,

Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1890.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The schedule of applications for presentments at these Assizes contains a large number of items owing to the unusual number of road maintenance contracts which happen to expire now.

The number is 119, which represents a total length of 311 miles of road.

In seven of the baronies all the roads but one (number 18 in South Ballinacor) were duly contracted for at adjourned sessions; but in the barony of Arklow 8 roads, some of which are very important, were not tendered for, so that they remain for your disposal now.

The number of special works is 27. I need only call particular attention to the following, as any desired information concerning the others can be given as they come before you.

Arklow, No 25.—This is an application for £100, half of which is proposed to be given in aid by the Arklow Town Commissioners, to flag a further portion of the footpath in the Main-street of Arklow. It is a most desirable work, but was not tendered for at adjourned sessions.

North Ballinacor, No. 13.—To reconstruct Beresford bridge on the main road from Bray to Roundwood, £70. This is a most necessary work as the bridge may fail at any moment. I applied for a larger sum at sessions; but it was refused. I have prepared a plan and specification to carry out the work as economically as possible consistent with stability, and hope a tender may now be submitted to you for it.

Newcastle, No. 13.—To rebuild in part and repair in part a retaining and parapet wall, on the road from Ashford to Roundwood, on the townland of Tomcoyle Lower, £147 10s. This is a necessary work as the old wall has subsided in places and is greatly dilapidated.

Rathdown, No. 18.—To curb a portion of the footpath of the principal road in Greystones, £66. It was disallowed by the Grand Jury at last Assizes and now comes before you again as a new application.

Upper Talbotstown, No. 21.—To build a bridge on the road from Rathdangan to Rathgorragh over the stream near the bounds of Cranareen and Rathgorragh Lower, £120. This was referred to in my report to the last Grand Jury and now comes before you for final decision. As the road is unimportant I think the matter should be carefully considered.

Since last Assizes it became necessary to take proceedings against two of your contractors and their sureties for breach of contract. In one

case Patrick Bowen, contractor for No. 28, North Ballinacor, did the necessary work, so that the proceedings were withdrawn on his paying the costs. In the other case, that of John Connor, contractor for Nos. 13 and 14 Newcastle, decrees were given for amounts of bonds and costs, which will be levied if the work be not done in a specified time.

I have attended to the instructions of the last Grand Jury concerning Newtown-Mount-Kennedy Petty Sessions Court-House and have arranged for a consulting room for the justices, which I hope will be satisfactory.

It is with great regret I have to report the death, on the 4th April last, of Mr Francis Irwin, late assistant for the baronies of Upper and Lower Talbotstown. Mr. Irwin was appointed at Summer Assizes, 1886, and, during his short career in this county, ably assisted me in greatly improving the county roads in his district. Mr Irwin was one of the best assistants I ever had—trustworthy, clever, painstaking, energetic, and thoroughly acquainted with his work, liked and esteemed by everyone.

In his place I have appointed Mr. J. J. O. Ramsay, formerly assistant for the baronies of Arklow and North Ballinacor.

DUBLIN AND BLESSINGTON STEAM TRAMWAY.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW,

Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1890.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

In compliance with the 35th clause of the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway Order, 1887, I inspected the line, sidings and other works, and the engines, rolling stock and plant of this undertaking on the 5th and 8th inst., and found as follows :—

The only additional work done during the past year in this county is the repairing of the walls enclosing the depot in Blessington and the erection of two iron gates and substantial stone piers, one at each end of depot where the sidings enter it from the street. This depot now seems complete and has a creditable appearance.

I was obliged to take over the stone depots from the Company, although the walls and fences round them are very bad, as they were urgently needed for the storage of broken stones. Even since they were taken over they have had to be repaired by the road contractors. I noticed that 3 or 4 of the timber guard rails at the stone depot nearest to Blessington have been removed. These should be at once replaced by the Company.

Two miles of the line had a very discreditable appearance, being overgrown with grass and weeds. Three men were, however, at work cleaning it, otherwise the permanent way of line and sidings is in pretty fair order; but fresh ballast is required, and the sleepers require raising and packing up at several points.

No addition has been made to the rolling stock during the last year. The engines in use do not give satisfaction. They seem much too complicated, are too light, and have not sufficient haulage power. The gradients and curves on the line are severe and specially designed engines should have been provided. Some trouble has been caused by leaking tubes, defective governors, wearing of tyres, &c; but the engines seem carefully attended to and kept in fair repair. It would be very desirable if arrangements could be made for the supply of additional wagons and two heavy goods' engines. The carriages are very good and have given but little trouble beyond some unequal wearing of the tyres.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE GRAND JURY ON THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT—EXISTING CONTRACTS—AND DISCHARGED AND UNDISCHARGED QUERIES—AND SUB-SHERIFF'S ACCOUNT.

Committee—Gordon E. Tombe, Esq.; Colonel Kemmis, and Captain Gun Cuninghame.

1.—With regard to the County Surveyor's report, par. 2, the County Surveyor states his intention in future to give the relative prices of the old and new contracts. As to item, North Ballinacor, No. 13, the reconstruction of Beresford bridge, this work being absolutely necessary, the committee recommend that the sum of £70, passed by the last Road Sessions, be allowed to the County Surveyor to expend to the best advantage. The committee are sure that the Grand Jury will join with the County Surveyor in his expression of regret of the death of Mr. Francis Irwin, late assistant for baronies of Upper and Lower Talbotstown, and endorse the remarks that he made with respect to him.

The committee recommend, with regard to the application of John Dowse to be relieved from the contract undertaken by his late father for the road at Ballyellis to Condell's brook, that it be granted as a very special case, it being made in consequence of the contractor's sudden death, but the present contract should be upheld until next Assizes.
